PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of February, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Liverpool, Saint Silas, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Liverpool, Saint Columba, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Liverpool, Saint Simon, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Liverpool, Saint Silas; Liverpool, Saint Columba; and Liverpool, Saint Simon; duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Liverpool and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Liverpool signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas all of the said three Benefices are now full, the Reverend William Brock being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, the Reverend Gibson Downing being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Columba, and the Reverend William Horsman Royden being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Simon:

“And whereas there is no Parsonage House belonging to any of the said three Benefices of Liverpool, Saint Silas; Liverpool, Saint Columba; and Liverpool, Saint Simon:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said William Brock, Gibson Downing and William Horsman Royden (testified by their signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said three Benefices or any two of the said three Benefices shall be vacant the union of the Benefices named in the first column of Section A of the Schedule hereto shall forthwith take effect; and if upon the day aforesaid the said Benefice of Liverpool,

Saint Simon or the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Columba, only shall be vacant, or if upon the day aforesaid all the said three Benefices shall be full and the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Simon, or the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Columba, shall be the Benefice first falling vacant after that day then upon the day aforesaid or upon the day when the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Simon, or the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Columba so falls vacant as the case may be the union of the Benefices named in the first column of Section B of the said Schedule shall take effect and thereafter the union of the Benefices named in the first column of Section D of the said Schedule shall take effect upon the next following vacation of either of such Benefices; and if upon the day aforesaid the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, only shall be vacant or if upon that day all the said three Benefices shall be full and the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, shall be the Benefice first falling vacant after that day, then upon the day aforesaid or upon the day when the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, so falls vacant as the case may be the union of the Benefices named in the first column of Section C of the said Schedule shall take effect and thereafter the union of the Benefices named in the first column of Section E of the said Schedule shall take effect upon the next following vacation of either of such Benefices.

" 2. That if after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and before either the union referred to in Section B or the union referred to in Section E of the said Schedule shall have taken effect the said Gibson Downing shall with the consent of the said Bishop of Liverpool retire from the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Columba, in order that either of such unions may take immediate effect, then he shall be entitled to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Simon with Saint Columba or the United Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, as the case may be and by way of compensation, an annual sum of £250 which annual sum shall commence as from the day upon which the union in either case shall take effect and shall be payable by equal quarterly payments in every year, the first quarterly payment becoming due at the end of three calendar months next after the day upon which the union in either case shall take effect and the said annual sum shall be payable to the said Gibson Downing during the remainder of his life subject, however, to the same conditions as to suspension, reduction and forfeiture, as a pension assigned to a retiring Incumbent under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and 1887, and the provisions of those Acts as to recovery in case of non-payment and as to such conditions as aforesaid shall apply to the said Annual sum and to the said Gibson Downing as if the said Annual sum were a pension awarded under the said Resignation Acts and the said Gibson Downing had resigned the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Columba, under those Acts.

" 3. That upon the taking effect of any of the unions referred to in Clause 1 of this

Scheme the Benefices united in each case shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style or name mentioned in the second column of the Section of the said Schedule referring to the union in question and the Parishes of such Benefices in every case shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

" 4. That in each case the Church named in the third column of each Section of the said Schedule shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice referred to in that Section of the said Schedule and that the Table of Fees for the Parish of such Church shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 5. That upon the taking effect of any of the unions referred to in Sections A, B or E of the said Schedule the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials, and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Columba, Liverpool, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the said Church of Saint Columba, Liverpool, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 6. That upon the taking effect of any of the unions referred to in Sections A, D or E, of the said Schedule the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Simon, Liverpool, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 7. That at any time and from time to time after either of the unions referred to in Sections B and C of the said Schedule has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £120 in any one year.

" 8. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £300 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of sub-section (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and in addition the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of any lay worker or workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of

£140 in any one year. Provided that for the period (if any) during which the pension referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall be payable, the maximum amounts to be provided out of the revenues of the United Benefice for the said Curate and lay worker or workers respectively shall be £130 per annum for the Curate and £80 per annum for such lay worker or workers.

"9. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after any of the unions referred to in Sections A, B or E, of the said Schedule has taken effect the Church of Saint Columba, Liverpool, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the deduction of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall constitute and form part of the Fund established under the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Columba, Liverpool, or such of them as the Bishop of Liverpool shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Liverpool for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Liverpool which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated, except the font, communion table and sacramental plate,

may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Columba, Liverpool, as aforesaid.

"10. That after any of the unions referred to in Sections A, D or E, of the said Schedule has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Columba, shall have the first turn, the Patron of the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, shall have the second turn and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Simon, shall have the third turn, and as between the alternate Patrons of the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Simon, the right of presentation or nomination when it arises as herein recommended and proposed shall be exercised in the same order as that in which they are now entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Simon.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the site of the Church of Saint Columba, Liverpool, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measure are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by such Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the Church of Saint Columba, Liverpool, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Liverpool has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of March, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and

now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Rushock and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Elmbridge, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Worcester:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Rushock and Elmbridge duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Worcester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Elmbridge is now full the Reverend Thomas Edward Pritchett being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Rushock is at present vacant:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Ernest, Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the said Benefice of Rushock and the said Benefice of Elmbridge shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Elmbridge with Rushock’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Droitwich but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Elmbridge only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Rushock and the then Incumbent of Elmbridge shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Rushock only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Elmbridge and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Elmbridge if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Rushock shall have been instituted to Rushock subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the

Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Rushock before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Rushock following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Elmbridge and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Elmbridge shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Elmbridge shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately and if under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rushock shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then the Patrons of the said Benefice of Elmbridge shall have the first turn of presentation to the United Benefice but otherwise the Patron of the said Benefice of Rushock shall have the first turn of presentation to the United Benefice.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Worcester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Worcester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wickenby with the Benefice of Friesthorpe (now part of the United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford) and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Snelland with the Benefice of Snarford (now part of the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford), all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions of (1) the said Benefices of Wickenby and Friesthorpe and (2) the said Benefices of Snelland and Snarford duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the unions (1) of the said Benefices of Wickenby and Friesthorpe and (2) of the said Benefices of Snelland and Snarford and the terms for effecting such unions, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Wickenby and Snelland are now full, the Reverend Charles Swainston Nevile being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wickenby and the Reverend Arthur Samuel Wright being

the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Snelland and the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe and Snarford is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is a pension of £75 charged upon the revenues of the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford in favour of the Reverend John Allen Scott a former Incumbent of the same United Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Wickenby and the said Benefice of Friesthorpe shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wickenby with Friesthorpe' but the Parishes of such Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Snelland and the said Benefice of Snarford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford' but the Parishes of such Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That with the consents of the said Charles Swainston Nevile and the said Arthur Samuel Wright (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall forthwith take effect and the said Charles Swainston Nevile if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wickenby shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wickenby with Friesthorpe and the said Arthur Samuel Wright if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Snelland shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wickenby shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wickenby with Friesthorpe, (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Snelland shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that one moiety of the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and the other moiety thereof shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in equal shares for the benefit of the respective United Benefices of Wickenby with Friesthorpe and Snelland with Snarford.

"5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the respective United Benefices of Wickenby with Friesthorpe and Snelland with Snarford from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Wickenby with Friesthorpe after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Wickenby shall have the first and the second turns and the Patron of the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford shall have the third turn and (b) the right of presentation to the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford shall be exercised alternately, the Patron of the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Snelland having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect a portion of the endowments and property now belonging to the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford, namely all those Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £200 arising within the Parish of Snarford and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford together with all capital sums of money, stocks, securities and other property being or representing the produce of any sale, redemption or other conversion of, any or all of such Tithe Rent Charges together with a sum of £1,193 3s. 8d. Two and a half per cent. Consolidated Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford, and all other the endowments and property now belonging to the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Wickenby with Friesthorpe.

"7. That with the consent of the said John Allen Scott (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the union taking effect the liability for the payment of the pension of £75 now charged upon the revenues of the said United Benefice of Friesthorpe with Snarford to the said John Allen Scott as aforesaid shall be apportioned between the United Benefice of Wickenby with Friesthorpe and the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford and the revenues of the United Benefice of Wickenby with Friesthorpe shall be charged with the liability for the payment of a portion namely £30 per annum of such pension and the revenues of the United Benefice of Snelland with Snarford shall be charged with the liability for the payment of the remainder namely £45 per annum of the same pension.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said

Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lincoln has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Official Gazette of Northern Rhodesia.
