

Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924," His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to make provision for the constitution of the Legislative Council of Northern Rhodesia, and was further pleased to reserve to Himself, His Heirs and Successors power, with the advice of His or Their Privy Council, from time to time to revoke, add to, alter or amend the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provision than in the said recited Order in Council is contained with regard to the composition of the said Legislative Council:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1929."

2. Article 3 of the Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, is, as from the coming into operation of this Order, hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and in place thereof the following Article shall be substituted and take effect:—

"3. The Council shall consist of the Governor as President, five *ex officio* Members, Nominated Official Members not exceeding four in number, and seven Elected Unofficial Members."

3. Article 7 of the said Northern Rhodesia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, and all references to Nominated Unofficial Members contained in any other provisions of the said Order are, from the date of the coming into operation of this Order, hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Official Gazette of Northern Rhodesia.

5. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council may from time to time revoke, add to, alter or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Maurice Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st June, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th June, 1929, to Saturday, the 29th June, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
