PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of May, 1929, (C.W. 4810/29), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1925, to approve regulations for the grant of pensions and allowances to the widows, children and other dependent relatives of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces:

“And whereas under the aforesaid regulations pensions and children's allowances may

be awarded to the widows of pensioners from the Royal Navy and Royal Marines who were granted temporary acting Warrant rank during the Great War, provided, *inter alia*, that their husbands had twelve months' service in such rank:

“And whereas certain ratings of the Royal Navy and non-commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Marines, who were serving on long service engagements, and certain pensioners, were promoted during the Great War either direct or after less than twelve months' service as Warrant Officer, to Temporary Commissions in the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, or attained Warrant or higher rank in the Naval Forces of Your Majesty's Dominion and Colonial Governments, during that period, but no provision exists for the award of pensions to their widows and allowances to their children:

“And whereas we consider that the widows and children of such Officers should be eligible, at our discretion, for pensions and allowances under similar conditions to the widows and children of Temporary Acting Warrant Officers promoted during the Great War:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the proposals contained in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

## SCHEDULE.

" 1. Officers who were promoted during the Great War to temporary commissions under the Admiralty after service in warrant rank, or after service as Seamen or Marines serving on long service engagements or after service as Pensioners called up.

" The widows of these Officers to be eligible for ordinary pensions of £35 a year and children's allowances of £12 a year, provided that the Officers had twelve months' service in warrant or higher rank, including acting or temporary time.

" 2. Pensioner ratings who attained warrant or higher rank in Dominion or Colonial Navies during the Great War.

" The widow of such an Officer to be eligible for an ordinary pension of £35 a year and children's allowances of £12 a year, provided that:—

(a) the Officer had served at least twelve months in warrant or higher rank in the Royal Navy or in a Dominion or Colonial Navy, including acting or temporary time, service for this purpose being reckoned to the 31st March, 1919, only, and

(b) pension contribution as for a Warrant Officer has been paid in respect of any period of reckonable service in a Dominion or Colonial Navy.

" 3. A pension or allowance under these regulations shall not be claimed as a right. All awards shall be at the discretion of the Admiralty and subject to the general rules laid down in the Order in Council of the 25th June, 1925. Any pension or allowance granted under these regulations may be withheld, reduced, discontinued or restored, in whole or in part, at the discretion of the Admiralty in the same manner as if it had been a pension granted under Order in Council of the 25th June, 1925."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of May, 1929, (N. 1545/29), in the words following, viz. :—

" Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein

shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council of the 3rd day of November, 1927, to sanction revised rates of substantive pay for Naval ratings, including the Writer and Supply branches, entering or re-entering Your Majesty's Navy subsequently to the 4th day of October, 1925:

" And whereas we deem it desirable to establish ratings to be known as Writer Probationer and Supply Probationer and also to provide additional progressive pay for certain Writer and Supply ratings:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the institution of the ratings of Writer Probationer and Supply Probationer with the relative rank of Ordinary Seaman, and further to sanction as from the 10th day of May, 1929, the substitution of the rates of pay for the Writer and Supply branches shown in the accompanying Schedule for those contained in Schedule I of Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 3rd November, 1927, power being reserved to us to vary the rates of pay within the scales laid down or to associate payment with such conditions as we may deem necessary.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, 7 E. 7 c. 29; 4-5 G. 5. c. 18; 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, and 18-9 G. 5. c. 3, it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention, Treaty Series No. 16 (1928), comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Hungary has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Hungary the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Hungary or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th May, 1909, S.R. & O. 1909 (No. 585), p. 614, His late Majesty King Edward VII was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Act,

1907, 7 E. 7. c. 29, should apply to Austria-Hungary:

And whereas by the Hague Industrial Property Convention Order, 1928, S.R. & O. 1928 (No. 637), the said Order of the 17th May, 1909, was revoked, in so far as it related to Austria, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order of the 17th May, 1909, should be entirely revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Hungary confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Hungary or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Hungary.

3. The Order in Council dated the 17th May, 1909, relating to Austria-Hungary, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Hungary) Order, 1929.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1904 (4 Edw. 7. c. 28), it is provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to specify new fees to be paid in respect of the Verification and Stamping of Weights, Measures and Weighing and Measuring instruments in substitution for the fees specified in the First Schedule of the Weights and Measures Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 21):

And whereas it is provided by subsection 2 of Section 3 of the Weights and Measures (Amendment) Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 8), that the aforesaid power of His Majesty shall include and be deemed always to have included the power of specifying fees to be paid whether or not the weighing or measuring apparatus is found correct or is stamped:

And whereas His Majesty by Order in Council dated the 7th day of May, 1929 (S.R. & O. 1929, No. 396) directed that the fees specified in the Schedule to that Order should be taken upon the verification and stamping of measuring instruments used in trade for the measurement of liquid fuel or lubricating oil for sale in individual quantities not exceeding twenty gallons:

And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be

expedient to specify new fees to be paid upon the verification and stamping of such measuring instruments:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Measuring Instruments (Liquid Fuel and Lubricating Oil) Verification and Stamping Fees Amendment Order, 1929, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

2. The Order in Council dated 7th May, 1929 (S.R. & O. No. 396) is hereby revoked.

3. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of measuring instruments used in trade for the measurement of liquid fuel and lubricating oil for sale in individual quantities not exceeding twenty gallons.

4. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall likewise be paid in respect of any such instrument which on verification is found to be incorrect or defective.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of February, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ellenhall and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ronton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ellenhall and Ronton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lichfield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lichfield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ellenhall and Ronton are now full the Reverend Andrew John Tilson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ellenhall and the Reverend Charles Mercer Stickings being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ronton:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Ellenhall and Ronton now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:



" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Ellenhall and the said Benefice of Ronton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Ellenhall with Ronton ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Ronton only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ellenhall and the then Incumbent of Ronton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Ellenhall only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ronton and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ronton if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Ellenhall shall have been instituted to Ellenhall subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Ellenhall before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Ellenhall following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Ronton and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ronton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ellenhall shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time

prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lichfield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of April, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Sewerby with Grindale and Ergham in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sewerby with Grindale and Ergham is vested in Yarburgh Lloyd Greame, of Sewerby House, Bridlington, in the said County of York, Esquire, as tenant for life free from incumbrances, and the said Yarburgh Lloyd Greame is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Yarburgh Lloyd Greame is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sewerby with Grindale and Ergham should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of York for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, now Archbishop of York, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said William, Archbishop of York, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Sewerby with Grindale and Ergham which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Sewerby with Grindale and Ergham:

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Yarburgh Lloyd Greame, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly

gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sewerby with Grindale and Ergham shall be transferred to the said William, Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William, Archbishop of York, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of May, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Norfolk now vested in us:

"Whereas the property particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and to reside within the Parish of West Knoyle unless the Bishop shall at any time by writing otherwise direct and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £275 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" And whereas the said Benefice of Cold Salperton is now full the Reverend Edmund Alexander Thomas Lowndes being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Hawling is at present vacant:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Hawling and the said Benefice of Cold Salperton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Hawling with Cold Salperton' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Northleach but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Cold Salperton only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Hawling and the then Incumbent of Cold Salperton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Hawling only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Cold Salperton and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance



of the said Benefice of Cold Salperton if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Hawling shall have been instituted to Hawling subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Hawling before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Hawling following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Cold Salperton and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cold Salperton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hawling shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Cold Salperton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hawling having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is hereby pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

"I, John Reginald, by Divine Permission Bishop of Rochester, do in pursuance of the 26th section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby represent to your Grace.

"There is in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Rochester the Vicarage of Frindsbury the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Parish of Upnor and contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one a population of Three thousand seven hundred and eighty and the net annual value thereof is Five hundred and thirty-four pounds.

"In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Hoo St. Werburgh the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the said Parish of Upnor and contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one a population of Two thousand and seventy-nine and the net annual value thereof is Four hundred and seventy-five pounds.

"In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of St. Philip and St. James Upnor the Parish whereof contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one a population of Six hundred and twelve and the net annual value thereof is Three hundred and forty-nine pounds.

"The North Eastern corner of the said Parish of Frindsbury and also a portion of the said Parish surrounding Tower Hill lie at a distance from the Parish Church of Frindsbury and adjacent to the said Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor.

"The Western part of the Parish of Hoo St. Werburgh lies at a distance from the Parish Church of Hoo St. Werburgh and adjacent to the said Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor.

"It appears to me that the following alterations in the boundaries of the said respective Parishes may be made with advantage to the interests of religion videlicet (a) the North

East corner of the said Parish of Frindsbury and also the portion of the Parish surrounding Tower Hill be united to the Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor and (b) the Western portion of the said Parish of Hoo St. Werburgh be united to the said Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor.

"The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and of the Blessed Virgin Mary Rochester are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hoo St. Werburgh and I the said Bishop of Rochester in right of my said Bishopric am Patron of the said Benefices of Frindsbury and St. Philip and St. James Upnor.

"The Reverend Henry Frampton Shepherd is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Frindsbury.

"The Reverend Leonard John Walters is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoo St. Werburgh.

"The Reverend John Kingdon is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. Philip and St. James Upnor.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Act I the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the said Districts of the said Parish of Frindsbury and also the said District of the Parish of Hoo St. Werburgh proposed to be annexed to the said Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe Lands Tithes dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said respective Parishes and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents thereto to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"THE SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Representation.

"1. It is proposed to separate the following district from the Parish of Frindsbury in the County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor.

"Such district shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Frindsbury which lies to the East of an imaginary line commencing at a point in the South Eastern boundary of the said Parish and the North Western boundary of the said Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor in the centre of (the road known as) Four Elms Hill where the Upnor—Chattenden Naval Railway crosses Four Elms Hill aforesaid and proceeds in a Northerly direction along the centre of the said Railway until it reaches the South Eastern corner of

Great Chattenden Wood whence it still continues in a North Easterly direction along the said Railway until the Eastern boundary of Great Chattenden Wood aforesaid is reached along which boundary it proceeds until it reaches the Northern boundary of the said Parish of Frindsbury.

"Such district is coloured pink on the plan annexed hereto and thereon indicated by the letter 'A.'

"2. It is also proposed to separate the following district from the said Parish of Frindsbury and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of St. Philip and St. James of Upnor aforesaid.

"Such district shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Frindsbury which lies to the East or North East of an imaginary line commencing at a point in the Eastern boundary of the said Parish in the centre of a ditch close to the boundary stone marked W.D. No. 34 and proceeds in a Westerly and Southerly direction along the centre of the ditch forming the Northern and Western boundaries of field No. 277 on the Ordnance Survey Map for the said Parish (1909 Edition) until it reaches the slush at the South West corner of the said field whence the said imaginary line proceeds in a South Easterly direction along the centre of Whitewall Creek until it reaches the Southern boundary of the said Parish in the centre of the River Medway. Such district is coloured Green on the plan annexed hereto and thereon indicated by the letter 'B.'

"3. It is also proposed to separate the following district from the Parish of Hoo St. Werburgh in the County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor aforesaid.

"Such district shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Hoo St. Werburgh which lies to the West of an imaginary line commencing at the boundary post erected at the South Western corner of the enclosure numbered 32 on the Ordnance Survey Map for the said Parish (1909 Edition) and proceeds in a Southerly direction in a direct line to the centre of the footpath leading from Four Elms Hill aforesaid to Lower Upnor and continuing in the same direction along the centre of the said footpath and in a Southerly and then Westerly direction along the centre of the lane in continuation thereof until it reaches the Western boundary of the said Parish of Hoo St. Werburgh.

"Such district is coloured brown on the plan annexed hereto and thereon indicated by the letter 'C.'

"4. The Inhabitants of the said districts shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the respective Churches of the said Parishes of Frindsbury and Hoo St. Werburgh (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within either of the said Churches) but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate (Abolition) Act, 1868, to the repair of such last mentioned Church.

" 5. The Incumbent of the Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor shall have sole and exclusive cure of Souls within the above mentioned district so united to the said Parish of St. Philip and St. James Upnor.

" 6. No alteration shall be made in the Patronage or Endowment of the said Benefices.

" CONSENTS.

" We, John Reginald, by Divine Permission Bishop of Rochester and in right of my said Bishopric the Patron or Person entitled to collate to the Benefices of Frindsbury and St. Philip and St. James Upnor respectively both in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Rochester in case the same were now vacant The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary of Rochester being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Hoo St. Werburgh in the said County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester in case the same were now vacant the Reverend Henry Frampton Shepherd the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Frindsbury the Reverend John Kingdon the Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. Philip and St. James Upnor and the Reverend Leonard John Walters the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoo St. Werburgh do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter therein contained.

" In testimony whereof we the said Dean and Chapter of Rochester have hereto affixed our corporate seal and we the other Consenting Parties have hereto set our hands this twenty-third day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

*Contraction of Southampton Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.*
