THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF HARROW SCHOOL having, on the 17th day of June, 1929, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending Statute IV. of the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Harrow School on the 17th day of June, 1929.

"WHEREAS Statutes for the Government of Harrow School were made by the Governing Body of the said School under the Public Schools Act, 1868, and approved and sealed by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the said Act on the 24th day of February, 1874.

"And whereas the said Governing Body in exercise of the powers for this purpose conferred upon them by Section 11 of the said

Act have resolved to alter Statute 4 of the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing.

"Be it enacted as follows:—

1. The fees payable by each boy at the Lower School of John Lyon may exceed £15 per annum but shall not exceed £25 per annum.

2. In all other respects Statute 4 of the above mentioned Statutes shall remain in force.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 28th June, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st July, 1929, to Saturday, the 6th July, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than

the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday, 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 15 and 18. If an examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

(a) That they are unmarried or widows.

(b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
