

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

SECTION 7.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Regulations from time to time made by him thereunder, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by the said Regulations upon the occasion of the Fete to be held at Dr. Barnardo's Home, Barking-side, on Saturday, the 29th day of June, 1929, so that nothing in the said Regulations shall prevent any person who is maintaining at the date of this notice a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon the approved route numbered 26C from making on that day after 11 a.m. in any of the streets or parts thereof between Cranbrook Park and Barking-side declared to be "Restricted Streets" by any Order made by the Minister of Transport under the aforesaid Section of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and forming part of the approved route numbered 26, six journeys per hour in each direction with his omnibuses plying for hire in excess of the number of journeys which he may make in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulations; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 21ST JUNE, 1929.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Animals for
Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2.—(1) The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign

Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Article 4 of the Order of the Minister (No. 4735), dated the twenty-second day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, defining the said premises as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of ten llamas shall not be deemed to prevent the movement into the said premises of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulations applicable to the Animals on
Landing.*

4.—(1) The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than to a public zoological collection or to a port in Great Britain for export, and then only if the animals are accompanied by the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 3 (1) (*Fifth*) of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896.

Twenty llamas, the property of Mr. G. B. Chapman, brought from Buenos Aires and to be landed in the Port of London (Victoria Dock) from the steamship "Napier Star" on or before the twelfth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Premises at 5, Sage Street, Cable Street, E., in the administrative county of London, and in the occupation of Mr. G. B. Chapman.
