The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 18th day of June, 1929, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, JUNE 18, 1929.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend further § 1 of Titulus I of Titulus IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford so as to provide that the age-limit imposed upon holders of Professorships by clause 2 of that sub-section shall not apply to the holder of the George Eastman Visiting Professorship, and also to provide that the said Professorship shall not be one of those required by Statute to be allocated to a College: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

1. In the Schedule appended to the new clause 4 which was inserted in § 1 of Titulus IV by Congregation on 19 February

1929, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, after the words "Grinfield Lecturership on the Septuagint" shall be inserted the words "George Eastman Visiting Professorship."

2. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 H, at the end of the new sub-section 14 concerning the George Eastman Visiting Professor, which was approved by Congregation on the eighteenth day of June 1929, the following new clause shall be added:

"The provisions of Statt. Tit IV Sect. 111 shall not apply to the George Eastman Visiting Professorship."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Christ Church, in the University of Oxford, on the 25th day of June, 1929, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

CHRIST CHURCH, OXFORD.

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Christ Church in the University of Oxford made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

STATUTE XVII, *Clause 1 (ii) Ordinary Students. After paragraph (d) add a new paragraph:—*

(e) The Treasurer, the Steward and the Librarian.

STATUTE XVII, *Clause 2, line 2. After the words "Research Studentships" substitute for the remainder of the clause:—*

of Class A persons who have done valuable work in letters or science or who have attained special distinction in some branch of knowledge or who, being Official Students, shall desire to engage permanently in research, and to Research Studentships of Class B persons who are well qualified to engage in original research. Election to both these classes shall be subject to the condition that Research Students shall undertake to perform some definite literary or scientific work in the House or in the University or (with the permission of the House) elsewhere, which work shall be specified in the Resolution by which they are elected. The office of Librarian may, subject to his consent given in writing, be assigned to a Research Student.

Such Students shall be elected for a period of five years. Research Students of Class A and in exceptional circumstances Research Students of Class B may be re-elected for further periods of five years, but so that a Research Student shall not hold his Studentship after the age of 65 years unless the Governing Body shall resolve by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting to extend the tenure of his Studentship for a further period of five years.

The total number of Research Students of Class A shall not exceed two at any one time. The total payments to them shall not exceed £1800 per annum, in stipends.

The total payments to Research Students of Class B shall not exceed £2000 per annum in stipends.

A strictly limited amount of teaching work in the House may, subject to his consent given in writing or by the terms of his appointment, be assigned to a Research Student.

Any Research Student who fails to comply *bona fide* with the conditions of his election shall be removed from his Studentship.

STATUTE XVII, *Clause 7. For the first sentence substitute An Official Student shall vacate his Studentship if he marry without the leave of the Governing Body before seven years from the day of his appointment or before he has reached the age of 32 years (whichever period shall have been reached first).*

STATUTE XVII, *Clause 14, Para. 4, Line 1. For the words "Married Official Students" substitute To every Official Student who does*

not reside within the House the Governing Body may assign, over and above his stipend as Official Student, a housing allowance not exceeding £50 per annum. Such Official Students if . . .

STATUTE XXII, *Clause 3 (i), Last line but one. For "Organ" read Music.*

STATUTE XXVI, 1, *line 3. For "£800" read £1200.*

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th July, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th July, 1929, to Saturday, the 13th July, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday, 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 24).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Contraction of Southampton Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 21) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (Nos. 22 and 23) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas described in the First and Second Schedules to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last-mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Release of Infected Areas from Restrictions.

2.—(1) The Area described in the First Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the sixth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

(2) The Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-

and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 24).
