CIVIL SERVICE.

REGULATIONS dated the sixth day of June, 1929, made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the Order in Council dated the 22nd July, 1920, with respect to the sick leave pay to be allowed to Civil Servants to whom the provisions of Article 19 of the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910, have hitherto been applied.

In pursuance of Article 6 of the said Order of 22nd July, 1920, the Treasury hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Sick leave may be granted by the Head of his Department to any officer to whom these regulations apply subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

(i) (a) After two days' continuous absence a certificate by a duly qualified medical prac-

itioner shall be furnished stating the cause of such absence; and further medical certificates shall be furnished from time to time thereafter as may be required by the Head of the Department.

(b) If the number of days during which any officer is absent on sick leave in any period of twelve months without such certificate shall exceed seven in the aggregate, the number of days of absence in excess of seven shall be deducted from the amount of the ordinary annual holidays allowable.

(c) Provided there is a reasonable prospect supported by medical certificates of eventual recovery, sick leave on full pay may be allowed for a period not exceeding six months in the aggregate during any period of twelve months, and thereafter sick leave on half-pay, subject always to a maximum of twelve months' sick leave in any period of four years or less. Where sick leave is not continuous, six months' and twelve months' sick leave shall be taken for this purpose as 183 and 365 days respectively, including Sundays and public holidays occurring within a period of sick leave.

(d) When an officer's sick leave exceeds in the aggregate twelve months during any period of four years or less, no pay shall be allowed during any further sick leave except with the consent of the Treasury.

(e) Sick leave in excess of twelve months during any period of four years or less shall

not be reckoned for the purposes of increment or pension.

(ii) When the limit referred to in Clause (i) (d) of this regulation has been reached, the Treasury may allow pay during any further sick leave at a rate not exceeding the amount of pension (if any) for which, at the expiration of twelve months' sick leave, the officer would have been qualified, or half pay, if this is less.

(iii) When full or half pay has once ceased under this Regulation an officer shall not revert to such pay during the same absence on sick leave. Unless an officer is fit for duty, ordinary leave shall not be allowed in immediate succession to sick leave.

(iv) In the application to the case of officers holding Modified (War) Certificates of the foregoing clauses of these Regulations the following modification shall be made, that for the first five years of service after the date of the certificate any civil pay allowed during sick leave in excess of three months in the aggregate in any year shall be reduced to such amount as, with any pension or retired pay and allowances on account of Great War disability payable in respect of the period of sick leave, will not exceed the full civil pay of the officer in respect of that period.

Provided that where the amount of pension or retired pay and allowances (on account of Great War disability) is calculated by reference to considerations of length of service in addition to disablement, rank and family, the amount to be taken into account shall be limited to the amount of pension or retired pay and allowances, calculated by reference only to disablement, rank and family which would have been awarded to the officer if no considerations of service had been taken into account.

Provided also that in the case of an officer who, if he had retired on the ground of ill-health at the commencement of the period of sick leave, would have been qualified for a pension, if the amount of the reduced civil pay during sick leave is less than the pension which, if he had so retired, would have been payable to him in respect of the period of sick leave, it may, with the consent of the Treasury, be increased to an amount not exceeding the amount of such pension.

2. These Regulations shall be applicable to Civil Servants to whom the provisions of Article 19 of the Order in Council of 10th

January, 1910, have hitherto been applied, and shall come into force with effect from the 1st day of February, 1929.

3. Article 19 of the Order in Council dated 10th January, 1910, Article 3 of the Order in Council dated 22nd March, 1918, and the Regulations dated 30th November, 1922, made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the Order in Council dated 22nd July, 1920, are hereby repealed.
