HEREAS by Section 284 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vic. cap. 60), it is provided that, where the legislature of any British possession provides for the survey of, and grant of certificates for, passenger steamers, and the Board of Trade report to His Majesty The King that they are satisfied that the certificates are to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under that Act, His Majesty, by Order in Council, may—

- (1) declare that the certificates granted in the said British Possession shall be of the same force as if granted under that Act; and
- (2) declare that all or any of the provisions of Part III of that Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, either without modification or with such modifications as to His Majesty may seem necessary, apply to the certificates granted in the said British Possession; and
- (3) impose such conditions and make such regulations with respect to the certificates, and to the use, delivery and cancellation thereof, as to His Majesty may seem fit, and impose fines not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of those conditions and regulations:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Legislature of the Straits Settlements has provided for the survey of and grant of certificates for passenger steamers:

And whereas the Board of Trade have reported to His Majesty that they are satisfied that such certificates are, as regards foreign-going passenger steamers, to the like effect, and are granted after a like survey, and in such manner as to be equally efficient with the certificates granted for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare as follows:—

- 1. The certificates granted in the Straits Settlements under the said provision made by the Legislature of the Straits Settlements for foreign-going passenger steamers shall be of the same force as if they had been granted for the like purpose in the United Kingdom under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.
- 2. All the provisions of the third part of the said Act which relate to passenger steamers' certificates shall, without modification, apply to the certificates for foreign-going passenger steamers granted in the Straits Settlements.
- 3. This Order may be cited as The Merchant Shipping Passenger Steamers (Straits Settlements) Order, 1929.

HEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, 7 E. 7. c 29; 4-5 G. 5. c. 18; 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, and 18 G. 5. c. 3, it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels,

aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention, Treaty Series No. 16 (1928), comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Switzerland has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Switzerland the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Switzerland or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884, S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX, Patents, &c. p. 5, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria has been pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, 46-7 V. c. 57, should apply to Switzerland and certain other foreign countries, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order, in so far as it applies to Switzerland, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared as follows:—

- 1. The laws of Switzerland confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Switzerland or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.
- 2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Switzerland.
- 3. The Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884, in so far as it relates to Switzerland, is hereby revoked.
- 4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Switzerland) Order, 1929.

HEREAS by subsection (4) of Section three of the Registration Amendment (Scotland) Act, 1885, it is provided that the Valuation Roll shall be in the form contained in the Schedule to that Act until such form is altered by His Majesty by Order in Council:

And whereas by subsection (1) of Section fourteen of the Rating (Scotland) Act, 1926, (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1926) as amended by subsection (1) of Section fortynine of the Local Government (Scotland) Act. 1929, (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1929) it is provided that every Valuation Roll shall, in addition to the other particulars required, show the net annual value and also the rateable value of the lands and heritages:

And whereas in consequence of the provisions of subsection (1) of Section fourteen of the Act of 1926 as originally enacted, an altered form of Valuation Roll was prescribed by the Valuation

Roll (Scotland) Order, 1927:

And whereas in consequence of the provisions of the Rating and Valuation (Apportionment) Act, 1928, (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1928) and the Act of 1929, it is necessary to prescribe an altered form of Roll:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Valuation

Roll (Scotland) Order, 1929. 2.—(1) In this Order "Agricultural lands and heritages" and "Freight transport lands and heritages" have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act of 1928, and "Industrial lands and heritages" has the meaning assigned to it in the Act of 1928 as amended by the Act of 1929.

(2) In the Schedule to this Order—
"Class No." and "Percentage," in relation to any lands and heritages, mean respectively the number of the paragraph of the First Schedule to the Act of 1926 and the percentage rate of deduction specified in that Schedule as amended by the Act of 1929

applicable in the case; "Net annual value" has the meaning assigned to it in subsection (3) of Section nine of the Act of 1928 except in the case of agricultural lands and heritages in which case it has the meaning assigned to it by subsection (2) of Section forty-four of the

Act of 1929;

"Rateable value" has the meaning assigned to it in subsection (1) of Section twenty-nine of the Act of 1926, as amended by subsection (3) of Section nine of the Act of 1928, and Sections forty-four and forty-five of the Act of 1929.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Valuation Roll (Scotland) Order, 1927, is hereby revoked, without prejudice to the validity of anything done thereunder.

4.—(1) Subject to the provisions with respect to modifications hereinafter contained, the Valuation Roll shall be as set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

- (2) The following modifications or any of them may be made in the Valuation Roll for any county or any part thereof or for any burgh, if the county council or town council by whom the Roll is made up shall so determine:
 - (a) the subdivision of the column of the Roll headed "Description and situation of subject " may be dispensed with;
 - (b) the columns of the Roll headed "Proprietor " " Tenant " and " Occupier " or any two of these columns may be combined and in that event where the names of different persons fall to be included in the column by reason of their different qualifications the Roll shall show, in such manner as shall be indicated by a note thereto, the different qualifications of the persons whose names are included in the column;
 - (c) the Roll may be made up without the column headed "Inhabitant Occupier not rated '" and its sub-divisions, and in the event of the Roll being so made up and of there being an inhabitant occupier not rated whose name would have been entered in the said column, his name shall be entered in the same column as that in which the name of the occupier is entered and there shall be added after the name of such inhabitant occupier the letters "IO" and also, unless the council by whom the Roll is made up shall otherwise determine, the annual value of the dwelling occupied by the inhabitant occupier;
 - (d) the Roll may be made up in parts and in that event-
 - (i) Part I of the Roll shall contain (A) all lands and heritages from the gross annual value of which the deductions specified in the First Schedule to the Act of 1926 as amended by Section forty-four of the Act of 1929 are made in ascertaining the net annual value in the case of lands and heritages other than agricultural lands and heritages and the rateable value in the case of agricultural lands and heritages and (B) any other lands and heritages classified as industrial lands and heritages or as freight transport lands and heritages;
 - (ii) Part II of the Roll shall contain all other lands and heritages; provided that there may be excluded from Part II and included in another Part (Part III) all lands and heritages the rateable value of which is nil. In Part II and Part III the column headed "Deduction from Gross Annual Value for ascertaining Net Annual Value" (including its subdivisions) shall be omitted, and the column headed "Net Annual Value" and "Rateable Value" may be combined. If in every case towhich Part II applies the gross annual value is also the net annual value and the rateable value, the columns headed "Gross Annual Value, being yearly rent or value," "Net Annual Value" and "Rateable Value" may be combined. In Part III there may be added to the heading of the column headed "Gross Annual Value, being yearly rent or value " the words " the Net Annual Value and Rateable Value in each case is nil" and in that event the

columns relating to net annual value and rateable value may be omitted;

- (e) A column may be inserted in the Roll showing the amount of the deduction under the First Schedule to the Act of 1926 for the purpose of ascertaining the net annual value;
- (f) As respects the column headed "Net Annual Value" there may be included in the heading a statement that the column is limited to cases in which the net annual value differs from the rateable value or a statement that the column is limited to cases of agricultural lands and heritages the net annual value of which differs from the gross annual value and to cases of other lands and heritages the net annual value of which differs from the rateable value. Any such statement as aforesaid, instead of being actually incorporated in the heading, may be included in a note to the Roll provided reference is made to the note in the heading;
- (g) Columns may be included in the Roll or where the Roll is made up in parts in Part I of the Roll (a) for the purpose of showing the apportionments of net annual value required to be so shown in the case of industrial lands and heritages or freight transport lands and heritages in pursuance of subsections (6), (7) and (8) of Section nine of the Act of 1928, or (b) for the purpose of showing the amount of the deduction in ascertaining the rateable value of agricultural lands and heritages, industrial lands and heritages, under the Act of 1929.
- (3) For the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of subsections (5) and (7) of

Section nine of the Act of 1928 there shall be included in the Roll, according as the county council or town council by whom the Roll is made up determine, either a column showing what lands and heritages are respectively agricultural lands and heritages, industrial lands and heritages, and freight transport lands and heritages and the nature of the transport purpose in the case of freight transport lands and heritages not occupied and used for more than one transport purpose or a statement showing by what means the provisions of the said subsections are being carried into effect.

(4) The Valuation Roll for a burgh may if the town council by whom the Roll is made up so determine, include a column headed

"Feuduty or Ground Annual."

(5) Where a domestic water rate is leviable within a district under the Public Health (Scotland) Amendment Act, 1891, in respect of any agricultural lands and heritages, then, if for the purpose of complying with the provisions of subsection (2) of Section forty-nine of the Act of 1929, the county council by whom the Roll is made up so determine, the Roll may include a column showing what would have been the rateable value of such agricultural lands and heritages if the Act of 1929 (other than subsection (5) of Section forty-four) had not passed and having the following heading or any other heading substantially to the like effect, that is to say, "Agricultural Subjects Rateable Value for Domestic Water Rate under Public Health (Scotland) Amendment Act, 1891," and there may be subdivisions of the column headed respectively "Proprietor" and "Occupier."

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of May, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Bruton, the Benefice of Wyke Champflower and the Benefice of Redlynch, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Bruton, Wyke Champflower and Redlynch duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union (including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Bruton namely the transfer to such Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes of the extra parochial place known as Eastrip, situate in the said County and

Diocese), and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the

said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Bruton and Redlynch are now full the Reverend Prebendary Douglas Llewellyn Hayward being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bruton and the Reverend William Monckton Annesley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Redlynch and the said Benefice of Wyke Champflower is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Wyke Champflower and Redlynch now belongs to Sir Henry Hugh Arthur Hoare, of Stourhead, in the County of Wilts, Baronet, and the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bruton is vested in certain Trustees namely the said Henry Hugh Arthur Hoare, Dame Alda Annie Hoare, wife of the said Henry Hugh Arthur Hoare, and Peter Arthur Marsham Hoare, of Luscombe Castle, Dawlish, in the County of Devon, Esquire:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent so far as concerns the provision as to Patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed of the said Henry Hugh Arthur Hoare, Alda Annie Hoare and Peter Arthur Marsham Hoare (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:-

"1. That the said Benefice of Bruton, the said Benefice of Wyke Champflower and the said Benefice of Redlynch shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bruton with Wyke and Redlynch' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices of Bruton and Redlynch shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Bruton shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Bruton with Redlynch and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Bruton shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for such United Parish.

"3. That with the consent of the said Douglas Llewellyn Hayward (testified by his signing this Scheme), if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Redlynch shall be vacant then the said union shall forthwith take effect and the said Douglas Llewellyn Hayward shall become and be the the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Redlynch shall not be vacant then the union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Redlynch and in that case pending the union of all three of the said Benefices as aforesaid

the said Benefice of Bruton and the said Benefice of Wyke Champflower shall upon the day aforesaid be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bruton with Wyke' but, the Parishes of the said Benefices of Bruton and Wyke Champflower shall continue distinct in all respects, and upon any vacancy arising in such United Benefice of Bruton with Wyke, the right of presentation or nomination thereto shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Bruton.

All that portion of the Parish of West Hackney, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the north by the New Parish of Christ Church, Clapton, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint James, Clapton, upon the south east and upon the south by the New

"Whereas the Right Reverend George Kennedy Allen, now Bishop of Chichester, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our

general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid additions and improvements a sum of £1,700 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to

the Bishopric of Chichester: Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £1,700 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 18 years or until the said sum of £1,700 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one fifteenth part of the said principal sum of £1,700 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum

on the said principal sum or on so much

thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. "And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.
