The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act), it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of light-houses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund, shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 12th day of March, 1923, in pursuance of the above recited powers, the establishment which might be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioners) being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the Officers of the said establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient that the amount to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of the said establishment should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such variation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Grant of Gratuity) Order, 1929.

(2) In addition to the salary specified in the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 12th day of March, 1923, as payable to the Secretary included in the said Establishment, there shall be paid to Mr. Coventry Dick Peddie, the late Secretary, a gratuity or honorarium of £1,000 for exceptional services rendered by him in connection with his occupancy of the post of Secretary.

(3) The sum payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 15th day of April, 1919, provision was made for amending Articles 36 and 45 of the Order of 1910:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 18th day of August, 1919, provision was made for amending Article 32 of the Order of 1910:

And whereas Article 36 of the Order of 1910 was repealed by a regulation made on the 11th day of January, 1921, by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Treasury, in pursuance of Article 4 of a certain Order in Council made on the 22nd day of July, 1920:

And whereas the provisions of Part III, Part IV and Part V of the Order of 1910 have now become obsolete and it is accordingly expedient that the said Parts and the said Orders of the 15th day of April and the 18th day of August, 1919, should be repealed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Part III, Part IV and Part V of the Order of 1910, as in force at the date of this Order, and the said Orders of the 15th day of April and the 18th day of August, 1919, shall be repealed:

Provided that the repeal aforesaid shall not affect the validity of anything done thereunder or by virtue of the repealed provisions, or any right, privilege or exemption enjoyed by any person in His Majesty's Civil Establishments under or by virtue of those provisions as in force at the date of this Order.

**W**HEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that Sections 34, 35 and 36 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, shall extend, with or

without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications in the Order mentioned, to any Foreign Country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction, and that thereupon those Sections shall, to the extent of that jurisdiction, operate as if that Country were a British Possession, and as if His Majesty in Council were the Legislature of that Possession:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty The King has jurisdiction in China:

And whereas it is expedient that Sections 34, 35 and 36 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, should be extended to China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Sections 34, 35 and 36 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, shall from the date of this Order apply to China as though it were a Colony within the meaning of the said Sections.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of May, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure of Warton (near Carnforth) (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice of Warton'), in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Warton is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Wor-

cester (hereinafter called 'the said Dean and Chapter'):

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Warton now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Blackburn for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Percy Mark, now Bishop of Blackburn, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Warton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed, to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Warton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Warton now vested in them, the said Dean and Chapter, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, and his successors in the Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts:

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.

**WHEREAS** the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, William, Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Vicarage of Bovey Tracey the Parish whereof contains a population of 2038 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 400 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Bovey Tracey is £509 or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Rectory of Lustleigh the Parish whereof contains a population of 516 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 300 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Lustleigh is £263 or thereabouts.

"There are also in the same County and Diocese two isolated portions of the Parish of Hennock situate in the Parish of Bovey Tracey aforesaid with a population of 12 persons or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of Bovey Tracey (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with red) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the Parish of Lustleigh to which it is contiguous.

"That it also appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that one of the said isolated portions and part of the other isolated portion of the said Parish of Hennock the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon coloured Green and the remainder of the isolated portion of the said Parish of Hennock delineated on the said Map annexed hereto and thereon coloured Yellow may be advantageously separated from Hennock and be annexed to the said Parishes of Lustleigh and Bovey Tracey respectively to which they are contiguous.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Bovey Tracey are The Right Honourable Stanley

Baldwin, First Lord of the Treasury, on behalf of the Crown and the Reverend James Anthony Howell, B.D., is the Incumbent thereof.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Lustleigh are Major-General Sir Henry Hugh Tudor, K.C.B., and Mrs. Mary Aurora Spencer Smith and the Reverend Robert Ryder, B.A., is the Incumbent thereof.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Hennock are Canford School Limited and the Reverend Richard James Atfield, B.A., is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to the Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### "SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Bovey Tracey and annex to the Parish of Lustleigh all that part of the Parish of Bovey Tracey known as Wreyland, starting from the point near Yeo Cottage and proceeding along the River Bovey to Wilford Bridge thence along Hatherleigh Lane to the isolated portion of Hennock and thence along the Western, Northern and Eastern boundaries thereof to Slade Cross and continuing along the Moreton-hampstead Road to the boundary of the other isolated portion of Hennock and thence along the Southern boundary thereof until it joins the Lustleigh boundary delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and edged with red.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Lustleigh shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Bovey Tracey.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Lustleigh but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Bovey Tracey.

"That any inhabitant of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Lustleigh as they might have had in the Parish Church of Bovey Tracey.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Bovey Tracey shall belong to the Incumbent of Lustleigh.

"That the Tithe arising out of the land so transferred shall remain the property of the Incumbent of Bovey Tracey.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Hennock and annex to the Parish of Lustleigh one of the isolated portions of the said Parish of Hennock and also part of the other isolated portion of the Parish of Hennock aforesaid and delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and thereon coloured Green.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Lustleigh shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portions so to be separated from Hennock.

"That any inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Lustleigh but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Hennock.

"That any inhabitant of the aforesaid portions shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Lustleigh as they might have had in the Parish Church of Hennock.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portions so to be separated from Hennock shall belong to the Incumbent of Lustleigh.

"That the Tithe arising out of the land so transferred shall remain the property of the Incumbent of Hennock.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Hennock and annex to the Parish of Bovey Tracey the remaining part of the isolated portion of the Parish of Hennock aforesaid and delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and thereon coloured Yellow.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Bovey Tracey shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Hennock.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Bovey Tracey but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Hennock.

"That any inhabitant of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Bovey Tracey as they might have had in the Parish Church of Hennock.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Hennock shall belong to the Incumbent of Bovey Tracey.

"That the Tithe arising out of the land so transferred shall remain the property of the Incumbent of Hennock.

"That no alterations shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Walthamstow, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized:

And whereas in the month of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, certain Inhabitant Householders of the Urban District of Walthamstow, in the County of Essex, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation:

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Walthamstow herein described a Municipal Borough, and to incorporate the Inhabitants thereof, and to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Highway Act, 1835, the Walthamstow Highway Board was constituted for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the Highway Act, 1835, into effect:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1858, the Local Board for the District of Walthamstow (hereinafter called the "Local Board") was in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three constituted and became invested with various powers and duties, and the Local Board was constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Local Government District of the Parish of Walthamstow with twelve elective Members:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Board became the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Local Government District of Walthamstow:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Walthamstow (hereinafter called "the District Council"):

And whereas by virtue of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Urban District of Walthamstow became a Parliamentary Borough with two divisions, each division returning one Member to Parliament, and in pursuance of Section 39 of the said Act, the District Council made an order dated the 21st day of November, 1928, dividing the said two divisions into polling districts and appointing polling places:

And whereas by an order dated the 7th day of January, 1890, and finally approved on the 1st day of April, 1890, the Essex County Council divided the District of Walthamstow into four wards named "Hoe Street Ward," "St. James' Ward," "Wood Street Ward," and "Northern Ward," and increased the numbers of Members of the Local Board from 12 to 18:

And whereas by an order dated the 7th day of July, 1896, and finally approved on the 7th day of October, 1896, the Essex County Council divided the said "St. James' Ward" and "Hoe Street Ward" into three Wards, named "High Street Ward," "Hoe Street Ward" and "St. James Street Ward," and increased the number of members of the District Council from 18 to 22:

And whereas on the 25th day of March, 1901, the Local Government Board confirmed an order of the Essex County Council transferring part of Walthamstow Urban District to Woodford Urban District:

And whereas by an order dated the 4th day of October, 1904, and finally approved on the 3rd day of January, 1905, the Essex County Council increased the number of members of the District Council from 22 to 27:

And whereas by an order dated the 7th day of January, 1913, and finally approved on the 1st day of April, 1913, the Essex County Council divided the "Northern Ward" into

two Wards, named "Higham Hill Ward" and "Hale End Ward," and increased the number of members of the District Council from 27 to 33:

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 5th day of October, 1896, under Sections 33 and 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council were vested with certain powers of a Parish Council (Sections 5, 6 and 8 in part of the said Act):

And whereas in pursuance of Sections 10 and 11 of the Burial Act, 1852, the Walthamstow Burial Board was appointed by the Vestry of the Parish of Walthamstow, on the 14th day of June, 1870, for the Parish of Walthamstow (excluding the ecclesiastical district of St. Peter):

And whereas by a Resolution of the District Council duly passed on the 27th day of December, 1895, the powers, duties, property, debts and liabilities of the Walthamstow Burial Board were transferred to the District Council as from the 1st day of January, 1896:

And whereas tables of fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts are now in force within the District of the said Council:

And whereas the following additional Acts of Parliament wholly or in part affect the Urban District of Walthamstow:—

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Walthamstow Scheme, 1929."

2. The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walthamstow are in this Scheme referred to as "The Corporation."

3. This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough, and as the Local Education Authority (as the case may be) of the said Borough.

5. The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and the powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.

All the jurisdiction, powers, rights, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme), shall vest in the Corporation, and shall be exercised, held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation.

Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

6. The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all right of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of property so defined.

7. The General Rate Fund and General Rate of the Borough of Walthamstow shall for all purposes whatsoever take the place of and be substituted for the General Rate Fund and General Rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from or out of, and all liabilities

charged upon or attaching to the General Rate Fund and General Rate of the said Urban District shall be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said General Rate Fund and General Rate of the said Borough respectively.

and any other Public General Act or Local Act or Order and any bye-laws in force within the Urban District of Walthamstow at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, unless duly repealed, revoked or varied, continue in force and have operation in the Borough in like manner and with like effect, as if the Corporation, acting by the Council and their Officers, and the Borough, were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or the District Council (as the case may be) and their Officers and the District, provided that any of the said bye-laws made before the 1st day of January, 1919, which, under the provisions of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are now subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, shall cease to be in force at the expiration of two years from the commencement of

this Scheme, unless previously continued in force, repealed or altered by the Corporation.

The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if the Council of the Borough were referred to therein instead of the District Council and the members of the Education Committee of the District Council who are in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed under the said recited Scheme by the Council of the Borough.

The said recited School Attendance Bye-laws made under the Elementary Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

10. The Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Essex, so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Walthamstow, shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of Walthamstow, as if made by the Corporation, until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-laws for the good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force whichever shall first occur.

11. The Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the Council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a Watch Committee, a police force or special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

12. The tables of fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts shall continue in force until the same are repealed, varied, revised or altered by such bodies and with such approval as is required by law.

13. Notwithstanding the Incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, given or done, before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to or with reference to the District Council, shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

14. (1) Any officer who shall be in the employment of the District Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and who shall on that date have been employed by the District Council for a period of not less than five years—

(a) if the officer is not appointed to an office of a similar character and of an equal

value by the Corporation he shall be entitled to compensation from the Corporation, for the loss of the office held by him under the District Council or the reduction of the salary or emoluments sustained by him as the case may require; or

(b) if the officer is appointed to an office by the Corporation and his appointment is determined by the Corporation or his salary or emoluments are reduced within four years after the commencement of this Scheme because his services are not required or his duties are diminished and not on the ground of misconduct he shall be entitled to compensation from the Corporation for the loss of that office or the reduction of the salary or emoluments sustained by him as the case may require.

(2) For the purposes of this Article the provisions of section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, shall apply subject to the following and any necessary modifications:—

(a) References in that section to the County Council shall be read as references to the Corporation and references in that section to "the passing of this Act" as references to the date on which the loss of office or the reduction of the salary or emoluments takes effect;

(b) The expression in subsection (1) of that section "the Acts and rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service" shall mean the Acts and rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service which were in operation at the date of the passing of the Local Government Act, 1888;

(c) In subsections (4) and (6) of that section references to the Treasury shall be read as references to the Minister of Health;

(d) In subsection (7) of that section for the words "the same or any other County Council" there shall be substituted the words "any local authority as defined by the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922," and there shall be added to the subsection the words "For the purposes of this subsection a teacher in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by a Council shall be deemed to hold an office under the Council."

(3) Where years are added to the actual service of the officer under the Acts and rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service the number of years so added shall not exceed the number of years by which the age of the officer at the date on which the loss of office or the reduction of the salary or emoluments takes effect falls short of sixty-five years.

(4) In determining the compensation payable to an officer under this Article regard shall be had to the conditions and circumstances mentioned in subsection (1) of section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and the compensation shall not exceed two-thirds of the annual pecuniary loss or if the compensation is payable otherwise than by way of an annual sum the capital value of such annual sum as might have been awarded.

(5) In computing the service of any officer for the purpose of the award of compensation, the Council shall take into account all the service of that officer after he attained the age of eighteen years under any local



authority: Provided that where the officer held two or more offices and the claim to compensation is based on a loss of one or some only of those offices account shall not be taken under this paragraph of service in an office which the officer continues to hold unless throughout the period of his service in that office he devoted the whole of his time to the duties of offices held by him under one or more local authorities.

(6) Any compensation payable under this Article to an officer shall be paid by the Corporation out of the general rate fund of the Borough.

(7) In this Article—

(a) the expression "officer" does not include any person whose remuneration is payable at intervals of less than one month unless the appointment of that person is determinable on not less than one month's notice; and

(b) the expression "local authority" means any local authority as defined in section three of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922.

(8) For the purposes of this Article a teacher employed in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by the District Council or the Corporation shall be deemed to be an officer employed by the District Council or employed and appointed to an office by the Corporation, and if his appointment is determined by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation he shall be deemed to be an officer whose appointment is determined by the Corporation.

15. The Accounts of the District Council and their Officers shall be made up to the date of the commencement of this Scheme, and shall (as soon as conveniently may be) be audited by the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal, as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board or the Minister of Health with respect to the Audit of Accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils, and of their Officers, shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit; any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

16. Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925, and of the Local Government Act, 1929.

In Statute V, Section i, Subsection 2—Election and Tenure of Scholarships—at the end of the subsection add the following new clause:—

"10. In the case of a person whose Scholarship has not been renewed under Clause 4, or who has been deprived of his Scholarship under Clause 7, it shall be lawful for the Governing Body, after the lapse of not less than three terms, to renew or restore such Scholarship, provided that there has been laid before them a recommendation, from the Tutorial Committee to that effect, accompanied by a report expressing satisfaction with his industry and good conduct."

#### WALLASEY CORPORATION TRAMWAYS (CESSOR OF POWERS) ORDER 1929.

**W**HEREAS the Wallasey Urban District Council were authorised by the Wallasey Tramways and Improvements Act, 1899 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1899") to construct and have constructed and opened for traffic certain tramways situate in the County Borough of Wallasey including the part of the tramway described in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the abandoned tramway."

And whereas Parts II and III of the Tramways Act, 1870, are incorporated with the Act of 1899 and in the said Part III it is enacted by Section 41 inter alia as follows:—

"If at any time after the opening of any tramway in any district for traffic, the promoters discontinue the working of such tramway, or of any part thereof, for the space of three calendar months (such discontinuance not being occasioned by circumstances beyond the control of such promoters, for which purpose the want of sufficient funds shall not be considered a circumstance beyond their control), and such discontinuance is proved to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade, the said Board, if they think fit, may by order declare that the powers of the promoters in respect of such tramway or the part thereof so discontinued shall, from the date of such order, be at an end, and thereupon the said powers of the promoters shall cease and determine, unless the same are purchased by the local authority in manner by this Act provided."

And whereas by virtue of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, have been transferred to the Minister of Transport.

And whereas the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Wallasey (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") have applied to the Minister of Transport for an Order under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, declaring that the powers of the Corporation (as successors to the Wallasey Urban District Council) in respect of the abandoned tramway shall be at an end and it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister of Transport that the working of the abandoned tramway has been discontinued for the space of three calendar months.

Now therefore the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 41 of the Tram-

ways Act, 1870, hereby orders and declares that the powers of the Corporation in respect of the abandoned tramway shall from the date of this Order be at an end.

This Order may be cited as the Wallasey Corporation Tramways (Cesser of Powers) Order, 1929.

#### SCHEDULE.

The abandoned tramway referred to in the foregoing Order is situate in Seabank Road, Trafalgar Road and King Street, between Molyneux Drive and Church Street, and is a part of the tramway enumerated and described in Section 16 of the Act of 1899, as Tramway No. 1.
