WHEREAS by Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, it is (amongst other things) enacted that if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition, and the Council thereupon petition, The King for an alteration of the number of Councillors of a Borough, it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time by Order in Council to fix the number of Councillors to be allotted to such Borough:

And whereas by the Liverpool Corporation Act, 1927, the City of Liverpool was extended so as to include the parishes of Croxteth Park and West Derby Rural:

And whereas it was provided by the said Act, and subject to certain conditions thereby imposed, that if the number of persons rated in the Croxteth Ward or the aggregate rating of the Ward increased so as to justify an increase of the number of Councillors of the Ward it should be lawful for the Council to petition The King for an alteration of the number of the Councillors of the Ward and for the purposes of any such Petition and the proceedings thereon the provisions of

Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and extended by the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, should apply with the necessary modifications as in the case of a Petition presented by the Council of a Borough not divided into Wards praying only for an alteration of the number of Councillors of the Borough:

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the City of Liverpool on the 2nd day of January, 1929, agreed to petition, and the said Council thereupon petitioned His Majesty for an alteration of the number of Councillors of the Croxteth Ward of the said City:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 1st day of March, 1929, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council to consider the same on the 4th day of April, 1929, and report their opinion thereon to His Majesty in Council:

And whereas notice of the said Petition and of the time when it pleased His Majesty to order that the same should be taken into consideration by His Privy Council was published in the London Gazette one month at least before the said Petition was so considered:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance and exercise of the powers in Him vested by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1893, the Borough Councillors (Alteration of

Number) Act, 1925, and by the Liverpool Corporation Act, 1927, and of every other power enabling Him in that behalf, doth by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order and direct that:—

1. The number of Councillors of the said Croxteth Ward shall be increased from one to three.

2.—(1) The two additional Councillors of the said Ward shall be elected on the first day of November, 1929, and the election shall be conducted by the same persons and in the same manner as an ordinary election of Councillors of the City.

(2) The Councillor elected by the larger number of votes shall retire on the first day of November, 1932, and the other Councillor shall retire on the second day of November, 1931.

(3) The Councillor in office for the said Ward at the date of this Order shall retire on the first day of November, 1930.

3. The election of the additional Alderman made necessary by the increase in the number of Councillors of the City shall take place at the next ordinary election of Aldermen of the City after the date of this Order and the additional Alderman so elected shall retire on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1935.

4. If for any reason it is doubtful which of the additional Councillors elected in pursuance of this Order ought to retire in the years specified in this Order, the question shall be determined at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election by lot under the direction of the Lord Mayor or other person presiding at that meeting.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend George, Lord Bishop of Bristol, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, George, Lord Bishop of Bristol, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Gloucester and Diocese of Bristol the Vicarage or Benefice of Henbury the Parish whereof contains a population of Three thousand or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for One thousand one hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Henbury is Seven hundred and forty pounds.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Almondsbury the Parish whereof contains a population of One thousand seven hundred and fifty-five or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for Four hundred and twenty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Almondsbury is Seven hundred and fourteen pounds.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Compton Greenfield the Parish whereof is delineated on the Plan annexed to the Scheme and thereon coloured Green and the said Parish of Compton Greenfield contains a population of Thirty-two or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for Ninety-six persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Compton Greenfield is Two hundred and forty-nine pounds six shillings and nine pence.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certain portions of the said Parish of Henbury containing a population of One hundred and seventy-five or thereabouts and distant from the Parish Church of Henbury three miles and more particularly delineated on the Plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon coloured Pink may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Compton Greenfield to which the said portions in the Parish of Henbury are contiguous.

"That it also appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the said Parish of Almondsbury containing a population of Three hundred and forty or thereabouts and more particularly delineated on the Plan annexed to the said Scheme and thereon coloured Blue may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Compton Greenfield to which it is contiguous.

"The Honourable Esmé Smyth, Colonel the Right Honourable Edward Murray, Baron Roundway, the Right Honourable Michael Guy Percival, Baron Middleton and Colonel Francis William George Gore are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Henbury and the Reverend John Collins Lloyd is the present Incumbent thereof.

"I, the said Lord Bishop, by virtue of my office am the Patron of the said Benefice of Almondsbury and the Reverend George Robert Wood is the present Incumbent thereof.

"I am also by virtue of my office the Patron of the said Benefice of Compton Greenfield and the Reverend Wilfrid James Crewe is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the Twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, Tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Henbury Almondsbury and Compton Greenfield and also the consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme

you may certify the same and such consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Henbury and annex to the Parish of Compton Greenfield all those portions of the civil Parish of Henbury on the north western and south eastern sides of the Parish of Compton Greenfield which portions are comprised within and are more particularly delineated upon the Plan annexed to this Scheme and thereon coloured Pink and to separate from the Parish of Almondsbury and annex to the said Parish of Compton Greenfield all that portion of the civil Parish of Almondsbury on the north eastern side of the said Parish of Compton Greenfield which portion is more particularly delineated upon the Plan annexed to this Scheme and thereon coloured Blue.

" That the Incumbent of the said Parish of Compton Greenfield shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portions so to be separated from the Parishes of Almondsbury and Henbury respectively.

" That the inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Compton Greenfield but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in either of the Parish Churches of Henbury or Almondsbury to which they may now be respectively entitled except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches of Henbury or Almondsbury and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

" That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portions shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Compton Greenfield as they might have had in the Parish Churches of Henbury and Almondsbury respectively.

" That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portions to be separated from the said Parishes of Henbury and Almondsbury shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Compton Greenfield.

" That no alterations shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices of Compton Greenfield Henbury and Almondsbury or any of them.

" That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices of Compton Greenfield Henbury and Almondsbury or any of them.

" Dated this Thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920-1929.

DECISIONS OF THE COURT OF SESSION ON A REFERENCE MADE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

Contributions Payable.

On the 21st June, 1929, the hearing took place of a case referred by the Minister of Labour to the Court of Session for decision of the questions whether certain persons employed in Scotland in circumstances specified below were

or were not employed persons within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act of 1920.

Employment in connection with an Auction Mart by Live Stock Auctioneers and Appraisers of:—

- (1) a full time yardsman;
- (2) a man employed regularly on Mondays and Saturdays to tend and drive cattle;
- (3) a man employed regularly on Mondays to drive cattle round the sale ring.

The Lord Ordinary held that the employment of the persons in question was not employment in agriculture and accordingly was not excepted under paragraph (a) of Part II of the First Schedule to the Act of 1920. Contributions were, therefore, payable in respect of the employment.

SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT HORNSEA.

PROHIBITION OF REMOVAL OF MATERIALS.

Whereas the Board of Trade acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, found it necessary for the protection of the port of Kingston-upon-Hull to issue an Order dated the 6th day of September, 1869, prohibiting the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the northernmost boundary of the Parish of Hornsea and a point two and half statute miles North of Spurn Point.

And whereas the Urban District Council of Hornsea desire to construct certain sea defence works at Hornsea and to remove for the purpose of the said sea defence works a quantity of 7,000 cubic yards or thereabouts of sand shingle or ballast from the shore between Hornsea Burton Road and New Road Hornsea such shore being part of the shores and banks within the limits specified in the said Order of the 6th day of September, 1869.

Now therefore the Board of Trade do by this Order revoke the said Order of the 6th day of September, 1869, so far only as that Order prohibits the taking or removing by the said Urban District Council their servants or workmen for the purposes of the said sea defence works of any sand shingle or ballast (not exceeding in all 7,000 cubic yards thereof) from the shore at Hornsea between Hornsea Burton Road and New Road Hornsea, and the Board of Trade do hereby declare that in all other respects the said Order of the 6th September, 1869, shall remain in full force and effect.
