you may certify the same and such consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Henbury and annex to the Parish of Compton Greenfield all those portions of the civil Parish of Henbury on the north western and south eastern sides of the Parish of Compton Greenfield which portions are comprised within and are more particularly delineated upon the Plan annexed to this Scheme and thereon coloured Pink and to separate from the Parish of Almondsbury and annex to the said Parish of Compton Greenfield all that portion of the civil Parish of Almondsbury on the north eastern side of the said Parish of Compton Greenfield which portion is more particularly delineated upon the Plan annexed to this Scheme and thereon coloured Blue.

"That the Incumbent of the said Parish of Compton Greenfield shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portions so to be separated from the Parishes of Almonds-

bury and Henbury respectively.
"That the inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Compton Greenfield but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in either of the Parish Churches of Henbury or Almondsbury to which they may now be respectively entitled except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches of Henbury or Almondsbury and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.
"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid

portions shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Compton Greenfield as they might have had in the Parish Churches of

Henbury and Almondsbury respectively.
"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portions to be separated from the said Parishes of Henbury and Almondsbury shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Compton

"That no alterations shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices of Compton Greenfield Henbury and Almondsbury or any

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices of Compton Greenfield Henbury and Almondsbury or any of them.
