The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 24th instant, to confer the dignity of a Baron of the United Kingdom upon the Right Honourable Sir William George Tyrrell, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., K.C.V.O., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style and title of Baron Tyrrell, of Avon in the County of Southampton.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of male young persons of 16 years of age and over at wire winding machines at the works of Messrs. Clayton Dewandre Company Limited, Titanic Works, Lincoln, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable messroom accommodation shall be provided.

PETROLEUM (CONSOLIDATION) ACT, 1928.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, after the expiration of forty days from this date, to make Regulations under Section 10 of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act, 1928, as to the keeping and use of Petroleum-spirit for the purposes of Motor Vehicles, Motor Boats, Aircraft and certain classes of Engines.

These Regulations will replace the two sets of Regulations made under Section 5 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, dated the 31st July, 1907, and 7th of November, 1923, and will extend the provisions of those Regulations to the keeping and use of Petroleum-spirit in respect of other types of Motors and Engines.
