WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the Fourth year of His Majesty King William the Fourth, known as "The Government of India Act, 1833," it was amongst other things enacted that the Island

of St. Helena and all Forts, Factories, Public Edifices and Hereditaments whatsoever in the said Island, and all Stores and Property thereon fit and used for the service of the Government thereof, should be vested in His said Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, and that the said Island should be Governed by such Orders as His said Majesty, His Heirs and Successors in Council should from time to time issue in that behalf:

And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the Twenty-seventh day of July, 1863, provision was made for the Government of the said Island, and by the Tenth Article of the said Order in Council it was provided that there should be in the said Island, for the purpose of advising the Governor thereof, an Executive Council which should be constituted as therein is set forth:

And whereas it is expedient to make further and other provision in lieu of the said Article:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorized thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The St. Helena Order in Council, 1929."
2. The Tenth Article of the aforesaid Order in Council of the Twenty-seventh day of July,

1863, is hereby revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

3. There shall be an Executive Council in and for the Island of St. Helena, and the said Council shall consist of such persons as shall be directed by Instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, and all such persons shall hold their places in the said Council during His Majesty's pleasure. The Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Island of St. Helena (hereinafter referred to as the Governor) may upon sufficient cause to him appearing suspend from the exercise of his functions in the Council any Member thereof pending the signification of His Majesty's pleasure giving immediate notice to His Majesty through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State. If the suspension is confirmed by His Majesty through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State the Governor shall forthwith by an instrument under the Public Seal of the said Island revoke the appointment of such Member, and thereupon his seat in the Council shall become vacant.

4. The said Council shall observe such rules in the conduct of business as may have been or may hereafter be, from time to time, directed or appointed by or under authority of any Instructions addressed to the Governor under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet.

5. In this Order the term "the Governor and Commander-in-Chief" or "the Governor," unless inconsistent with the context, shall include every person for the time being administering the government of the said Island.

6. This Order shall be published in the St. Helena Government Gazette and shall thereupon come into operation.

7. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors in Council may from time to time revoke, add to, alter or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Maurice Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
