AIR NAVIGATION ACT, 1920.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that, after the expiration of 40 days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the Draft of an Order in Council, entitled The Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, under the provisions of the above mentioned Act.
