WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of July, 1929 (C.W. 6626/29), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Schedule V, Section V of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to provide that the Adjutant General, Royal Marines, should receive a salary at the rate of £2,100 a year:

"And whereas we are of opinion that a higher rate of salary should be payable to this officer when he holds the rank of Lieutenant General or above:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction with effect from the 5th July, 1929, the payment to the

Adjutant General, Royal Marines, when of the rank of Lieutenant General or above, of a salary at the standard rate of £2,500, such rate in like manner to that already laid down, to be subject to revision periodically in accordance with the cost of living.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that esters of morphine and their respective salts and any preparations containing any of the said esters are productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare and it is hereby declared that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall henceforth apply to esters of morphine and their respective salts and to any preparation, admixture and extract containing any of the said esters.

**W**HEREAS, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1929, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, and shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

2. The following paragraph shall be inserted at the end of Schedule VII to the principal Order—

"7.—(1) Where it is brought to the notice of the Secretary of State—

(a) that a large number of persons are likely to gather in any district in Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the purpose of witnessing some event of public interest; or

(b) that it is intended to hold in any district in Great Britain and Northern Ireland an aircraft race or contest or exhibition of flying;

the Secretary of State may by directions impose such temporary restrictions on the flying of aircraft within or in the neighbourhood of that district as he may consider expedient in the interest of public safety, and no aircraft shall fly in contravention of any such directions:

Provided that any such restrictions, in so far as they relate to aircraft other than State aircraft, shall apply to British aircraft and aircraft registered in any other Contracting State without distinction.

(2) Any directions issued under this paragraph shall specify the area or areas to which the restrictions extend and the time or times during which the restrictions are to be in force, and, in the case of restrictions applying only to aircraft of, or other than, any particular class or description, the class or description of aircraft to which the restrictions apply, or do not apply, as the case may be.

(3) Any area specified in any such directions shall, during the specified time or times, be deemed to be a prohibited area for the purposes of paragraphs 2, 3, 4 and 5 of this Schedule, but not for the purposes of any other provisions of this Order."

**W**HEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of March, 1928, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to declare what land within Northern Rhodesia should be Crown Land and Native Reserves respectively and to confirm certain alienations of land within Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas it was further declared that the expression "Native Reserves" should mean the lands set apart by the said Order (and described in the Schedule thereto) for the sole and exclusive use of the Natives of Northern Rhodesia and any lands which might thereafter be constituted Native Reserves by any Order in Council amending or adding to the said Order:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of January, 1929, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves)

Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, was amended:

And whereas it is expedient to amend in certain particulars the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, and the Schedule thereto:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment Order in Council, 1929.

2. Article 2 of the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, is hereby amended by the substitution of the word "Reserves" for the word "Reserve" in line three thereof.

3. The Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In the last line of the description of the Tonga (Sigongo) Reserve the word "Mulolobela" shall be substituted for the word "Mulolovela".

(b) In the last line but three of the description of the Tonga (Magoye) Reserve the words and figures "Farm 542, thence along the eastern boundaries of" shall be inserted before the word "Farms".

(c) In the ninth line of the description of the Ila-Tonga Reserve the word "Sia-kaunda" shall be substituted for the word "Suakaunda".

4. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, add to or amend this Order.

5. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Northern Rhodesia Gazette and the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the government of the Territory of Northern Rhodesia shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, 1-2 G. 5, c. 46, and having regard to the provisions of the revised Berne Copyright Convention of 1908, was pleased to make an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of June, 1912, S.R. & O. 1912 (No. 913), p. 48 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection

is guaranteed by the said Convention; including works of which the country of origin is Liberia:

And whereas Liberia has given formal notice of denunciation of the said Convention, and such denunciation, in accordance with Article 29 of the Convention, will take effect from the 22nd day of February, 1930:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Principal Order, in so far as it applies the Copyright Act, 1911, to works of which the country of origin is Liberia, is hereby revoked.

2. This Order shall take effect from the 22nd day of February, 1930.

3. This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Denunciation by Liberia) Order, 1929.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, 7 E. 7, c. 29; 4-5 G. 5, c. 18; 9-10 G. 5, c. 80, and 18 G. 5, c. 3, it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention, Treaty Series No. 16 (1928), comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Belgium has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Belgium the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles

of the United Kingdom when coming into Belgium or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884, S.R. & O., Rev. 1904, IX, Patents, &c. p. 5, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria has been pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, 46-7 V., c. 57, should apply to Belgium and certain other foreign countries, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order, in so far as it applies to Belgium, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Belgium confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Belgium or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Belgium.

3. The Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884, in so far as it relates to Belgium, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Belgium) Order, 1929.

**W**HEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 29th day of March, 1854, directing the discontinuance of burials in the burial ground and in the ground under the chapel of the Roman Catholic Chapel at Banbury, in the County of Oxford:

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 29th day of March, 1854, was varied by the Order in Council of the 12th day of August, 1907:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Orders in Council of the 29th day of

March, 1854, and the 12th day of August, 1907, should be further varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Order in Council of the 29th day of March, 1854, relating to burials in the burial ground and in the ground under the chapel of the Roman Catholic Chapel at Banbury, in the County of Oxford, as varied by the Order in Council of the 12th day of August, 1907, shall be further varied by the addition thereto of the following further excepting clause:—

(a) In an earthen grave space in the Roman Catholic burial ground in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of the late Reverend George Abraham Brabazon, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

**GEORGE THE FIFTH**, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

**WHEREAS** We, having taken into Our Royal consideration the faithful and devoted service rendered by members of the Special Constabulary during the War, and being desirous of distinguishing such service by some mark of Our Royal Favour, and also of providing a means of recognizing continued and efficient service which may be rendered in the future by members of any Special Constabulary Reserve hereafter constituted, did by Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 30th August, 1919, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded for such service as aforesaid;

**AND WHEREAS** We did by Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 31st January, 1920,

revoke the said Warrant and establish revised Rules for the governance of the said Decoration;

AND WHEREAS We are desirous of further amending the said Rules, We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Rules for the governance of the said Decoration:—

I. It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Special Constabulary Long Service Medal."

II. It is ordained that the Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Bronze with Our Effigy on the obverse, and on the reverse an appropriate design or inscription, and shall bear on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal is awarded.

III. It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects who, being or having been members of the Special Constabulary during the War or of any Special Constabulary Reserve, shall satisfy the following conditions, namely:—

(1) Shall have served as a Special Constable without pay during the War for not less than three years, and shall during that period have performed not less than 150 police duties; or

(2) Shall have served in a Special Constabulary Reserve for not less than nine years, and shall be recommended by the Chief Officer of Police as willing and competent to discharge the duties of a Special Constable and as having performed without pay such duty as a Special Constable as has been required from him by the Chief Officer of Police during that period.

Provided that in the case of a man who has served both in the Special Constabulary during the War and in a Special Constabulary Reserve, each period of service during the War amounting to one year or upwards in the course of which he completed not less than 50 police duties shall be reckoned as equivalent to three years' efficient service in the Reserve, and other periods in the same proportion.

IV. It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department or by Our Principal Secretary of State for Scotland, and that the names of the persons eligible for such Medal shall be submitted to Our said Secretaries of State respectively by the Chief Officer of Police under whom such persons have served.

V. It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, of which the central part (one-third of the whole) shall be red, while the remaining parts shall each have three longitudinal stripes of equal width, the central stripe being black and the other two white; and further, that in the case of those to whom the Medal is awarded for service during the War a bar or clasp shall be attached to the riband, bearing the words "The Great War, 1914-1918."

VI. It is ordained that an additional bar or clasp which shall be attached to the riband and shall bear upon it the words "Long Service" may be awarded to those to whom the Medal has been awarded upon the same recommendation by the Chief Officer of Police as is

required for the award of the Medal upon the completion of each ten years of service after the award of the Medal, or, where such award was made under Rule III (1), after 19th July, 1919.

VII. It is ordained that if any person to whom this Medal is awarded shall be guilty of any crime or disgraceful conduct which in Our judgment disqualifies him for the same, his Medal shall, by an Order of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department or of Our Principal Secretary of State for Scotland, be forfeited, and the name of such person shall be erased from the record of those to whom the Medal shall have been awarded. It is hereby further declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors shall be the sole judges of the circumstances demanding such forfeiture, and that every person whose Medal shall be so forfeited shall on being required so to do by either of Our said Secretaries of State deliver up his Medal to such person as either of Our said Secretaries of State may direct.

VIII. The Warrant of the 31st day of January, 1920, is hereby revoked except in so far as it revokes the Warrant of the 30th day of August, 1919.

Sections 52 to 57 (inclusive), 59, 60, 63 and 64, comprised in Part IV (infectious diseases);

Part V (common lodging-houses);

Part VI (recreation grounds); and

Sections 92 and 95, comprised in Part X (miscellaneous provisions).

The Public Health Act, 1925—

Part VI (recreation grounds).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 23, 25, 35, 38, 75 and 92, to the conditions specified in the Order.

(b) The Minister has repealed, as from the said date, the following provisions of the Whitby Urban District Council Act, 1905, namely:—

Section 32 (power to erect buildings, etc.) so far as unrepealed, section 33 (power to provide apparatus for games), so much of section 34 (public bands) as relates to the provision of bands of music in any public park, garden or recreation ground, so much of section 35 (provision of seats or chairs) as relates to the placing of seats or chairs in any park, recreation ground or pleasure ground, so much of section 36 (power to set apart and close pleasure grounds for games) as relates to the setting apart of any portion of any park or pleasure ground for games, section 39 (bye-laws as to bathing), section

40 (for protection of bathers), and section 41 (regulation of tents and huts for bathing or shelter).

(c) The Minister has consented to the adoption by the Council of section 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath), section 22 (preventing soil, etc. from being washed into streets), section 44 (offensive trades), and the sections contained in Part V (water-courses, streams, etc.) of the Public Health Act, 1925, to take effect on the 26th day of August, 1929.

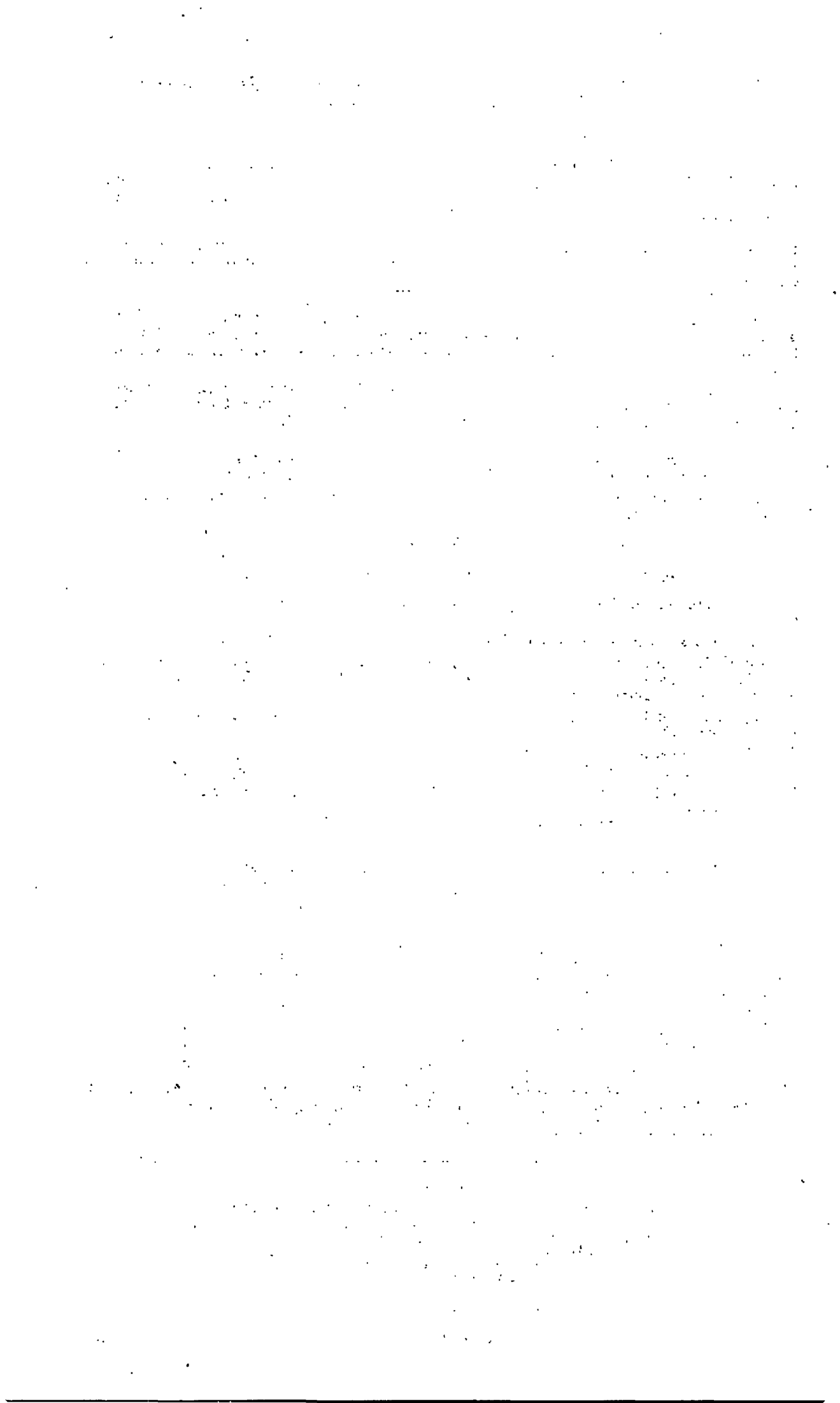
