At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 15th day of *August*, 1929.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of July, 1929 (C.W. 6626/29), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Schedule V, Section V of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to provide that the Adjutant General, Royal Marines, should receive a salary at the rate of £2,100 a year:

“And whereas we are of opinion that a higher rate of salary should be payable to this officer when he holds the rank of Lieutenant General or above:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction with effect from the 5th July, 1929, the payment to the

Adjutant General, Royal Marines, when of the rank of Lieutenant General or above, of a salary at the standard rate of £2,500, such rate in like manner to that already laid down, to be subject to revision periodically in accordance with the cost of living.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
