

Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, was amended:

And whereas it is expedient to amend in certain particulars the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, and the Schedule thereto:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment Order in Council, 1929.

2. Article 2 of the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, is hereby amended by the substitution of the word "Reserves" for the word "Reserve" in line three thereof.

3. The Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In the last line of the description of the Tonga (Sigongo) Reserve the word "Mulolobela" shall be substituted for the word "Mulolovela".

(b) In the last line but three of the description of the Tonga (Magoye) Reserve the words and figures "Farm 542, thence along the eastern boundaries of" shall be inserted before the word "Farms".

(c) In the ninth line of the description of the Ila-Tonga Reserve the word "Sikaunda" shall be substituted for the word "Suakaunda".

4. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, add to or amend this Order.

5. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Northern Rhodesia Gazette and the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the government of the Territory of Northern Rhodesia shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, 1-2 G. 5, c. 46, and having regard to the provisions of the revised Berne Copyright Convention of 1908, was pleased to make an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of June, 1912, S.R. & O. 1912 (No. 913), p. 48 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection

is guaranteed by the said Convention; including works of which the country of origin is Liberia:

And whereas Liberia has given formal notice of denunciation of the said Convention, and such denunciation, in accordance with Article 29 of the Convention, will take effect from the 22nd day of February, 1930:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Principal Order, in so far as it applies the Copyright Act, 1911, to works of which the country of origin is Liberia, is hereby revoked.

2. This Order shall take effect from the 22nd day of February, 1930.

3. This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Denunciation by Liberia) Order, 1929.

And the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury are to give the necessary orders accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, 7 E. 7, c. 29; 4-5 G. 5, c. 18; 9-10 G. 5, c. 80, and 18 G. 5, c. 3, it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention, Treaty Series No. 16 (1928), comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Belgium has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Belgium the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles
