RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES, PIECE WORK BASIS TIME RATES AND OVERTIME RATES IN CERTAIN AREAS AND TO CANCEL THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS IN SUCH AREAS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY General Minimum Time Rates, Piece Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers in the Area comprising the Counties of Gloucestershire (except the County Borough of Bristol), Herefordshire, Northamptonshire, Staffordshire, Warwickshire and Worcestershire, and in the Area comprising the City of London and Metropolitan Police Area, and TO CANCEL the Minimum Rates of Wages in these Areas in their application to Cutters, Trimmers and Packers.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board WILL CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary and to Cancel, which may be lodged with them within two months from the 20th day of August, 1929. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons what is objected to.
