"3. That after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may from time to time require and for the purpose of providing a fund for the payment of the expenses of providing such assistance by Clergy or layworkers a part of the endowment of the United Benefice that is to say a portion namely £75 per annum of the annual stipend payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Martin Hussingtree shall be appropriated as a fund which shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only for the purpose aforesaid.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Martin Hussingtree shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hindlip and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that so much of the net proceeds of such sale as shall appear to us and to the Bishop of Worcester to be sufficient but not exceeding £1000 shall be applied towards the cost of improvements to the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, and any residue of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us said Ecclesiastical Commissioners England as a fund whereof the income shall be applicable towards supplementing the fund referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Hindlip having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Martin Hussingtree having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn

"6. That with the consents of Robert George Wilmot Berkeley of Spetchley Park, Worcester, Esquire (testified by his signing this Scheme), as one of the alternate Patrons of the United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warndon and of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Mary the Virgin at Worcester (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), as the other alternate Patrons of the said United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warndon, and with the consent of the Reverend Lindsey Constantine Cooper (testified by his signing this Scheme), as Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warndon upon the union taking

effect (a) a part of the detached portion of the said Parish of Warndon (situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Hindlip) namely so much of such detached portion as lies to the north of the middle of the Worcester and Birmingham Canal (which said part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Hindlip, (b) so much of the said Parish of Hindlip lying to the south of the said Worcester and Birmingham Canal as is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured green shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Warndon, and (c) so much of the said Parish of Hindlip lying to the south of the said Worcester and Birmingham Canal as is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured brown shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Tibberton with Bredicot.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Worcester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said
