RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN CERTAIN AREAS AND TO CANCEL THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS IN SUCH AREAS.

In accordance with Regulations made under
Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by
the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April,
1927, the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade
Board (England and Wales) HEREBY GIVE
NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY
Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and
Female Workers in the Area comprising the
Counties of Berkshire, Buckinghamshire,
Hertfordshire (excluding that part which lies
within the Metropolitan Police District) and
Oxfordshire, and in the Area comprising the
Counties of Dorsetshire, Hampshire (including
the Isle of Wight) and Wiltshire, and TO
CANCEL the Minimum Rates of Wages in
these Areas in their application to Cutters,
Trimmers and Packers.
