"Whereas by the will dated the 13th day of March, 1928, of the late Madeleine Long Jones, of Number 6, Cromwell-road, Hove, in the County of Sussex, Widow, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Downham Market was devised to the Bishop of Ely for the time being:

"And whereas the said Madeleine Long Jones died on the 18th day of May, 1928:

"And whereas Edward Lawrence Jones, Esquire, who now resides in India, and Lancelot Grey Hugh Smith, of Number 43, Bishopsgate, in the City of London, Esquire, are the executors of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowson would now be vested and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Downham Market should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Ely for the time being in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Leonard, now Bishop of Ely, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Downham Market which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Downham Market:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Lawrence Jones and Lancelot Grey Hugh Smith (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Madeleine Long Jones, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Downham Market shall be transferred to the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely, and

by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 25th day of July, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Boscombe in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Pokesdown, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Boscombe as aforesaid:
