IMPORTED MALT PRODUCTS.

It is announced that a reference has been made to the Standing Committee set up under the above mentioned Act by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, in respect of an application for an Order in Council under the Act to require the marking with an indication of origin of imported malt extract; malt flour; malt extract and cod liver oil; and malt extract blended with any other product in such a way that malt extract comprises more than 50 per cent. of the whole.

GLANDERS OR FARCY ORDER OF 1929.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Notice of Disease.

- 1.—(1) Every person having or having had in his possession or under his charge any diseased or suspected animal, or the carcase thereof shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact either to an Inspector of the Local Authority or to a constable of the police force for the police area wherein the animal or carcase is or was.
- (2) A constable receiving a notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (3) An Inspector of the Local Authority who receives information of the existence or suspected existence of disease shall forthwith report the fact to the Local Authority, and also to the Medical Officer of Health of the
