REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS TECHNICAL ASSISTANT (MALE) ON THE SCIENTIFIC STAFF OF THE FISHERY BOARD FOR SCOTLAND.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Application for appointment must be made to the Secretary of the Board at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Board. When any vacancy which is not to be filled by promotion within the existing staff occurs, the Board will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, and the last day fixed for the receipt of applications will be stated in such advertisement.

2. Candidates must be between 18 and 24 years of age on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications. FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 25).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

Provision for Removal of Manure etc. from Slaughterhouses in the City of Glasgow.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 7 of the principal Order as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) (Amendment) Order of 1929 manure or waste meat trimmings or any other refuse may be moved from any slaughterhouse in the City of Glasgow for conveyance by barge to a point five miles south of Ailsa Craig for dumping, provided that permission for such movement is given in writing by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Glasgow, which permission shall only be given if the manure or waste meat trimmings or other refuse has been thoroughly disinfected.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 25) and shall be read with the principal Order.
