MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the draft of an Order in Council, under section 395 of the above named Act, for amending the existing form of indenture for sea-fishing apprentices.

And notice is hereby further given, that copies of the proposed draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body within forty days of the date of this notice at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

The KING has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Patrick Robin Gilbert Vanden-Bempde-Johnstone a second Lieutenant in the King's Royal Rifle Corps, the younger son of Edward Henry Vanden-Bempde-Johnstone, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the younger son of a Baron as would have been due to him if his father the said Edward Henry Vanden-Bempde-Johnstone had survived his brother Francis, Baron

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 20th September, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 23rd September, 1929, to Saturday, the 28th September, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
