REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE SORTING ASSISTANT IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, LONDON;

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future examinations.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 15 and 18, and the governing date on which

candidates must be of the prescribed age is the 1st October preceding the examination.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

(a) That they are unmarried or widows.

(b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

4. The subjects of Examination and the marks they carry will be as follows:—

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate number of marks as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The Examination is open only to candidates who actually reside with their parents or guardians in the London Postal area or at places not far outside the London Postal area which are within easy daily travelling distance of the office of employment. No candidate will be eligible for appointment unless she can satisfy the Postmaster-General that she possesses the required local residential qualification and it will be within his authority to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied that she complies with this requirement. THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE VALUATION

time to time.*

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken by the Department, by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise, to make known the existence of vacancies have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received and the date by which the age limits will be reckoned.

2. Applications will be addressed to the Department on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached, the authorities of the Department will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them to be best qualified for the duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended, together with the forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps in consultation with the Department as they think fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Department and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifi-

cations will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the qualifications most suited to the posts to be filled. RAWMARSH GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Rawmarsh (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") whose address is the Council Offices, Parkgate, Yorks, intend to apply to the Board of Trade for a

Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To increase the maximum prices which the Council may charge for the supply of gas within their limits of supply for gas purposes.

2. To empower the Council to sell lease exchange dispose of or to retain hold and use lands and to make provisions for the proceeds arising from the sale of surplus lands.

3. To confer upon the Council further powers in connection with their gas undertaking including the following:—To relieve the Council from the obligation of supplying gas in certain circumstances, to prescribe and regulate the materials size and position and the laying of pipes fittings and appliances on premises of consumers, power to compel repairs in case of danger, supply of gas where consumer has separate supply, fittings to be removable by Council though fixed to the soil, power to enter premises to which supply of gas is laid on, provision of valve where high-pressure air or other gas is used, charges for special readings of meters, inspection and testing of meters and to specify by whom the charges for the testing of meters in certain cases shall be borne, provision of dwelling-houses for employees offices showrooms, &c.

4. To empower the Council to borrow money for the purposes of or in connection with the proposed Order and to make other financial provisions.

5. To repeal Article 1 of the Rawmarsh Order, 1918 (Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1918) and all or any of the provisions of the Rawmarsh Local Board Act, 1879, and the Rawmarsh Urban District Council Act, 1923, so far as inconsistent with the provisions of this Order and to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

6. To incorporate and apply with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929, and all or any of the provisions of any Act or Order relating to the gas undertaking of the Council.
