TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th October, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 14th October, 1929, to Saturday, the 19th

October, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Andries Muller Heyns, of the district of George, Cape Province, South

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:

On the 28th December, 1927, at Little Brak Beach, Mossel Bay, South Africa, a youth named Ockardus Johannes Heyns, aged 17, was bathing with a party of friends when suddenly he was attacked by a man-eating shark, which carried him some distance out to sea and bit off his left leg above the knee.

With the full realisation of the danger he was incurring one of the bathers, Andries

Muller Heyns, an uncle of Ockardus Heyns, immediately went out to the assistance of his nephew. The shark, meanwhile, had returned to the attack and had gripped Ockardus Heyns by the right foot and ankle. Andries Heyns got hold of his nephew and tried to free him from the shark; nevertheless the foot and ankle of Ockardus Heyns were severely crushed.

Andries Heyns succeeded in reaching the shore with his nephew, who soon became unconscious and died some hours later in Mossel Bay Hospital.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

With reference to the notice which was published in the issue of the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 18th January, 1929, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of the following classes and descriptions of im-

ported goods:—

The word "Tramways" means the Tramway System worked by the Corpora-tion, the word "Car" means any carriage or car run upon the Tramways and any motor omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers, the word "Conductor" means any Officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a car, and the word "Driver" means any Officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car. "Duly authorised Officer or Servant" means any conductor or driver or any other Officer or Servant of the Corporation charged with the duties of supervising drivers and conductors or in relation to offences under these Byelaws and Regulations in connection with or appertaining to any waiting room or premises used in connection with the Tramways, the person or persons in charge of such waiting room or premises.

Repeal of Former Byelaws and Regulations.

2. From and after the date of these Byelaws and Regulations coming into force all Byelaws and Regulations heretofore made by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Portsmouth with respect to Tramways shall be repealed, but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

Extent of Byelaws and Regulations.

3. The Byelaws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws and Regulations.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

4. Every person shall enter and depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform and not otherwise, except at a terminus or when so directed by the Conductor or other duly authorised officer or servant at other places appointed by the Corporation. When a car stops, no person shall board the car until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so. No person shall enter, mount or leave or attempt to enter, mount or leave any car in motion.

Smoking.

5. No person shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette in or upon any car or in any tramway waiting room except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

Playing Musical Instruments.

6. No passenger or other person shall while riding in or upon any car or using any tramway waiting room sing or whistle, or play or perform upon any musical instrument or make any other noise which shall in the opinion of a duly authorised officer or servant be objectionable to passengers.

Intoxicated and Infected Persons.

7. No person who in the opinion of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant is in a state of intoxication or affected by any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder or disease, or who for any other reason is in the opinion of any duly authorised Officer or Servant unfit to be a passenger in or on any car or to enter any tramways waiting room or any other premises used in connection with the Tramways, shall enter or mount upon any car or enter any premises as aforesaid and if any such person shall attempt to so enter or be found in or upon any car or in or upon any such premises it shall be lawful for the Conductor or any other duly authorised Officer or Servant to prevent such entrance upon or into or remove any such person from the car or premises as aforesaid, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of such fare or any part thereof. No person shall place any article likely to spread any contagious or infectious disease upon any car or in premises as aforesaid.

Objectionable Persons.

8. Any person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the Conductor of the car or other duly authorised Officer or Servant soil, injure or damage the seats, linings, curtains, cushions, or other fittings, of any car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger shall not be entitled to enter, mount or remain in or upon any car or to enter or remain in or on any tramways waiting room or any other premises used in connection with the tramways, and may be prevented from entering, mounting or remaining in or upon any car or from entering or remaining in or on such waiting room or premises, and shall not enter, mount or remain in or upon any car or enter or remain in or on any such waiting room or premises after being requested not to do so by any such Officer or Servant, and if found in or upon any car or in or on any such waiting room or premises shall on the request of the Conductor or any such Officer or Servant leave the car or such waiting room or premises upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him and, on his refusal to do so, he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Byelaw and Regulation, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment. vided, further, that in top covered double deck cars any such person shall if so directed by the Conductor travel in the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon.

Language or Conduct.

9. No person shall swear or use obscene, offensive or abusive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car or in or upon any tramways waiting room or any other premises used in connection with the tramways, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or from or against any car or tramways waiting room or other premises as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger or of any person lawfully using any such waiting room or premises aforesaid. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind or beg or collect alms or subscriptions, or sell, expose for sale or attempt to sell any article, or play any games or gamble or throw down and leave in or upon any car, tramway station, waiting room or premises, as aforesaid, any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any other objectionable matter in or upon any car or in or upon any waiting room or premises aforesaid.

Damage to Car.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, linings or body of the car or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on the car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Payment of Fare.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not, before leaving the car pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant the fare legally payable for the journey or for the stage thereof travelled by such passenger. Upon payment of the fare the passenger shall receive and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket (except as expressly provided for by these Byelaws and Regulations) shall be only available by the car on which it is issued and for the passenger to whom it is given or in respect of whom it is issued. A passenger travelling beyond the stage or journey to which the ticket issued is available shall pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for the distance travelled by the passenger beyond the stage or journey to which the fare had been paid.

Tickets.

12. (a) Every passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do by the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up the ticket issued in such a condition that the number can be read and any other material portion thereof identified or in default pay the fare legally payable for the distance or stage travelled over by such passenger.

- (b) Any ticket for the time being issued by the Corporation in respect of a fare shall only be available for the car on or for which it is issued (except in the case of return, transfer, or season tickets), and no passenger shall (except as expressly provided for by these Byelaws and Regulations) be entitled to leave any car for any purpose whatsoever at any stage and resume his journey by a different car from that on or for which such ticket was issued without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other car.
 - (c) Tickets shall not be transferable.
- (d) Return, transfer or season tickets shall only be available if used in accordance with the conditions upon which the same are issued.

(e) No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

(f) No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any car or on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which had already been used on a previous journey or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions upon which it is issued.

Workmen's Tickets.

13. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Tramways shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Luggage and Parcels.

14. No person shall without the consent of the Conductor take or attempt to take upon any car any personal luggage exceeding twentyeight pounds in weight or any parcel (not being personal luggage of not more than twenty-eight pounds in weight accompanied by a passenger) or any luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) which from its size or otherwise is in the opinion of the Conductor unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the car. All luggage conveyed in or on any car shall be placed in such positions and in such parts of the car as shall be directed by the Conductor. A passenger shall in respect of luggage taken or brought by him upon any car pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of parcels or luggage upon a car, and displayed in the car.

Travelling on Steps, etc.

a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or stand or sit on the railing, guards, or buffers of any car, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or a duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation, shall enter or mount any car. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the

interior on the lower deck of the car with the consent of the Conductor.

Full Number of Passengers.

16. When any car contains on the lower deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such lower deck, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain thereon, except by the express permission of the Conductor first obtained, and upon a breach of this Byelaw and Regulation, and on a refusal to leave the car, a passenger may be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation. When a car contains on the upper deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accom-modation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided, on such upper deck, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

Dogs, etc.

17. No person shall take any animal other than a dog into or upon any car except by permission of the Conductor. No dog or other animal shall be allowed on any car in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal allowed on any car shall be carried or held on leash. Any animal other than a dog taken into or found in or on any car or any dog which in the opinion of the Conductor is offensive or an annoyance to passengers shall be removed from the car by the person in charge of such dog or other animal immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation.

Firearms.

18. No person shall enter, mount upon or remain or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may in the opinion of the Conductor be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil, injure or damage any car or the clothing of any passenger.

Interference with Officers, Signals, etc.

19. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Officer or Servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any tramway or any car, tramways waiting room or premises belonging to the Corporation and used in connection with the tramways.

No person other than the Conductor or Driver or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation shall signal a car to start or shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, switches, lights, ventilators, trolley-cords, platform chains, or any part of a car or its equipment, or without reasonable cause signal a car to stop.

No person shall wilfully in any way, obstruct, impede or interfere with a tramcar

or the traffic on the Tramways.

Disabled Cars.

20. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the Conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

Cars Proceeding to Sheds.

21. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route, unless permitted to do so by the Conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Byelaws.

23. Every Conductor and Driver of a Car and every other duly authorised Officer or Servant shall, to the best of his ability, enforce

these Byelaws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof.

Penalty.

24. Any person infringing any of the foregoing Byelaws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not exceeding ten shillings in addition to the first-mentioned penalty for every day during which such offence continues.

Byelaws and Regulations to be Placed in Cars.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, tramway station, waiting room, or shelter, a printed copy of these Byelaws and Regulations.

Commencement of Byelaws.

26. These Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of December, 1929.
