The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords

Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE ROYAL SCOTTISH MUSEUM. (UNDER THE SCOTTISH EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.)

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these Regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of twenty-six and shall as a rule not exceed the age of thirty on the 1st January in the year in which the competition is held, but in special circumstances candidates above thirty or below twenty-six may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners. Candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. The Scottish Education Department will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

4. Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the Royal Scottish Museum, who, after examining the candidates' credentials and interviewing personally any or all of the candidates, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for the posts in question to the Vice-President of the Scottish

Education Department for nomination. Candidates thus nominated shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in the Commissioners' opinion fits them for the post. ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulations applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4.—(1) The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 3 (1) (*Fifth*) of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896.

(3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of any animal described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.

SOUTHEND-ON-SEA CORPORATION.

(LIGHT RAILWAY ABANDONMENT).

ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Southend-on-Sea Corporation (Trolley Vehicles) Order, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1927") the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea (therein and hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") were authorised to provide maintain and equip trolley vehicles and to use the same upon the trolley vehicle route therein described.

And whereas it is enacted by Section 12 of the Order of 1927 (inter alia) as follows:—

"(1) At any time after the passing of this Order the Minister of Transport may by order authorise or require the Corporation to abandon or discontinue temporarily or permanently any of their light railways (for the time being) along the route of which the Corporation have provided and equipped trolley vehicles under the provisions of this Order.

(3) Any Order made under the provisions of this section may as from such date as may be specified therein provide for the cesser of all or any of the powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to any light railway to be abandoned or discontinued in pursuance of such order and may provide for the removal of the rails of such light railway from the surface of the road and for the portion of the road upon which such rails were laid to be left in good repair and condition."

And whereas the light railways authorised by the Southend-on-Sea and District Light Railways Order, 1899 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1899") were constructed by the Corporation.

And whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Section 4 of the Order of 1927 the Corporation have provided and equipped trolley vehicles along the route of the portion of light railway authorised by the Order of 1899 hereinafter described, that is to say—

Railway No. 1 (part of) commencing in Victoria Circus thence passing along Victoria Avenue and terminating at a point in West Street, Prittlewell, opposite to the north-east corner of the Blue Boar Inn.

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Transport for an order to authorise the permanent abandonment and discontinuance by them of the portion of light railway hereinbefore described.

Now therefore the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 12 of the Order of 1927 and of any and every other power thereunto him enabling hereby orders as follows:—

(1) The Corporation may and shall forthwith abandon and discontinue the portion of light railway hereinbefore described and shall with all reasonable dispatch remove the rails of the said portion of light railway from the surface of the road and leave the

portion of the road upon which such rails are laid in good repair and condition.

(2) As from the date of this order the powers and obligations of the Corporation to run services of cars on the said portion of light railway under the Order of 1899 shall cease and as from the date on which the removal of the rails of the said portion of light railway and the restoration of the road upon which the same are laid shall be duly completed all other powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed on the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to the said portion of light railway shall cease except so far as such powers liabilities duties or obligations are applicable or relate to the trolley vehicles of the Corporation.

(3) This Order may be cited as the "Southend-on-Sea Corporation (Light Railway Abandonment) Order, 1929."

WHEREAS the Commissioners for the Harbour of Maryport (hereinafter referred to as "The Harbour Commissioners") have made application to the Minister of Transport under "The Harbours, Docks and Piers (Temporary Increase of Charges) Acts, 1920 to 1922," which said Acts have been extended by the Expiring Laws Continuance Act, 1928, until the 31st December, 1931, for an Order for the modification of any Statutory Provisions regulating the charges to be made and levied in respect of the Maryport Harbour Undertaking, such Order to take effect immediately after the expiry of the Order now in force dated the 21st day of December, 1928

(Statutory Rules and Orders, 1928—No. 1073), which will cease to have effect after the 31st day of December, 1929.

1. Notice is hereby given, that the said application of the Harbour Commissioners to the Minister of Transport is for an Order under the said Harbours, Docks and Piers (Temporary Increase of Charges) Acts, 1920 to 1922, modifying the Statutory Provisions contained in the Maryport Harbour Acts, 1866 to 1894, under which the said charges are levied to the following effect, that is to say:—

(a) The Maximum Tonnage Rates for Steam Tugs and the Maximum charges for providing a Harbour Boat, authorised by Section 161 of and Schedule I. to the Maryport Improvement and Harbour Act, 1866, to be increased 33½ per centum, also providing that the Commissioners may take a minimum charge of 10s. for each Towing service.

(b) The Maximum Tonnage Rates on Vessels authorised by Section 28 of and Schedule C. to the Maryport Improvement (Harbour) Act, 1879, to be increased by 33½ per centum.

(c) The Maximum Rates on Goods authorised by Section 32 of and Schedule D. to the Maryport Improvement (Harbour) Act, 1879, to be increased by 33½ per centum.

(d) The Maximum Rates for the use of Steam Cranes, authorised by Section 34 of and Schedule E. to the Maryport Improvement (Harbour) Act, 1879, to be increased by 33½ per centum.

(e) The Maximum Tolls for the use of the Railways authorised by Section 38 of and Schedule F. to the Maryport Improvement (Harbour) Act, 1879, to be increased by 33½ per centum.

3.
