LAW REGULATING THE COMMISSION TO ADJUST THE PUBLIC INTERNAL DEBT PUBLISHED IN THE OFFICIAL GAZETTE OF 22ND MAY, 1929.

EMILIO PORTES GIL, Provisional President of the United Mexican States, to the inhabitants of Mexico:

By reason of the powers conferred on me by the Congress of the Union in the Law of January 25th, 1929, I promulgate the following regulating law:—

I. Of the Commission and its competence.

ARTICLE 1.—The Commission created by the Law of January 25th, 1929, will be called the "Commission to adjust the Public Internal Debt" and will have an office consisting of three sections: Judgment Section, Accounts Section and Administrative Section.

ARTICLE 2.—The Commission will be competent to take cognizance of all internal obligations of the Federal Government law-
