At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 5th day of *November*, 1929.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1929, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. In proviso (a) to paragraph (1) of Article 3 of the principal Order and in

proviso (b) to paragraph (1) of Article 4 of the principal Order the following words shall be omitted, namely—

"to aircraft flown for the purpose of experiment or test only, within three miles of a licensed aerodrome, a Royal Air Force aerodrome, an aerodrome under the control of the Secretary of State, or an aircraft factory, or".

2.—(1) In paragraph (1) (iii) of Article 3 of the principal Order, there shall be inserted after the word "aircraft" the words "shall be of the prescribed number and description and", and in proviso (b) to paragraph (1) of that Article there shall be inserted after the words "Condition (iii)" the words "in so far as it relates to certificates of competency and licences".

(2) The following Article shall be inserted after Article 13 of the principal Order:—

"13A.—(1) The Secretary of State may by directions prescribe the number and description of the personnel to be carried, either in all circumstances or in certain circumstances specified in the directions, by any class or description of British aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Provided that in any case where the Convention requires that an aircraft shall carry a certain number of persons of a certain description, the number of persons of that description prescribed in that case shall not

be less than the number required by the Convention."

(3) Paragraph (2) of Article 5 of the principal Order shall be omitted.

3. In paragraph (1) of Article 21 of the principal Order, there shall be inserted after the words "registration marks" the words "preceded, in the case of a signal by radio telephony, by the name of the owner of the aircraft".

4.—(1) The following provision shall be substituted for sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 9 of the Second Schedule to the principal Order:—

"(2) An aircraft, being a flying machine employed on a regular line or service of public air transport, shall not commence a flight unless the person superintending the loading of the aircraft for that flight has completed a load-sheet containing the prescribed particulars, and the said load-sheet has been submitted to and examined by the person in charge of the aircraft in order to assist him to ascertain, for the purpose of sub-paragraph (1) (c) of this paragraph, whether the aircraft is satisfactorily loaded for safety in flight."

(2) Paragraph 10 of the said Schedule shall be amended by omitting the words "or 9" and by inserting at the end thereof the following provision:—

"(2) When any load-sheet has been examined by the person in charge of an aircraft under paragraph 9 of this Schedule, the owner of the aircraft shall cause the load-sheet to be sent to him and shall keep it for six months from the date of its completion."

5. In sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 14 of Schedule IV to the principal Order, there shall be substituted for the words "constituted by its nationality letter and the last letter of its registration mark" the words "composed of the first letter and the last letter of the five-letter group constituting its nationality and registration marks".

6.—(1) Paragraph 17 of Schedule IV to the principal Order shall be amended by substituting for the words "is in distress and requires assistance" the words "is threatened by grave and imminent danger and requires immediate assistance", and by omitting the words from "When an aircraft desires to signal" to the end of the paragraph.

(2) The following paragraphs shall be inserted after paragraph 17 of Schedule IV of the principal Order:—

"17A.—(a) Where an aircraft has a message to send stating that it is in difficulties and about to land compulsorily but does not require immediate assistance, it shall preface its call sign with several repetitions of the urgency signal PAN.

(b) Where the signal PAN is received from an aircraft without any message following, it shall signify that the aircraft has been compelled to land and is unable to transmit its intended message owing to the rapidity of the landing, but does not require immediate assistance.

(c) Where the signal PAN is sent by radio-telegraphy, the three letters shall be well

separated so that the signals AN are not transformed into one signal P."

"17B. Where an aircraft has a very urgent message to send concerning the safety of the aircraft, or of any person on board, or of any ship, aircraft, vehicle or person within sight, it shall, for the purpose of indicating the urgency of the message, preface its call sign with several repetitions of the group XXX, the letters of each group being clearly separated from the letters of the successive group."

"17C. Neither the signal PAN nor the signal XXX may be transmitted except with the authority of the commander or person responsible for the aircraft."

"17D. Where an aircraft has a message to send concerning the safety of navigation or containing important information relative to meteorological warning messages, it shall preface its call sign by the safety signal, consisting of the group TTT (transmitted with the letters well separated) followed by the word DE."

7. In paragraph 48A of Schedule IV to the principal Order, the last sentence shall be omitted and the following substituted therefor:—

"Where any such directions are for the time being in force with respect to any aerodrome, there shall be placed horizontally in that aerodrome, near to the signal which indicates the direction of the wind, a red square panel, every side of which shall measure at least ten feet in length and shall be marked at night by red lights."

8. In paragraph 1 of Schedule VII to the principal Order there shall be substituted for the words "Three statute miles in all directions from Hoo Church" the words "One and seven eighths statute miles in all directions from a point situated in latitude 51° 25' 07" North, and longitude 0° 32' 06" East, of Greenwich, and being 200 yards east of Hoo Common and on the Wainscott-Hoo Road."

9.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929.

(2) The provisions of Article 1 and paragraph (3) of Article 2 of this Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty, and the other provisions of this Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the foreign State;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British Income Tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Income Tax payable in the foreign State, have the effect of law in the foreign State:

And whereas the arrangements contained in the Schedule to this Declaration have been made by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with the Imperial Japanese Government:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to the Income Tax payable under the law in force in Japan; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Schedule have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in Japan.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (Japan) Declaration, 1929."

SCHEDULE.

Article 1.

His Britannic Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom agree to take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, for exempting from income tax (including super-tax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment 1928-29, commencing on the 6th day of April, 1928, and for every subsequent year of assessment, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on with ships whose port of registry is in Japan by an individual of Japanese nationality resident in Japan and not in the United Kingdom or by a corporate body incorporated under Japanese law and managing and controlling such business in Japan.

Article 2.

The Japanese Government declare that on completion of the steps under Section 18 of the Finance Act, 1923, which under Article 1 of this Agreement His Britannic Majesty's Government have agreed to take, Law No. 6, 1924, promulgated in Japan on the 18th day of July, 1924, as amended by Law No. 6, 1928, will operate to exempt from income tax, as

also from the business profit tax, chargeable in Japan on and after the 12th day of May, 1928, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on with ships whose port of registry is in the United Kingdom by an individual of British Nationality resident in the United Kingdom, and not in Japan or by a corporate body incorporated under the laws of the United Kingdom and managing and controlling such business in the United Kingdom.

Article 3.

For the purpose of this Agreement—

The term "Japan" includes all regions under Japanese rule excluding the islands under Japanese Mandate situated in the Pacific Ocean and lying North of the Equator:

The expression "the business of shipping" means the business carried on by an owner of a ship or ships and for the purpose of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

Article 4.

This agreement shall cease to have effect if and so soon as either the relief to be granted under Article 1 hereof in respect of income tax (including super-tax) in the United Kingdom or the relief referred to in Article 2 hereof in respect of income tax and business profit tax in Japan ceases to have legal operation.

(b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the foreign State;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British Income Tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Income Tax payable in the foreign State, have the effect of law in the foreign State:

And whereas the agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Government of the Hellenic Republic:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to the Income Tax payable under the law in force in the Hellenic Republic; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said agreement between His Majesty's Government and the Government of the Hellenic Republic have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the Hellenic Republic.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (Greece) Declaration, 1929."

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE GREEK GOVERNMENT FOR THE RECIPROCAL EXEMPTION OF SHIPPING PROFITS FROM INCOME TAX, &C.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Hellenic Republic being desirous of ensuring the reciprocal exemption from income tax and trading tax in certain cases of profits accruing from the business of shipping, the following agreement has been concluded:—

Article 1.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland agree to take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, for exempting from income tax (including super-tax) chargeable in Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the year of assessment 1923-24 commencing on the 6th day of April, 1923, and for every subsequent year of assessment, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on with ships whose port of registry is in the territory of the Hellenic Republic by an individual resident in the territory of the Republic and not resident in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, or by a company managing and controlling such business in the territory of the Republic.

Article 2.

The Government of the Hellenic Republic declares that on completion of the action prescribed by Section 18 of the Finance Act, 1923, which under Article 1 of this Agreement the Government of the United Kingdom have agreed to take, the law in force in the Republic will operate to exempt from all income tax and trading tax chargeable in the Republic as from the 6th day of April, 1923, and thereafter any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on with ships whose port of registry is in Great Britain or Northern Ireland by an individual resident in Great

Britain or Northern Ireland and not resident in the territory of the Republic or by a company managing and controlling such business in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The expression "the business of shipping" means the business carried on by an owner of ships, and for the purposes of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

A ship shall be treated as having a port of registry in the territory of the Hellenic Republic, or as having a port of registry in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, during any period during which provisional certificates of registration as a Greek ship issued by Greek Consular Officers, or provisional certificates of registration as a British ship issued by British Consular Officers, as the case may be, are in force in respect of the ship; Provided in either case that the ship is immediately on the expiration of the provisional certificates registered as a Greek ship, or as a British ship, as the case may be.

Article 4.

This Agreement shall cease to have effect if and so soon as either the relief to be granted under Article 1 hereof in respect of income tax in Great Britain and Northern Ireland or the relief referred to in Article 2 hereof in respect of income tax and trading tax in the Hellenic Republic ceases to have legal operation.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the Twenty-second day of March, 1928, and known as "The Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928," His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to declare what land within Northern Rhodesia should be Crown Land and Native Reserves respectively and to confirm certain alienations of land within Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas by the said recited Order no demarcation was made of Native Reserves in the Tanganyika District of Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas the Governor appointed Commissioners on the 22nd day of July, 1927, to make recommendations with reference to the demarcation and assignment of Native Reserves in those parts of the Tanganyika District of Northern Rhodesia affected by actual or probable European settlement or by actual or probable mineral development:

And whereas the report of the said Commissioners has been duly received by the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient to add to the said recited Order in Council and to constitute Native Reserves in the Tanganyika District of Northern Rhodesia:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia Crown Lands and Native Reserves (Tanganyika District) Order in Council, 1929, and shall apply only to the Tanganyika Magisterial District as it exists at the date of the coming into operation of this Order.

2. In this Order, unless the subject or context otherwise requires, the expressions "Crown Lands" "Native Reserves" "Secretary of State" shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them by Article 2 of the Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order.

3. The lands described in the Schedule hereto and known as Native Reserves, as also the appendant rights set forth in the said Schedule, are hereby vested in the Secretary of State and set apart in perpetuity for the sole and exclusive use and occupation of the natives of Northern Rhodesia subject to the terms of Article 43 (as by the Principal Order amended) of the Northern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1924, and subject also to the following provisions:

(1) No portion of any Native Reserve shall be granted to any person other than a native save upon lease for a period not exceeding five years provided, however, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to set aside in any Native Reserve a tract or tracts of land for use as a Government Station or for other public purposes, and provided further that in any one such Reserve such tract or tracts of land shall not without the previous approval of the Secretary of State exceed in the aggregate an area of 100 acres.

(2) No person other than a native shall occupy any portion of a Native Reserve save by special permission given in accordance with such regulations as may be issued by the Governor with the approval of the Secretary of State, but special permission to occupy a tract of land set aside for use of a Government Station or for any other public purpose shall not be required in the case of a person *bona fide* engaged in the business of the Government.

(3) The Governor may with the approval of the Secretary of State make such adjustments of the boundaries of any Native Reserve as may appear to be necessary or desirable, provided always that in case of any such adjustment the area of no Native Reserve shall be materially affected or diminished thereby and on such approval being given the land excepted from a Native Reserve shall be deemed to be no longer subject to the provisions of this Order with regard to Native Reserves and the land assigned to a Native Reserve in exchange

therefor shall be deemed to be subject to the said provisions.

(4) The Governor shall remove all natives from the freehold lands of the British South Africa Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") which are outside the limits of a Native Reserve as and when the existing gardens of such natives become exhausted, or, subject to the provisions of paragraph (6) hereof, before the expiration of a period of four years from the date of the publication of this Order, whichever event shall first happen: provided that the Governor may, subject to the payment by the Company of such compensation as he thinks fit, direct the removal to a Native Reserve of any such natives at the expiration of one year after the receipt by them of notice of removal notwithstanding that their gardens have not become exhausted.

(5) Subject to the provisions contained in sub-Article (4) of this Order the Company shall be and is hereby discharged from the obligations imposed upon it by clause three of the three Certificates of Claim referred to in sub-Article (1) of Article 3 of the Principal Order.

(6) After the date of the coming into operation of this Order no new native village shall be erected on any land not within a Native Reserve, except, in the case of Crown Lands, with the consent of the Governor, or, in the case of privately-owned land, with the consent of the Governor and of the owner of the land, and after the period of four years shall have elapsed from the date aforesaid no native shall be permitted to remain on any land outside a Native Reserve: provided that, in the case of Crown Lands, with the consent of the Governor, and, in the case of privately-owned lands, with the consent of the Governor and of the owner of the land, natives may be permitted to remain on Crown Lands outside a Native Reserve until such Crown Lands are required for European settlement and on privately-owned lands outside a Native Reserve until the use of such privately-owned land is required by the owner of the land; provided further that on any Crown Lands or privately-owned lands being so required as aforesaid no compensation shall be payable to any such natives on their being removed to a Native Reserve.

Before the removal to a Native Reserve of any such natives as shall have been permitted to remain as aforesaid the Governor shall cause to be given them one year's notice of such removal.

(7) Nothing in this Order shall be so construed as to restrict the freedom of any native to accept employment from Europeans outside the limits of the Native Reserve or to remain outside the limits of a Native Reserve while so employed under such conditions as the Governor may from time to time prescribe.

(8) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Principal Order or in this Order or in any regulations from time to time made under either of them, the owners of the minerals in the Native Reserves described in the Schedule to this Order shall retain and be free to exercise their rights subject to the conditions set out in sub-Article (2) of Article 8 of the Principal Order.

4. So far as the same are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Order all the provisions of the Principal Order shall apply to the Native Reserves described in the Schedule to this Order and all regulations made under Article 7 of the Principal Order shall apply to such Native Reserves as and from the date of the coming into operation of this Order.

5. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors in Council may from time to time revoke, add to, alter or amend this Order.

6. This Order shall come into operation as and from the date of publication thereof in the Northern Rhodesian Gazette and the Governor shall give directions for the further publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

SCHEDULE.

1.—LUNGU (ZOMBE) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the mouth of the Kalambo river where it flows into Lake Tanganyika, the boundary follows the border of Tanganyika Territory and the Kalambo Falls Reserve to the source of the Nkomba stream, thence down the Nkomba stream to its junction with the Lumi stream, thence up the Lumi stream to the south-eastern corner beacon of Nakatali Farm No. T. 31, thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of that farm to the north-western beacon thereof, thence in a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the north-eastern beacon of Farm No. 10 N.E.R., now No. T. 5, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the north-western beacon thereof, thence in a straight line to the most northerly beacon of Isanya Farm No. T. 33, on the Luchenche stream, thence along the north-western boundary of that farm to the Isanya stream, thence down the Isanya stream to its junction with the Mwambezi stream, thence down the Mwambezi stream to its confluence with the Lunzua river, thence down the Lunzua river to Lake Tanganyika, thence along the Lake shore in a southerly direction to the most westerly beacon of Farm No. 14 N.E.R., now No. T. 9, Kituta, thence along the south-western, south-eastern, and north-eastern boundaries of the said farm to its most northerly beacon on Lake Tanganyika, thence along the Lake shore in a northerly direction to the point of starting.

2.—LUNGU (TAFUNA) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the mouth of the Izi river where it flows into Lake Tanganyika, the boundary follows the river and western boundary of Farm No. T. 80 to the south-western beacon thereof on the Izi river, thence up the Izi river in the Mwenda escarpment to the summit thereof, thence up the Izi river—which is called the Chirombo at this point—to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Kapondwa stream, thence down the Kapondwa stream to its junction with the Musengeshi river, thence down the Musengeshi river to its junction with the Mululwe river, thence up the Mululwe river to

its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Mpanga stream, thence down the Mpanga stream to its junction with the Musombezi stream, thence down the Musombezi stream to the Abercorn-Kasama motor-road, thence in a southerly direction along the Abercorn-Kasama motor-road to its junction with the Abercorn-Mporokoso motor-road, thence along the Mporokoso motor-road to the Wili stream, thence down the Wili stream to its junction with the Luchenche stream, thence down the Luchenche stream to the Lufu river, thence up the Lufu river to its junction with the Chalonkanda stream, thence up the Chalonkanda stream to its source on the Mporokoso motor-road, thence along the Mporokoso motor-road to the turn-off to Kapatu Mission, thence in a north-westerly direction along the watershed between the Lufu and Luangwa rivers to the source of the Chitete stream, thence down the Chitete stream to the Lufu river, thence up the Lufu river to the junction of the Mufumwe stream, thence up the Mufumwe stream to its junction with the Namukonda stream, thence up the Namukonda stream to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Namuka stream, thence down the Namuka stream to its junction with the Kalongolo river, thence down the Kalongolo river to its junction with the Chambesi river, thence down the Chambesi river to its junction with the Lufu river, thence down the Lufu river to Lake Tanganyika, thence along the Lake shore in an easterly direction to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries as defined above but excluded from the Reserve:—

Kambole Mission Farm No. 4 N.E.R., 6,017.367 acres in extent, situated on the Kambole stream.

Senga Hill Mission Farm No. T. 29, 66.127 acres in extent, situated by Mpwani Hill.

3.—LUNGU (MUKUPA) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the junction of the Chundu stream with the Luangwa river, the boundary follows the Luangwa river to its source, thence in a straight line in a southerly direction to the source of the Kafubu river, thence in a straight line to the source of the Lesser Mwelakumbi river, thence down the Lesser Mwelakumbi river to its junction with the Lukulu river, thence up the Lukulu river to its source, thence in a straight line in a northerly direction, cutting the Kalungwisi river, to the source of the Fiwale stream, thence down the Fiwale stream for five miles, thence in a straight line to the source of the Kanona stream, thence down the Kanona stream to its junction with the Lupansa river, thence in a straight line to the source of the Chundu stream, thence down the Chundu stream to the point of starting.

4.—MAMBWE (FWAMBO) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the north-eastern corner beacon of Kawimbi Mission land grant, the boundary follows the Lumi river to its junction with the Saisi river, thence up the Saisi river to the most westerly beacon of Farm No. 16 N.E.R., now No. T. 10 (Jericho), thence along the south-western boundary of that farm to the Mwambala river, thence up the Mwambala river to its junction

with the Chipila stream, thence up the Chipila stream to its junction with the Chisenga stream, thence up the Chisenga to its source, thence in a straight line to the south-eastern corner beacon of Farm No. 569, now No. T. 28, thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of that farm to the Saisi river, thence down the Saisi river to the north-easterly beacon of Itimbwe Farm No. T. 30, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the north-west corner beacon thereof, thence in a straight line to the south-west corner beacon of Farm No. 43 N.E.R., now No. T. 14, thence along the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that farm to the north-west corner beacon thereof, thence in a straight line to the most easterly beacon of Farm No. 40 N.E.R., now No. T. 13, thence in a straight line to the south-west corner beacon of Nakatali Farm No. T. 31, thence along the southern border of that farm to the south-west corner beacon of Kawimbi Mission land grant, thence along the southern and eastern boundaries of that land grant to the point of starting.

5.—MAMBWE (NSOKOLO) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the south-eastern corner beacon of Farm No. 563, now No. T. 22, the boundary follows the southern boundaries of Farms Nos. 564, now No. T. 23, 565, now No. T. 24, 566, now No. T. 25, and 567, now No. T. 26, to the Muswadzi river, thence up the Muswadzi river to its source, thence in an easterly direction along the watershed between the Saisi and Chozi rivers to the source of the Chisanzu stream, thence along the Chisanzu stream to the Chozi river, thence up the Chozi river to the junction of the Fiula stream, thence up the Fiula stream to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Tiswe stream, thence down the Tiswe stream to its junction with the Kabishya river, thence down the Kabishya river to its junction with the Munyonga (Mwanamonga) stream, thence up the Munyonga stream to its source, thence in a westerly and southerly direction along the watershed between the Kabishya and Kaonya rivers to the source of the Pambwe stream, thence down the Pambwe stream to its junction with the Kaonya river, thence down the Kaonya river to the Chambezi river, thence up the Chambezi river to the Abercorn-Kasama motor-road, thence in a northerly direction along the Abercorn-Kasama motor-road to the southern boundary of Farm No. 563, now No. T. 22, thence along the southern boundary of that farm to the point of starting.

6.—TABWA RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the northern point of Sumbu Bay the boundary follows the watershed between the Mungera stream and the Chisala stream in a westerly and southerly direction round the source of the Chikuka stream, thence in a straight line to Lake Kako cutting through the centre of that lake, thence in a southerly direction to a point on the Lufu river one mile north of the Mukotwe-Lufu confluence, thence up the Lufu river to the Mukotwe junction, thence up the Mukotwe river to the top of the Muchinga escarpment, thence along the Muchinga Range in a westerly direction to the source of the Mwambeshi river, thence down the Mwambeshi river to the Mweru marsh, thence along the eastern boundary of

the Mweru marsh to the mouth of the Chisvera river, thence up the Chisvera and, or, the Mukongi river to where it crosses the Anglo-Belgian boundary at approximately latitude $8^{\circ} 17'$ South, and longitude $30^{\circ} 13'$ East, thence along the international boundary to Cape Pungu on Lake Tanganyika, thence in a southerly direction along the Lake shore to the point of starting.

7.—WEMBA (MPOROKOSO) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the Lupupa Falls on the Mukuwe river, the boundary follows the Mukuwe river to the Chiengi District border, thence along the border of the Chiengi District to the source of the Mwambeshi river in the Muchinga escarpment, thence along the Muchinga escarpment in an easterly direction to the source of the Chitete stream, thence in an easterly and southerly direction along the watershed between the Lufu and Luangwa rivers to the Mporokoso-Abercorn motor-road at the turn-off to Kapatu Mission and near the source of the Lufu river, thence along the Abercorn-Mporokoso motor-road in an easterly direction to the source of the Luendawe stream, thence down the Luendawe stream to its junction with the Luombe river, thence down the Luombe river to its junction with the Kafubu river, thence up the Kafubu river to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Luangwa river, thence down the Luangwa river to Chimbofuma stream, thence up the Chimbofuma stream to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Itabo river, thence in a straight line to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries as defined above but excluded from the Reserve:—

Kapatu Mission Farm No. 64 N.E.R., 980 acres in extent, situated on the Chilenge stream.

Kashindu Mission Farm No. 65 N.E.R., 502.283 acres in extent, situated on the Kashindu stream.

Mporokoso Government Reserve, unsurveyed, 1,000 acres in extent, situated around Mporokoso Government Station.

8.—WEMBA (MAKASA) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the junction of the Songolwe stream with the Chamfubu river, the boundary follows the Songolwe stream to its source, thence in a northerly direction along the watershed between the Luombe and Losa rivers to the source of the Losa river, thence in a straight line to the source of the Luela stream, thence down the Luela stream to its junction with the Chambezi river, thence in a straight line to the source of the Mbu stream, thence down the Mbu stream to its junction with the Mawe stream, thence down the Mawe stream to its junction with the Kabishya river, thence up the Kabishya river to its junction with the Mikuwa stream, thence up the Mikuwa stream to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Mutumba stream, thence down the Mutumba stream to a point three miles due north of the north-eastern corner beacon of Kayambi Mission land grant, thence in a straight line to the north-eastern corner beacon of the Kayambi Mission land grant, thence along northern and western boundaries of that land grant to the Luchewe river, thence down

the Luchewe river to the Luwala swamp, thence in a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the junction of the Mifunsu stream with the Chambezi river, thence up the Chambezi river to the junction of the Chamfubu river, thence up the Chamfubu river to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries as defined above but excluded from the Reserve:—

Rosa Mission, unsurveyed, 400 acres in extent, situated on the left bank of the Losa river.

9.—WEMBA (MUWANGA) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the confluence of the Kasawira stream with the Katonga river, the boundary follows the Kasawira stream to its junction with the Vilonge stream, thence up the Vilonge stream to its source, thence in a straight line in a northerly direction to the Chirundula river, thence down the Chirundula river to its junction with the Chilunda river, thence down the Chilunda river to its junction with the Mbewa stream, thence up the Mbewa stream to its source, thence in a straight line in a southerly direction to the source of the Mansenke stream, thence down the Mansenke stream to its junction with the Vilolo stream, thence up the Vilolo stream to its source, thence in a straight line in a westerly direction to the source of the Katonga river, thence down the Katonga river to the point of starting.

10.—INAMWANGA RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the junction of the Chozi river with the Kalungu river, the boundary follows the Kalungu river to its junction with the Nakonde stream, thence up the Nakonde stream to the confluence of the Ikawa stream, thence up the Ikawa stream to the Tanganyika Territory border, thence along the Tanganyika Territory border in a westerly and northerly direction to the source of the Ntanana stream, thence down the Ntanana stream to its junction with the Nombwe stream, thence down the Nombwe stream to its junction with the Luchinde stream, thence down the Luchinde stream to its junction with the Chozi river, thence down the Chozi river to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries as defined above but excluded from the Reserve:—

Msanza Farm No. 1 N.E.R., now No. T 1, 6,372.200 acres in extent, situated at the headwaters of the Msanza stream.

Mwanzo Mission Farm No. 2 N.E.R., now No. T. 2, 3,062.359 acres in extent, situated at the headwaters of the Nakonde stream.

11.—IWA (MWENI MPANZA) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the confluence of the Miwanga stream with the Mwimbwe stream, the boundary follows the Mwimbwe stream in an easterly direction to Nyimbo Hill, thence in a northerly and westerly direction along the Nyasaland and Tanganyika Territory borders to the source of the Munsamu stream, thence down the Munsamu stream to its junction with the Miwanga stream, thence down the Miwanga stream to the point of starting.

12.—IWA (KAFWIMBI) RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the junction of the Mbewa stream with the Chirunda river, the boundary follows the Chirunda river to its junction with the Lwanga lagoon (Katonga river), thence up the centre of the Lwanga lagoon to the merging of the lagoon in the Lwanga plain, thence through the plain to its junction with the Kawanga plain or dambo, thence up the centre of the Kawanga plain until the Mwenda stream is recognisable and up the Mwenda stream to its source, thence in a straight line in an easterly direction to the source of the Chisanga stream, thence down the Chisanga stream to its junction with the Mulungwizi stream, thence down the Mulungwizi stream to its junction with the Mwangwe stream, thence in a southerly direction along the peaks of the Chisote Hills to the junction of the Nansolo stream and Kawandama river, thence up the Nansolo stream to its source, thence along the watershed between the Katonga and Kawandama rivers to the source of the Chiwonga stream, thence down the Chiwonga stream to its junction with the Kawumba stream, thence down the Kawumba stream to its junction with the Lualizi stream, thence in a straight line south-east to Chilundubwe Hill, thence in a westerly direction along the watershed between the Nkanka river and the Lualizi river to the source of the Mwitakuwiri stream, thence down the Mwitakuwiri stream to the Nkanka river, thence up the Nkanka river to its junction with the Kachinga stream, thence up the Kachinga stream to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Mitawa stream, thence down the Mitawa stream to its junction with the Kasakalambwe stream, thence down the Kasakalambwe stream to the Malalo stream, thence up the Malalo stream to its source, thence in a westerly direction to the source of the Vilolo stream, thence down the Vilolo stream to its junction with the Mansenke stream, thence up the Mansenke stream to its source, thence in a northerly direction to the source of the Mbewa stream, thence down the Mbewa stream to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries as defined above but excluded from the Reserve:—

Dell Farm No. 61 N.E.R., 3,088.530 acres in extent, situated at the headwaters of the Lungu River.

Isoka Government Reserve, unsurveyed, 1,000 acres in extent, situated around Isoka Government Station on the Isoka river.

13.—TAMBO-FUNGWE-KAMANGA RESERVE.

Boundaries.—Commencing at the junction of the Mulungwizi river with the Luangwa river, the boundary follows the Luangwa river to its junction with the Songole stream, thence up the Songole stream to its junction with the Mpembe stream, thence up the Mpembe stream to its source on the Nyasaland border, thence in a south-easterly and south-westerly direction along the Nyasaland border to the source of the Shinunu stream, thence down the Shinunu stream to its junction with the Luwumbu river, thence up the Luwumbu river to the Nkande stream, thence up the Nkande stream to its source, thence in a straight line to the source of the Kakuyu

stream, thence down the Kakuyu stream to the Mpande river, thence down the Mpande river to its junction with the Kasamba stream, thence in a straight line north to the source of the Chendela stream, thence down the Chendela stream to its junction with the Wila river, thence up the Wila river to its junction with the Chimilila stream, thence up the Chimilila stream to its source, thence in a straight line due east to the Luwuwuzi stream, thence up the Luwuwuzi stream to its source, thence in a westerly direction along the watershed between the Kawundi and Kamimbi rivers to the source of the Kasunsu stream, thence down the Kasunsu stream to its junction with the Chilumbi stream, thence down the Chilumbi stream to its junction with the Kamimbi river, thence in a straight line in a westerly direction to the junction of the Vitukutu stream with the Luangwa river, thence down the Luangwa river to the junction of the Lualizi river, thence up the Lualizi river to its junction with the Kawumba stream, thence up the Kawumba stream to its junction with the Chiwonga stream, thence up the Chiwonga stream to its source, thence in a northerly direction along the watershed between the Katonga and Kawandama rivers to the source of the Nansolo stream, thence down the Nansolo stream to its junction with the Kawandama river, thence in a north-easterly direction along the ridge of the Chisote Hills to the junction of the Mwangwe and Mulungwizi rivers, thence down the Mulungwizi river to the point of starting.

Appendant Rights.

The rights of the natives residing in the Abercorn and Isoka Districts to fish in the Chambezi, Chozi, and Kalungu rivers and in the Luanga lagoon and the swamp adjacent thereto existing at the date of the promulgation of this Order with due access for the purpose of exercising the said rights are hereby confirmed and assigned to the Secretary of State in trust for the aforesaid natives in perpetuity.

And whereas by two Orders in Council made on the recommendation of the Board of Trade and dated respectively the 10th day of February, 1915 (S.R. & O. 1915, No. 146), and the 14th day of July, 1922 (S.R. & O. 1922, No. 780), two alternative forms of Indenture of Apprenticeship to the sea fishing service were prescribed:

And whereas the Board of Trade have recommended that Indentures of Apprenticeship to the sea fishing service of boys not under the age of sixteen years shall be either in the form prescribed by the said Order in Council dated the 10th day of February, 1915, or in the form prescribed by the said Order in Council dated the 14th day of July, 1922, or in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the power vested in Him by the said recited Act and of all other powers in that behalf on the recommendation of the Board of Trade and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order and prescribe that Indentures of Apprenticeship to the sea fishing service of boys not under the age of sixteen years made on and after the 5th day of November, 1929, shall be either in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto and contain the covenants, provisions, stipulations, endorsements and certificates therein mentioned or in the form prescribed by the said Order in Council dated the 10th day of February, 1915, and contain the covenants, provisions, stipulations, endorsements and certificates therein mentioned or in the form prescribed by the said Order in Council dated the 14th day of July, 1922, and contain the covenants, provisions, stipulations, endorsements and certificates therein mentioned.

WITNESSETH as follows:—

(1) The Deck-boy binds himself apprentice to the Owner as a Deck-boy on board any steam trawler owned or managed by the Owner for a period of three years from the date hereof subject to a probationary period of one month.

(2) During the said period the Deck-boy shall faithfully serve the Owner and Master of the vessel in which the Deck-boy may be employed from time to time and obey the lawful commands of the Owner and the Master and keep the secrets of the Owner and when required give true accounts of the Owner's moneys which may come into his hands. The Deck-boy shall not do any damage to the Owner's property and shall, if possible, prevent such damage and give timely warning thereof, nor shall he waste or otherwise wrongfully deal with the goods

of the Owner nor frequent taverns or ale-houses and he shall not absent himself from the Owner's service without leave.

(3) The Owner shall use all proper means to teach the Deck-boy or cause him to be taught the business of a seaman and fisherman and during the period of service the Deck-boy shall spend ashore for the purpose of advanced Technical Training at a local Technical School (if any) a period of two trips per annum in the case of trawlers fishing distant waters, and three trips per annum in the case of trawlers fishing home waters, and the Deck-boy shall regularly attend such Technical School, if any.

(4) The Owner shall during the said period provide the Deck-boy when at sea with sufficient food, medicine, medical and surgical assistance and necessaries.

(5) The Owner shall pay to the Deck-boy remuneration at the rate of
per day for the first year;
per day for the second year, and
per day for the third year.

(6) The Owner may provide for the Deck-boy a commencing outfit of the necessary sea clothes or kit not exceeding in cost the sum of £5 and the cost of such outfit, if provided, may be deducted by the Owner by weekly instalments from the remuneration due to the Deck-boy. If the Deck-boy shall complete the whole period of service under this Indenture the original cost of the kit if so deducted shall be refunded to the Deck-boy by the Owner.

(7) The Owner or his duly authorised Agent shall attend with the Deck-boy before the Superintendent of the nearest Mercantile Marine Office of the Board of Trade (hereinafter called the "Superintendent") within twenty-eight days after the expiration of the probationary period before referred to or if they, or either of them, are or is at sea during that time then immediately on return to port in order that the Superintendent may consider whether this Indenture should remain in force.

(8) If the Superintendent at the expiration of the probationary period or at any time during the continuance of the term of apprenticeship is of opinion after giving the owner (or his Agent) and the Deck-boy the opportunity of being heard that in all the circumstances of the case it will not be desirable in the interests of the Deck-boy to allow this Indenture to remain in force

Then the Superintendent shall have power to cancel and determine this Indenture from such date and upon such terms and conditions as the Superintendent may deem to be just and proper in all the circumstances of the case and shall thereupon certify the same by endorsement on this Indenture and the Certificate shall take effect according to its terms and be binding on the Deck-boy and the Owner.

(9) If the Owner by reason of his ceasing to own any steam-trawler or for any other reason is unable to provide the Deck-boy with such service as is contemplated by this Indenture, the apprenticeship may with the written consent of the Superintendent endorsed hereon be determined, or, in the alternative, the apprenticeship may with the consent of the Deck-boy and of the Superintendent, be transferred by the Owner to some other steam-

trawler owner by a writing to that effect endorsed hereon and signed by the Owner, the Deck-boy, the Superintendent and the transferee, and after such transfer all the provisions of this Indenture shall apply in the same way, so far as may be, as if the transferee had been named in this Indenture in the place of the Owner throughout.

(10) Breaches of Agreement or discipline alleged to have been committed by the Deck-boy during the period of service shall not be taken before any Court for adjudication unless and until the Superintendent shall have enquired into and adjudicated upon the same or shall have declined to do so.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Henry Luke, Lord Bishop of Chester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—

"1. The portion of the Parish of Stoak (otherwise Stoke) which lies between the

westerly boundaries of the extra Parochial places of Great Stanney and Stanlow and the eastern boundary of the New Parish of Christ Church Ellesmere Port and is within the Urban District of Ellesmere Port and Whitby may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Stoak in the Diocese of Chester to which it belongs and together with the said Extra Parochial Place of Stanlow and part of the Extra Parochial Place of Great Stanney which are also within the said Urban District be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said New Parish of Christ Church Ellesmere Port in the said Diocese because the area so to be united is distant more than a mile and a half from the Parish Church of the agricultural Parish of Stoak and is being rapidly developed as a part of the town of Ellesmere Port and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said area will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by such union.

2. The Townships of Croughton and Wervin having an area of one thousand and twenty-four acres which are detached purely agricultural portions of the Parish of St. Oswald Chester distant more than two miles from the Parish church of the said Parish may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Saint Oswald Chester to which they belong and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Stoak in the said Diocese to which they are contiguous so that the spiritual care of the Inhabitants of the said Townships will thereby be more conveniently and effectually provided for.

"That pursuant to the directions of the Twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1887, we have drawn up in writing a Scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we submit the same to your Grace together with our Consent in writing and also the Consents in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices to be affected to the intent that your Grace may if you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such Consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"1. It is proposed that the portion of the Parish of Stoak (otherwise Stoke) which lies between the westerly boundary of the Extra Parochial Places of Great Stanney and Stanlow and the eastern boundary of the New Parish of Christ Church Ellesmere Port shall be separated from the said Parish of Stoak and together with the said Extra Parochial Place of Stanlow and part of the Extra Parochial Place of Great Stanney (all which Area is edged green on the accompanying plan and contains a population of approximately two thousand) be annexed to and united with

the said New Parish of Christ Church Ellesmere Port in the said Diocese of Chester for Ecclesiastical purposes.

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said Area in the Parish Church of the New Parish of Christ Church Ellesmere Port and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said Area shall belong to the Incumbent of the said New Parish of Christ Church Ellesmere Port.

"That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe lands, Tithes or Tithe Rent Charges, Compositions in lieu of Tithes Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes affected by this alteration nor in respect to Patronage.

"That the Inhabitants of the said Area shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said New Parish of Christ Church Ellesmere Port to which it is proposed that the said Area shall be annexed and in common with the Parishioners of that New Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Stoak (otherwise Stoke) from which it shall be separated except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any Pews or Seats in the last mentioned Church and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"2. It is also proposed that the District comprising the Townships of Croughton and Wervin containing one thousand and twenty-four acres with a total population of one hundred and twenty delineated on the accompanying plan and thereon respectively edged blue and green shall be separated from the Parish of Saint Oswald Chester in the Diocese of Chester to which it belongs and be annexed to and united with the Parish of Stoak (otherwise Stoke) in the said Diocese of Chester for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said District in the Parish Church of Stoak and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said District shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Stoak (otherwise Stoke).

COUNTY OF THE ISLE OF WIGHT.

(d) During the period of five years from the date on which the Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven any mechanically-propelled vehicle on the highways specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

II. Nothing in the Order contained shall prevent the driving on the highways specified in the First and Second Schedules hereto (in this Article referred to as "the said highways") of:—

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said highways or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said highways; or

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said highways, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said highways of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

III. So much of the County of the Isle of Wight Roads (Restriction) Order, 1927, as relates to the highways in the Urban District of Shanklin specified in the First Schedule to that Order is hereby revoked, and that Order shall be read and have effect accordingly."
