The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Ernest, Baron Hanworth, Master of the Rolls, has, in exercise of the power conferred upon him by the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1877, and the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1898, made an additional Rule for the disposal of documents which are not considered of sufficient public value to justify their preservation in the Public Record Office:

And whereas all the conditions in regard to the said Additional Rule which are required to be fulfilled by the said Acts have been fulfilled:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said Additional Rule (a copy whereof is hereto annexed) into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and doth hereby declare, His approbation of the same.

Additional Rule for the Disposal of Documents which are not considered of sufficient Public Value to justify their Preservation in the Public Record Office.

I, the Right Honourable Ernest, Baron Hanworth, Master of the Rolls, in the exercise of

the powers conferred upon me by the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1877, and the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1898, do, with the approval of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, hereby add to the 13th Rule of the Rules made by the Right Honourable William, Baron Esher, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 30th day of June, 1890, as amended by the Rule made by the Right Honourable Sir Herbert Hardy Cozens-Hardy, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 4th day of June, 1908, by inserting after the words, "any of His Majesty's Colonies", the words "or in the case of income accounts of Trustees by Transfer or return thereof to such Trustees or their successors." 19 March, 1929.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of May, 1884, Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, in exercise of the power given to Her by an Act of the
