

Legislature of the Island of Jamaica passed in a Session holden in the 29th year of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to amend an Act passed in the present Session entitled, An Act to alter and amend the Political Constitution of this Island," and by an Act of Parliament passed in the same year of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to make provision for the Government of Jamaica," constituted a Legislative Council for Jamaica:

And whereas by the said Order Her Majesty reserved to Herself, Her heirs and successors, power, with the advice of Her or their Privy Council, to revoke, alter, or amend the said Order as to Her or them should seem fit:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the eleventh clause of the said Order:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers given to His Majesty by the said Acts, and of the powers reserved to His Majesty by the said Order, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1. The said Order in Council of the nineteenth day of May, 1884, is hereby amended by the insertion at the end of the first paragraph of the eleventh clause thereof of the following proviso:—

"Provided that the performance of the duties of any office of emolument under the Crown or under the Government of Jamaica, in the absence or incapacity of the substantive holder thereof, but without receipt of any pay therefor, shall not be, and shall be deemed never to have been, the acceptance of such office within the meaning of this clause."

2. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Jamaica Gazette.

3. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His heirs and successors, power, with the advice of His or their Privy Council, to revoke alter or amend this Order as to Him or them shall seem fit.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
