TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 6th December, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 9th December, 1929, to Saturday, the 14th December, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on

the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

COFFIN FURNITURE AND CEREMENT MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS IN THE CEREMENT MAKING SECTION OF THE TRADE FOR SPECIAL PERIODS NOT DEPENDENT UPON THE COST-OF-LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

This notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 21st April, 1927, the Coffin Furniture and Cere-ment Making Trade Board (Great Britain) established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that, seeing that the specified period of operation of the minimum rates of wages set out in the Trade Board's Notice U. (24), dated 27th March, 1929, will expire on the 31st March, 1930, they again PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Cerement Making Section of the trade which are set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice U. (16) issued by the Trade Board and dated 2nd December, 1924, and which would, unless varied by the Trade Board, be effective on and after 1st April, 1930, BY PROVIDING THAT the minimum rates of wages set out in the Trade Board's Notice U. (24), dated 27th March, 1929, for the periods 1st April to 30th September, 1929, and 1st October, 1929, to 31st March, 1930, respectively, shall be continued in operation for the corresponding six-monthly periods 1st April to 30th September, 1930, and 1st October, 1930, to 31st March, 1931.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 29th day of November, 1929. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Coffin Furniture and Cerement Making Trade Board (Great Britain), at 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

Further Contraction of Sussex Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 32) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 35), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

4.—(1) The animals on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 3 (1) (Fifth) of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896.

(3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of any animal described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.
