## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th December, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th December, 1929, to Saturday, the 21st December, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

**DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS  
ACTS 1877 TO 1927.**

**WART DISEASE OF POTATOES (AMENDMENT)  
ORDER OF 1929.**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts 1877 to 1927.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the planting in any allotment, of which the area does not exceed  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre, or in any private garden situate within the area described in the Schedule to the Order, of any potatoes which are not of an approved immune variety and which were not inspected whilst growing, and certified as true to type and reasonably free from rogues. Exceptions from this requirement are made in respect of potatoes of five non-immune varieties specified in the Order, and of potatoes of immune varieties saved from the crop grown on the same land in the previous year, and, before the 30th June 1930, of any potatoes saved from the crop grown on the same land in 1929.

An Inspector of the Ministry may, by notice in writing, require the removal of any potatoes planted in contravention of the Order.

The area described in the Schedule to the Order comprises the administrative County of Lincoln (Parts of Holland) including the Borough of Boston; the Petty Sessional Division of Wisbech and the Borough of Wisbech

in the administrative County of the Isle of Ely; and the Petty Sessional Division of Freebridge Marshland and the Borough of King's Lynn in the administrative County of Norfolk.

Article 18 of the Wart Disease of Potatoes Order of 1923, with which the present Order is to be read as one, is amended to provide for a penalty not exceeding £50 in respect of a second or subsequent offence against either Order.
