

Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an Order to apply to all factories and workshops in which the manufacture of Portland Cement or cement of a similar character is carried on.

Copies of the draft Order may be obtained on application to the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Any objection to the proposed Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, within thirty days after the date of this notice. The objection must be in writing and must state:—

- (a) the requirements in the draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the modifications asked for.

Where an objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if the objection is made by an association of occupiers on behalf of its members, the number of the members affected by the Order.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that he has made (1) an Order under Sections 107 and 108 of the above-mentioned Act applying the provisions of those sections (relating to lists of out-workers and to employment in unwholesome premises) to the manufacture of lampshades other than lampshades made wholly of metal or glass or stone, and (2) an Order under Section 116 of the same Act (requiring particulars of work or wages to be given to piece-workers), applying the provisions of that Section, with modifications, to the aforesaid industry.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

HOLLOW-WARE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR WORKERS NEWLY BROUGHT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE TRADE BOARD BY THE TRADE BOARDS (HOLLOW-WARE TRADE, GREAT BRITAIN) (CONSTITUTION AND PROCEEDINGS) REGULATIONS, 1928.

The Hollow-Ware Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued a Notice, dated 12th December, 1929, setting out minimum rates of wages for workers newly brought within the scope of the Trade Board by the Trade Boards (Hollow-Ware Trade, Great Britain) (Constitution and Proceedings) Regulations, 1928, which have been fixed to take effect under an Order of the Minister of Labour as from 16th December, 1929. The Notice also sets out all the rates at present effective in the Trades which have not been varied.
