

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Saint Giles in the Fields shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Saint Giles in the Fields shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Wilfred Harold Davies if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in Christ Church, Endell Street, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Giles in the Fields but the marriage registers in duplicate current at Christ Church, Endell Street, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect Christ Church, Endell Street, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which such Church shall be built, and towards the endowment of such Church and District.

(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of Christ Church, Endell Street, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of Christ Church, Endell Street, as aforesaid.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields.

"7. That upon the union taking effect the endowment fund now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Endell Street, Christ Church, shall be divided and apportioned as follows that is to say (a) a portion of such fund sufficient to produce an income of £50 per annum shall be held and accumulated by the said Governors for and towards the endowment of the hereinbefore mentioned proposed new Church and District and (b) the remainder of such fund shall be held by the said Governors for the benefit of the United Benefice but the income arising therefrom shall be applicable only towards the cost of providing clerical or lay assistance for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of Christ Church, Endell Street, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of Christ Church, Endell Street, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both House of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and
