

thence north eastward along the middle of Filton Avenue for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cambourne Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Cambourne Road for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wordsworth Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Wordsworth Road for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the fence which divides the house and premises known as Number 120 Wordsworth Road from the house and premises known as Number 122 Wordsworth Road, and extending thence eastward to and along such fence for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the fence forming the western boundary of the Bristol and South Wales Union Line of the Great Western Railway, and extending thence eastward in a straight line across the said line of railway for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the south western corner of the close numbered 1317 upon the above mentioned maps, and extending thence first eastward, then north eastward, and then again eastward along the fences forming the southern and eastern boundaries of the said close numbered 1317 and the fences forming the southern boundaries of the closes numbered 1319 and 1320 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 18½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence reaches the north western side of Lockleaze Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then north eastward along the middle of Lockleaze Lane for a distance in all of 16 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 1321 upon the said maps, and extending thence first eastward to such fence and then first north westward then northward and then south eastward along the fences forming the southern and eastern boundaries of the last mentioned close and the southern boundary of the close numbered 1323 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 16½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Horfield from the said Parish of Stapleton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 21st day of November, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Egham, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Egham is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Egham which is herein-after mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such church is named 'The Church of Saint Jude, Englefield Green':

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £2,000 towards providing an endowment for the said proposed District or New Parish:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £250 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish so soon as the Minister or Incumbent shall have been duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £250 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us
