PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 54 of the Companies Act, 1929, it is provided that where any shares of a company are issued for the purpose of raising money to defray the expenses of the construction of any works or buildings or the provision of any plant which cannot be made profitable for a lengthened period the company may pay interest on so much of that share capital as is for the time being paid up for the period and subject to the conditions and restrictions in that Section mentioned and may charge the sum so paid by way of interest to capital as part of the cost of construction of the work or building or the provision of plant provided that inter alia the rate of interest shall in no case exceed 4 per cent. per annum or such other rate as may for the time being be pre-scribed by Order in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty in pursuance of

Now, therefore, His Majesty in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the said Section 54 Sub-section (1) and all other powers enabling Him in that behalf by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to prescribe and doth hereby prescribe as follows:—

(1) The rate of interest to be paid on any shares of a company and charged to capital

in pursuance of the powers conferred by Sub-section (1) of Section 54 of the Companies Act, 1929, shall in no case exceed 6 per cent. per annum.

(2) This Order may be cited as "The Companies (Interest out of Capital) Order, 1929."

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 17th day of October, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and of the New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, both in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 12th day of February, 1876, and published in the London Gazette on the 29th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Holdenhurst, in the Parish of Christchurch, in the said County and Diocese, and the said District Chapelry was named The District Chapelry of Saint John

the Evangelist, Holdenhurst

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 21st day of January, 1914, and published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Alban, situate within the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Bournemouth, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Alban, Bournemouth ':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and of the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, should be altered in the manner which

is hereinafter mentioned:
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the
Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and of the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

'THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, in the same County

Diocese, being:-

"All that isolated portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, upon the north by the District of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and upon the south east by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, both in the said County and Diocese."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or

Representation have been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patron and Incumbents have, with the exception hereinafter mentioned, respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, has not signified his assent to the said

Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patron and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in

Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE JUNIOR GRADE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS.

Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of | ing subjects. The 22 and must not have attained the age of 24 against each subject.

on the first day of August in the year in which the Examination is held.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

- (a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.
- (b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.
- 2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—
 - (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
 - (b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.
 - (c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the Examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

6. The auxiliary language in Section A or Section C will be tested by means of translation from the language. The following languages may be offered: French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, Russian, Latin, Ancient Greek

No Candidate may offer any language twice in the Examination.

No Candidate may offer in Sections A and C together two languages of the group Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or two of the group Norwegian, Swedish, Danish.

Only a Candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary language.

- 7. In subjects 50 to 65 the civilization subject associated with a language can only be taken by Candidates who offer the language itself for examination in Section B.
- 8. A Candidate desiring to offer subject 24 or any of the subjects 31 to 43 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Astronomy (29), Geography (44), the Physical Anthropology branch of Special Anthropology (46), and Agriculture (47), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.
- 9. From the marks assigned to Candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

10. Moreover, Candidates whose handwriting is not easily legible will suffer a further deduction of marks on that account.

- 11. Application for permission to attend one of these Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.
- 12. A fee of £8 will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.
- 13. Out of the list resulting from each

Examination will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified):—

- (a) All the vacancies in the Junior Grade of the Administrative Class which may have been reported to the Civil Service Commissioners up to the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination;
- (b) Any additional vacancies occurring within six months from the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination, which the Head of the Department may desire to have so filled.

The assignment by the Civil Service Commissioners of successful Candidates will be made with due regard to the requirements of the situation to be filled. Subject to this condition, Candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, among the vacancies (a) for which they are duly qualified; or they may elect to wait for the chance of a vacancy (b). When vacancies (b) occur, they will be offered in rotation to the qualified Candidates then on the list, who will be free to decline them without forfeiting their claim to subsequent vacancies (b).

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London in 1930, under the foregoing Regulations. The viva voce test will take place in July, the written examination in Section B subjects will begin on the 25th July, and that in Section A subjects on the 1st

August.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 8th May, 1930, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT WHICH IS TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME EMPLOYMENT.

- (c) All employment in excess of 41 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated

(d) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week.

2. Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 54, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall

be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 54.

- 3. For the purpose of Clause 2 above, a worker shall be deemed to be a "whole-time" worker after he has been employed regularly by the employer for eight consecutive weeks.
- 4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.
- 5. These rates shall continue in operation until 25th December, 1930.
- 6. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment the Derbyshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 30th January, 1925, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

- 6. The Registrar of the existing Bilston Sub-district shall be the Registrar of that Sub-district as extended by this Order.
- 7. The Registrar of the existing Wolverhampton Western Sub-district shall be the Registrar of the Wolverhampton South Subdistrict as constituted by this Order.
- 8. The Registrar of the existing Willenhall. Sub-district shall be the Registrar of the Wolverhampton North sub-district as constituted by this Order.
