

be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 54.

3. For the purpose of Clause 2 above, a worker shall be deemed to be a "whole-time" worker after he has been employed regularly by the employer for eight consecutive weeks.

4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. These rates shall continue in operation until 25th December, 1930.

6. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment the Derbyshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 30th January, 1925, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

All employment on a Sunday.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

The Derbyshire Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order define the following benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) as the benefits or advantages which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash and the values at which they are to be reckoned for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Derby which, for the purposes of the said Act, shall be deemed to include the county borough of Derby:—

1.—(a) *Cottage*, including any garden provided with the cottage except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

3s. per week less any rent or rates paid by the occupier, provided as follows:—

In the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee, on an application by or on behalf of a worker, have certified that by reason of inadequate accommodation, want of repair or sanitation or lack of water supply, the value of such cottage is less than 3s. per week, the value shall be such sum less than 3s. per week as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the defects, less any rates or rent paid by the occupier.

(b) New Milk 1s. 4d. per gallon.

(c) Board (including any meals, but not including intoxicating drink) and lodging, except in any case in which the Committee may determine that the lodging accommodation is so defective as to be injurious to health:—

2. In pursuance of their said powers the said Committee hereby order that except as in this Order provided, no benefit or advantage shall be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash.

3. This Order shall come into force on 26th December, 1929, and shall remain in operation until 25th December, 1930.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 40).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-
