WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29; 4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 18; 9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 80; and 18 Geo. 5, c. 3), it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council apply the said Section to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom in like manner as to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state and that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts, it is provided *inter alia* that where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of any British possession has made satis-

factory provision for the protection of inventions, designs or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of the said Section to that Possession, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order:

And whereas the laws of Trinidad and Tobago confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Trinidad and Tobago or the territorial waters thereof corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the said Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928:

And whereas it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of Trinidad and Tobago has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs and trade marks, patented or registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1907 (S.R. & O. 1907 (No. 652), p. 777), His late Majesty King Edward VII was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, should apply to Trinidad and Tobago, and it is expedient on the making of this Order that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all others powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His
