TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 17th January, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 20th January, 1930, to Saturday, the 25th January, 1930 inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

PROPOSAL TO FIX AND TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN CERTAIN AREAS FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE WORKERS IN SUCH AREAS.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE GENERAL AND LEVANT CONSULAR SERVICES, TO STUDENT INTERPRETERSHIPS IN THE FAR EAST, AND TO POSTS IN THE INTELLIGENCE OFFICER GRADE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF OVERSEAS TRADE.

1. Candidates will be required to appear before a Board of Selection which will meet at the Office of the Civil Service Commission on the second Tuesday in May, and will decide which candidates possess suitable qualifications for entry into the General, Levant and Far Eastern branches of the Consular Services, and to posts in the Intelligence Officer Grade in the Department of Overseas Trade, in order to enable them to compete at the examination prescribed below. Candidates may appear before this Board at any time after they have attained the age of nineteen; but a candidate who is not recommended for acceptance by the Board of Selection may not appear before that Board for interview a second time unless he is specifically notified after his first appearance that the Board will be prepared to see him again.

2.—(i) Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 24 on the first day of August in the year in which the Examination is held.

(ii) Candidates for appointment to the General and Levant Consular Services and to Student Interpreterships in the Far East must be unmarried.

3. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case they can be allowed to compete by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, provided they fulfil the conditions of the rule in respect of nationality prescribed for candidates for admission to His Majesty's Civil Service as a whole, viz.:—

“Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.”

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. The Examination will include the following subjects. The numerical value is shown against each subject.

(c) Only a candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary language.

9. In subjects 50 to 65 the civilization subject associated with a language can only be taken by candidates who offer the language itself for examination in Section B.

10. A Candidate desiring to offer subject 24 or any of the subjects 31 to 43 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Astronomy (29), Geography (44), the Physical Anthropology branch of Special Anthropology (46), and Agriculture (47), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.

11. From the marks assigned to Candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

12. Moreover, if a Candidate's handwriting is not easily legible, a further deduction will, on that account, be made from the total marks otherwise accruing to him.

13. Application for permission to attend one of these Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

14. A fee of £8 will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.

**SHEEP SCAB (AMENDMENT) ORDER
OF 1930.**

—

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf hereby orders as follows:—

Power to slaughter ownerless sheep.

1.—(1) Where any sheep being affected with or suspected of Sheep Scab are required to be dealt with by detention, isolation and treatment in accordance with the provisions of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order"), and the owner of such sheep cannot be traced, the Local Authority may cause such sheep to be slaughtered on the premises where the sheep are or to be moved to the nearest available slaughterhouse for the purpose under the supervision of an Inspector or other Officer of the Local Authority, who shall enforce and superintend the immediate slaughter of the sheep thereat and report the slaughter to the Local Authority. The carcase of any such sheep shall be sold by the Local Authority and the sum received by them for the carcase, after deducting reasonable expenses for slaughter and sale, shall be payable on demand to the owner of the sheep.

(2) Sheep dealt with under this Article which are affected with or show clinical signs of being affected with Sheep Scab shall not be moved along a highway, road or lane except in a float, cart or van, which shall immediately after being used for such purpose be cleansed and disinfected in the manner described in Article 11 of the Principal Order.

Precautions to be taken by persons clipping or dipping sheep on infected premises.

2. Any person who clips or dips sheep on any place where there are sheep affected with or suspected of Sheep Scab shall wear overalls, and shall before he clips or dips sheep on any other premises—

(a) remove all wool, dung and soil from his boots or leggings (if worn) and then dis-

infect them by immersion in or thorough sponging with an approved sheep dip or an approved disinfectant,

(b) disinfect his overalls with an approved sheep dip or an approved disinfectant, and

(c) remove all wool from clippers or other instruments used in clipping and then disinfect them with an approved sheep dip or an approved disinfectant.

Labels to be affixed to approved Sheep Dips.

3. Article 31 (*Labels to be affixed to approved Sheep Dips*) of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the following article is hereby substituted therefor:—

"31.—(1) Every package or other receptacle containing an approved sheep dip shall, before being placed on sale or delivered to a purchaser, be clearly and distinctly marked by the manufacturer or vendor thereof with a label in a form approved by the Minister. Such label shall state the dilution at which the sheep dip is approved by the Minister, and shall certify that the contents of the package or receptacle are of the same quality and composition as the sample submitted to the Government Chemist for examination and upon which the Minister's approval is based.

(2) If any sheep dip which has not been approved by the Minister is falsely labelled with a statement or indication that it has been so approved, or if any sheep dip purporting to be an approved sheep dip is not marked with a label as required by this Article the manufacturer and the retailer or other person selling the dip and the person who shall have so marked the dip or caused it to be so marked, knowing the same to have been falsely marked, or omitting so to mark the dip, as the case may be, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894."

Commencement.

4. This Order (except Article 3) shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and thirty. Article 3 shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

Short Title and Construction.

5. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP SCAB (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1930, and shall be read as one with the Principal Order.

20. To empower the Company to subscribe for or acquire and hold or dispose of or to guarantee the payment of dividends or interest on shares, stock, mortgages, debentures, debenture stocks or other securities of other companies, authorities or bodies.

21. To empower the Company to purchase additional lands by agreement, to sell or lease any lands vested in or acquired by them and to adapt lands for the purpose of sports or recreation grounds for employees and to erect and maintain dressing-rooms and other buildings and conveniences.

22. To amend in their application to the Company and their undertaking all or some of the provisions of the Gas Regulation Act 1920, with regard to the definition and testing of the calorific value of gas supplied by the Company in cases where the whole or part of the moisture contained in such gas has been extracted by any process.

23. To make new or further provisions as to the prevention of improper use of gas, the notice to be given by gas consumers before removing, and for the discontinuance of a supply of gas, the giving of a supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply, the provision of valves where high pressure air or gas not supplied by the Company is used, the entry on premises to which a supply of gas is laid on, the power of the Company to refuse to supply persons in debt for other premises, and the period of error in defective meters.

24. To enable the Company to make and recover charges for the special reading of meters.

25. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

27. To incorporate with the Order, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable all, or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, the Gasworks Clauses Act 1871, the Lands Clauses Acts and the Companies Clauses Acts 1845 and 1863.
