The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to present The Rev. Edward Rhodes to the Rectory of St. Mary the Virgin, Pulham, in the County of Norfolk and Diocese of Norwich, void by the resignation of the last Incumbent and in His Majesty's Gift in full right.

The KING has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Magdalen Blanche Gillilan, wife of Hugh Percy Gillilan, Esquire, Captain (retired) in the Army, and Rosamond Mary Cary, wife of Robert Archibald Cary, Esquire, sometime a Lieutenant 4th Dragoon Guards, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the younger daughters of a Viscount as would have been due to them if their father, Alfred Nathaniel Curzon, had survived his brother, George Nathaniel Marquess Curzon of Kedleston and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Viscount Scarsdale.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 24th January, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 27th January, 1930, to Saturday, the 1st February, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
