"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Eastleach Martin with Eastleach Turville and Southrop duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended the union

of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Eastleach Martin with Eastleach Turville and Southrop are at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Eastleach Martin with Eastleach Turville, and the said Benefice of Southrop shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Eastleach with Southrop' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Eastleach Martin with Eastleach Turville shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Southrop shall have the first and the third turns and the alternate Patrons of the said Benefice of Eastleach Martin with Eastleach Turville shall have the second and fourth turns in the same order as between such alternate Patrons as they are now entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice of Eastleach Martin with Eastleach Turville.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly

published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ripon has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that such Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

"We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Rodbourne Cheney and partly out of the New Parish of Swindon New Town, both in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney and the said New Parish of Swindon New Town are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney and of the said New Parish of Swindon New Town which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Bristol for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney and of the said New Parish of Swindon New Town which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Saints, Swindon.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints, Swindon, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Rodbourne Cheney, in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the west and upon the south west by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Swindon, upon the south by the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Swindon New Town, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, Swindon, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, Swindon, from the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney, at the point where the boundary of the Municipal Borough of Swindon crosses the middle of the stream known as Hreod Burna, and extending thence first north

westward and then in various directions along the middle of Hreod Burna for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the fence which divides the close numbered 335 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Rodbourne Cheney published in the year 1923 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the Map of Plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 336 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward then westward and then again southward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 335 and the close numbered 334 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 336 and the close numbered 366 upon the same maps for a distance of 231 chains or thereabouts to the boundary of the said Municipal Borough of Swindon, and extending thence westward along the said Municipal Borough Boundary for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Swindon.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Swindon New Town which is bounded upon the north partly by the above described portion of the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney and partly by the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, Swindon, upon the east by the Parish of Swindon, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Swindon from the said New Parish of Swindon New Town at the junction of Cricklade Road with the roadway leading along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Beatrice Street, and extending thence first westward and then south westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whitehouse Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Whitehouse Road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Swindon New Town from the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

Whereas under Section 10 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, the Registrar-General, with the approval of the Minister of Health, may unite any two or more unions into one superintendent registrar's district;

And whereas under Section 11 of that Act the Registrar-General may with the like approval divide any superintendent registrar's district into two or more superintendent registrars' districts;

And whereas under Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Minister of Health, may from time to time

alter registration sub-districts;

And whereas the Greenwich Union comprises the Metropolitan Borough of Deptford and part of the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich, the Woolwich Union comprises the remainder of the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich and part of the Metropolitan Borough of Woolwich, and the Lewisham Union comprises the Metropolitan Borough of Lewisham and the remainder of the Metropolitan Borough of Woolwich;

And whereas it is expedient that each of the said Metropolitan Boroughs should be constituted a separate superintendent registrar's

district:

And whereas the Deptford East Sub-district in the Greenwich Union is situate partly in the Metropolitan Borough of Deptford and partly in the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich and it is expedient that the boundaries of certain sub-districts adjoining that Sub-district should be altered as in this Order provided;

Now, therefore, I, Sylvanus Percival Vivian, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1929, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Deptford, Greenwich, Lewisham and Woolwich (Registration of Births &c.) Order, 1930, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1930.

2. The Greenwich, Lewisham and Woolwich Unions shall be united into one superintendent registrar's district and the district so formed shall be divided into four superintendent registrars' districts co-extensive respectively with the Metropolitan Boroughs

of Deptford, Greenwich, Lewisham and Woolwich.

3. The superintendent registrars' districts constituted under Article 2 of this Order shall be called respectively the Deptford Registration District, the Greenwich Registration District, the Lewisham Registration District and the Woolwich Registration District, the name in each case corresponding with the name of the Metropolitan Borough with which the Registration District is coextensive.

4.—(1) The present Deptford North Subdistrict shall cease to exist.

(2) The Deptford East Sub-district shall be altered so as to consist of the following wards of the Metropolitan Borough of Deptford, viz., Canterbury, Clifton, Deptford Park, Evelyn, Hatcham, St. Pauls and Vale, and shall be re-named the Deptford North Sub-district.

(3) The Deptford South Sub-district shall be altered so as to consist of the following wards of the Metropolitan Borough of Deptford, viz., Pepys, St. Catherine's, St. John's,

St. Peter's and Town Hall.

(4) The part of the Deptford East Subdistrict now in the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich shall be added to and form part of the Greenwich West Sub-district in the Greenwich Registration District.

(5) The Registrar of the existing Deptford East Sub-district shall be the Registrar of the Deptford East Sub-district as altered and renamed the Deptford North Sub-dis-

trict by this Order.

(6) The Registrar of the existing Deptford South Sub-district shall be the Registrar of that Sub-district as altered by this Order.

(7) The Registrar of the existing Greenwich West Sub-district shall be the Registrar of that Sub-district as extended by this Order.
