# FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 TO 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he proposes to make new Regulations under Section 79 of the Act, in substitution for

the Regulations dated April 26, 1919, to apply to all factories and workshops, or parts thereof, in which the processes of handling, moving, breaking, crushing, grinding or sieving of refractory material containing not less than 80 per cent. total silica (Si O2) or any processes in the manufacture of silica bricks or other articles containing not less than 80 per cent. total silica (Si O2) are carried on.
