UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920-1928.

DECISION OF THE HIGH COURT ON AN APPEAL UNDER SECTION 10 (1) PROVISIO (i) OF THE 1920 ACT.

Contributions Payable.

On the 13th January, 1930, Mr. Justice Roche gave judgment in the High Court on an appeal brought by the Southern Railway Company Limited, against the Minister's decision, given under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, of the question whether a person employed in the following circumstances was or was not an employed person within the meaning of the Acts.

Caretaker or housekeeper employed by the Company at premises which included offices let by the Company, the person's duties being to clean the staircases, corridors and front hall, and to render certain services to the tenants of the offices, payment for these services being made by the tenants and not by the Company.

Mr. Justice Roche held that the employment of the person in question was not excepted either under paragraph (b) of Part II of the First Schedule to the Act of 1920, or under the provisions of Part VII of the First Schedule to the Unemployment Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Special Order, 1925, and that he was an employed person within the meaning of the above Acts. Contributions were, therefore, payable in respect of the employment in question.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST JANUARY, 1930.)

BATTLE MARKET (SWINE FEVER) ORDER OF 1930.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Sales of Swine at Battle Market restricted to fat Swine only.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 8 of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) no authority shall be granted by the Local Authority for the holding of any sale of swine in the premises known as Battle Market, in the administrative county of East Sussex, other than a sale of fat swine intended for immediate slaughter.

(2) Any authority granted by the Local Authority for the holding of sales of swine in the said Market and in force at the commencement of this Order shall, in so far as such authority relates to sales of swine other than fat swine intended for immediate slaughter, cease to operate.

Movement of Swine from Battle Market to bacon factory or slaughterhouse only.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 9 of the principal Order no swine shall be moved from the said Market to any premises other than a bacon factory or slaughterhouse and then only if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement in the form C set forth in the Second Schedule to the principal Order or to the like effect. The swine shall before the movement commences be marked in

the manner described in Article 11 of the principal Order.

Special Cleansing and Disinfection of Battle Market.

3. Before the first sale of swine authorised by the Local Authority under Article 8 of the principal Order as modified by this Order is held in Battle Market the said Market shall be cleansed and disinfected in the manner described in Article 3 of the Markets, Sales and Lairs Order of 1925, as amended by the Markets, Sales and Lairs (Amendment) Order of 1926. Such cleansing and disinfection shall be carried out by and at the expense of the occupier of the market premises and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority and shall be additional to any cleansing and disinfection of the said Market carried out in accordance with the provisions of the said Orders of 1925 and 1926 before the date of this Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

4. This Order shall take immediate effect and may be cited as the BATTLE MARKET (SWINE FEVER) ORDER OF 1930.

Provision for Movement of Swine out of Scheduled Area to Show and Sale at Edinburgh.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in Chapter I of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) as amended by any subsequent Order, and subject to the provisions of Chapter III of the principal Order and of this Order, swine may be moved from premises (other than a market, fairground or saleyard), in the area referred to in the principal Order as the Scheduled Area to the Show and Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto, provided that they are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Such licence may be granted without the production of a declaration (Form B).

Restriction on Movement of Swine from Show and Sale at Edinburgh.

2.—(1) Swine shall not be moved from the Show and Sale mentioned in the Schedule

hereto, whether moved thereto from premises in the said Scheduled Area or not, except with a licence (Form A) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Edinburgh.

(2) Swine moved with such licence (Form A) shall not, for a period of 27 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if the swine are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in Article 11 of the principal Order, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Swine while detained during the said period of 27 days shall be kept separate from all other swine. This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcass of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the said period of 27 days.

Forms.

3. The licences (Forms A and C) required for use under this Order shall be in the forms set forth in the Second Schedule to the principal Order, with the necessary adaptations.

Construction.

4. This Order shall be read with the principal Order.

Whereas Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, empowers the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Minister of Health, from time to time to alter Registration Sub-districts by the alteration of the boundaries of Sub-districts, by the formation of new Sub-districts, or by the union of Sub-districts:

And whereas the Holborn Union comprises the Registration Districts of St. Giles and Holborn and it is desirable that the boundaries of certain Sub-districts of those Registration Districts should be altered for the purpose of making the Registration Districts in which those Sub-districts are comprised coextensive with the Metropolitan Boroughs of Holborn and Finsbury:

1. This Order may be cited as the Holborn and St. Giles Registration of Births, etc. (Alteration of Sub-districts) Order, 1930, and shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1930.

2. That part of Holborn and Clerkenwell Sub-district of Holborn Registration District now in Holborn Metropolitan Borough shall form a Sub-district to be called the St. Andrew and St. George the Martyr Sub-district, and shall form part of the St. Giles Registration District.

3. The St. Giles and Holborn Registration Districts altered in consequence of this Order shall be renamed the Holborn and Finsbury Registration Districts respectively.

4. The Superintendent Registrars of the existing St. Giles and Holborn Registration Districts shall be, respectively, the Superintendent Registrars of those Registration Districts as altered and renamed by this Order.

5. The Holborn and Clerkenwell Sub-district as altered by this Order shall be renamed the Clerkenwell Sub-district.

6. The Registrar of the Holborn and Clerkenwell Sub-district of the existing Holborn Registration District shall be the Registrar of the St. Andrew and St. George the Martyr Sub-district as constituted by this Order..
