At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 20th day of *January*, 1930.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by an Order in Council bearing date the first day of November, 1928, and known as the West African Court of Appeal Order in Council 1928, as amended by a further Order in Council bearing even date with this Order, provision has been made for the establishment of a Court called the West African Court of Appeal for the hearing and determining of appeals from the Colonies of the Gold Coast, Sierra Leone, and the Gambia, the Protectorates of Sierra Leone and the Gambia, the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, and the British Sphere of Togoland:

And whereas, it is expedient that further provision should be made for regulating appeals from the West African Court of Appeal to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf in His Majesty vested, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the West African (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council, 1930."

(2) On the commencement of this Order, the Order in Council bearing date the second day of March 1909 (regulating appeals from the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast Colony to

His Majesty in Council), and the Orders in Council bearing date respectively the fifteenth day of February 1909, and the sixteenth day of December 1912 (regulating appeals from the Supreme Court of the Colony of Sierra Leone or the Circuit Court of the Protectorate of Sierra Leone to His Majesty in Council) shall be and the same are hereby revoked and repealed without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder or to the continuation and conclusion thereunder of any appeal to His Majesty in Council pending at the commencement of this Order.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council;

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;

"Judgment" includes decree, order, sentence, or decision;

"Court" means either the full Court or one or more Judges of the West African Court of Appeal, according as the matter is one which under the hereinbefore recited Orders in Council or under the Rules and Practice of the said Court, or under Article 7 of this Order, properly appertains to a full Court or to one or more Judges.

"Said Territories" means the Colonies and other Territories in West Africa mentioned in the preamble to this Order.

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the plead-

ings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal.

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper Officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from.

"Month" means calendar month.

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order, an Appeal shall lie—

(a) As of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of £500 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the said value or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

4. Where in any action or other proceeding no final judgment can be duly given in consequence of a difference of opinion between the Judges, the final judgment may be entered *pro forma* on the application of any party to such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Senior Member of the Court or in his absence of the Member of the Court next in seniority, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an appeal therefrom and not for any other purpose.

5. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the Applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

6. Leave to appeal under Article 3 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance—

(a) Upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500 for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the Record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

7. A single Judge of the Court shall have power and jurisdiction to hear and determine any application to the Court for leave to

appeal under Article 3 (a), and generally in respect of any appeal pending before His Majesty in Council to make such other Order and to give such other directions as he shall consider the interests of justice or the circumstances of the case to require, provided always that any Order or directions so made or so given by a single Judge as aforesaid may be varied, discharged or reversed by the Court.

8. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just, and in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

9. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

10. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject matter of the Appeal and, generally, to reduce the bulk of the record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

11. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether in any of the said Territories, or in England) shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

12. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in any of the said Territories or in England.

13. Where the Record is printed in any of the said Territories the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal of the Court.

14. Where the Record is to be printed in England the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be trans-

mitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the appeal.

15. Where part of the Record is printed in any of the said Territories and part is to be printed in England, Articles 13 and 14 shall, as far as possible, apply to such parts as are printed in the said Territory and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

16. The reasons given by the Judge, or any of the Judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such Judge or Judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall be included in the Record.

17. The Registrar shall, with all convenient speed, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council a certificate to the effect that the Respondent has received due notice of the admission of the Appeal and of the transmission of the Record to England.

18. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single order.

19. An Appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

20. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such an order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

21. On an application for final leave to appeal, the Court may enquire whether notice or sufficient notice of the application has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned and, if not satisfied as to the notices given, may defer the granting of the final leave to appeal, or may give such other directions in the matter as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

22. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

23. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the dispatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such

certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

24. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the dispatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court sees fit to grant such a certificate the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

25. Where at any time between order granting final leave to appeal and the dispatch of the Record to England, the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal, on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died, or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

26. Where the Record subsequently to its dispatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death or change of status of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted, or entered on the Record, in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

27. The case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in any of the said Territories or in England and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or by the party himself if he conducts his appeal in person.

28. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of Appeal. Reference by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the Case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal shall, either of his own motion, or at the in-

stance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

29. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in any of the said Territories such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

30. The Court shall conform with, and execute, any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any original judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

31. Nothing in this Order contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty upon the humble Petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

32. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification in the London Gazette by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

I.—Records and Cases in Appeals to His Majesty in Council shall be printed in the form known as Demy Quarto.

II.—The size of the paper used shall be such that the sheet, when folded and trimmed, will be 11 inches in height and $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches in width.

III.—The type to be used in the text shall be Pica type, but Long Primer shall be used in printing accounts, tabular matter and notes.

IV.—The number of lines in each page of Pica type shall be 47 or thereabouts, and every tenth line shall be numbered in the margin.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st February, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th February, 1930, to Saturday, the 1st March, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and

the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

LAW AMENDING THE LAW (OF FEBRUARY 20TH, 1929) REGULATING THE COMMISSION TO ADJUST THE PUBLIC INTERNAL DEBT WHICH WAS PUBLISHED IN THE MEXICAN OFFICIAL GAZETTE OF THE 22ND MAY, 1929, AND A TRANSLATION OF WHICH WAS PUBLISHED IN THE LONDON GAZETTE OF OCTOBER 29TH, 1929.

Translation.

EMILIO PORTES GIL, Provisional President of the United Mexican States, to its inhabitants be it known:

That the Honourable Congress of the Union has considered fit to decree the following:

The Congress of the United Mexican States decrees:

ARTICLE 1.—The whole of Article 19 of the Law of February 20th, 1929, regulating the Commission to Adjust the Public Internal Debt is repealed.

ARTICLE 6.—Section XII of Article 2 of the Regulating Law of February 20th, 1929, shall be amended by the addition of the following sentence:—

"Credits for the liquidation of which a basis or method of procedure has been fixed will not be considered as established or classified."

ARTICLE 7.—Article 20 of the Regulating Law of February 20th, 1929, is amended in the following sense:

"With regard to credits not included in the exceptions referred to in Section I to XI inclusive of Article 2 of this Law, which the interested party may consider included in Section XII, that is to say, those credits which he may consider classified, application may be made in writing to the Adjusting Commission of the Public Internal Debt for a declaration that these

"credits are of this nature; if, as a result of the examination which the Commission may make, this credit is not found to be classified, the Commission shall proceed to adjudicate upon it in conformity with the rules established in this Law without the applicant being required to take further action, the above-mentioned application in writing being considered as complying with Articles 7 and 8, always provided that the said application is presented to the above-mentioned Commission on or before February 28th, 1930. If the interested party does not in due time make application for the declaration referred to in this article, the resulting decision as to the classification of the credit, its prescription or date of falling due will be his own responsibility."

ARTICLE 8.—The credits designated as within the competence of the Adjusting Commission of the Public Internal Debt in accordance with the Regulating Law of February 20th, 1929, the Decree of November 21st, 1929, and the amendment introduced by the present law, which may not be brought before the said Commission or before the competent tribunals by February 28th, 1930, inclusive, shall be considered as irrevocably barred ("prescritos").

TRANSITORY.

All provisions in opposition to this law are repealed.

I therefore order that this shall be printed, published, circulated and put into effect as required.

The KING has been pleased to nominate to the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Winchester the Reverend Cyril Mee Turnell, M.A., to be licensed to the Perpetual Curacy of Gorey or Gouray, in the Island of Jersey, void by the death of the Reverend Ernest Spencer Collins, M.A., the last Incumbent.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to John William Hesry Shepherd in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

John Shepherd together with Hugh Black were detailed to clean a steam boiler at Palmers Shipbuilding and Iron Company Limited, Jarrow. On October 16th, 1929, Black entered the boiler and Shepherd was

about to follow when he detected traces of gas. In reply to a call, he received only a faint reply from Black, and immediately climbed inside to go to his help. He found Black half conscious some twenty-five feet from the boiler manhole. He endeavoured to drag him to the opening but had to abandon the attempt as he was succumbing to the action of the gas. He made his way out of the boiler, called for help and, though still seriously affected by the gas, returned with a rope which he tried to fasten round his comrade who was then unconscious. He collapsed, however, before being able to do so.

Further assistance was procured. Compressed air was used to clear the gas out of the boiler, and eventually a rescue party wearing respirators succeeded in extricating both Black and Shepherd. Black unfortunately died a few hours later.

Twice during the course of the rescue operations Shepherd put his life in grave danger in a brave attempt to save the life of his fellow workman.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Albert Tyler in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 19th October, 1929, William Tyler and his two sons, Ernest and Albert, were engaged in cleaning and enlarging the cess pit of a factory at Burnham Green near Welwyn. Ernest Tyler, who had been lowered to the bottom of the pit by means of a bucket attached to a rope, became affected by gas and at his own request was being drawn up to the surface, but he fell out of the bucket when about 22 feet from the top of the pit. William Tyler at once descended to the rescue of his son but collapsed and became unconscious on reaching the bottom of the pit. In spite of the collapse of his father and brother which

he had witnessed, Albert Tyler attempted to descend the pit and to rescue his relatives. He was driven back by the gas four times but at the fifth attempt he succeeded in reaching his father and brother and in passing a rope around them. They were hauled to the surface but artificial respiration and the administration of oxygen failed to revive them.

Albert Tyler undoubtedly displayed great courage and determination in his attempts to save his father and brother. The rescue operations lasted over a period of about 40 minutes and every time he entered the pit he must have been fully aware that he was endangering his own life.
