# WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 12th February, 1930, he made an Order under Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, for securing the welfare of the workers employed in all factories and workshops in which the manufacture of Portland Cement or cement of a similar character is carried on.

The Order, which may be cited as the Cement Works Welfare Order, 1930, will come into force on the 1st April, 1930.

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:-

#### APPOINTMENTS.

AT SOUTHAMPTON ROW, W.C.

Three Hackney Carriages.

In the centre of roadway, commencing at a point ten yards North of Refuge at the junction with Theobalds Road and extending Northward as far as necessary for three carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

29th January, 1930.

AT SOUTHAMPTON ROW (BLOOMSBURY PLACE). W.C.

Three Hackney Carriages.

In the centre of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of Nos. 80/82, Southampton Row and extending Southward as far as necessary for three carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
