CONVOCATION OF CANTERBURY.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

WE, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops, and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury, in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

The opportunity of presenting an Address to Your Majesty afforded by the Opening of a new Convocation is to us a precious privilege. It reminds us and others of the peculiar place and responsibility which still happily belong to the Church of England in the common life of this Realm. It reminds us no less of Your Majesty's constant care for that Church's well-being and for its faithfulness to its proper tasks.

His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh directed in 1906 that Letters of Business be issued authorising us to debate, consider, consult and agree upon various matters, and among them the desirability, form and contents of any modifications of the existing law relating to the conduct of Divine Service. In April, 1920, the Convocation of Canterbury made answer that they had accordingly agreed upon certain recommendations contained in certain Schedules humbly submitted to Your Majesty, but that they were of opinion that

the changes which they recommended should not at that time be introduced into the text of the existing Book of Common Prayer, but be embodied in another volume to be sanctioned by Authority for optional use for such period as might thereafter be determined. In accordance with this Resolution, action was taken in the National Assembly of the Church of England later in 1920, and with the consent of the Convocations two successive Prayer Book Measures were subsequently introduced and passed through all their stages in that Assembly. But neither of these Measures was approved by the House of Commons, and neither was in consequence submitted for Your Majesty's Royal Assent.

It is a disappointment to us that we are thus unable to report to Your Majesty the issue to our labours in the Revision of the Forms and Ordering of our Public Worship, which the Church Assembly with the consent of the Convocations desired. But, as far as in us lies, we shall strive to find a way through our present difficulties without bitterness and without impatience.

During the last few years and by the co-operation of the Church Assembly and Parliament Your Majesty's Royal Assent has been given to many notable Measures designed to improve the conditions under which the clergy live and work, to provide for their support in old age and to insure that, as far as possible, the flock of Christ shall not suffer through the conduct of those who are called to attend it.

At a time of grave intellectual and moral confusion, it is our hope and prayer that in these coming years Almighty God will give to His Church such a renewal of its faith and to every member of it such a heightened sense of his vocation as may strengthen the hold of our holy religion upon the hearts and lives of the people.

The cause of Christian Unity, to which Your Majesty has referred as being a vital question, and as being a matter in relation to which Your Majesty cherishes Your own fervent hope, makes slow but steady advance. The great Conferences held at Lausanne and at Jerusalem initiated fresh efforts and endeavours. And we may remind Your Majesty of the approach of another Lambeth Conference next year, when we expect that some 300 Bishops from all parts of Your Majesty's Dominions as well as from other regions of the world will meet to consider not only questions affecting our own Communion, but also this vital subject of the Reunion of the various Christian Societies within the visible Church of Christ.

We rejoice that Your Majesty's Government concluded negotiations for participation in the multilateral Treaty for the Renunciation of War as an instrument of national policy in the form proposed by the Government of the United States, and we follow with eager and anxious interest all the efforts which continue to be made both through the League of Nations, and otherwise, to increase security and establish peace among the nations of the world. To the furtherance of this great cause we are pledged by our faith in Christ and by loyalty to what we believe to be the Will of God.

We wish that we could congratulate Your Majesty on a great diminution of Unemployment in this country, on a general revival of our Industries, and on the removal from our midst of the reproach of bad or inadequate housing. But in all these matters there has been substantial improvement since we last addressed Your Majesty, and we would again assure Your Majesty of our desire to support and encourage in every way that we can any wise measures which Your Majesty's Government may devise to reduce still further these evils which we all deplore.

Finally, we cannot but recall the anxiety and constant prayers with which Christian people throughout the land follow the course of Your Majesty's severe and prolonged illness, and the joy with which they hailed Your Majesty's recovery and joined with Your Majesty in heartfelt thanks to Almighty God.

We would conclude, as always, with the humble prayer that the Divine Blessing, through our Lord Jesus Christ, may continue to rest upon Your Majesty, upon our gracious Queen, and upon every member of the Royal House.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

It is a sincere pleasure to Me to receive your loyal and dutiful Address. Your reference to

My illness has deeply touched Me and I thank you for your prayers that blessings may be bestowed upon Myself, the Queen and My House.

I welcome with you the opportunity afforded of reflecting on the position of the Church of England in the corporate life of My Kingdom. Without a deep and abiding sense of spiritual and moral values, the life of a community, as of an individual, is incomplete. It is well to call to mind the responsibility of the Church for promoting this sense.

I rejoice to observe the spirit which animates your reference to the difficulties associated with the Revision of the Forms and Ordering of Public Worship. May the continued exercise of forbearance and patience render it possible, under God's guidance, to find a solution of this grave and perplexing problem.

The Church Assembly may look back not without satisfaction on the work which has in the last few years been done for promoting the material interests of the clergy during their active service and in retirement, and for securing in the interests of the people the efficient and diligent performance by the clergy of their duties and ministrations.

I fervently join in your prayer to Almighty God for an increase of the influence of religion by the renewal of faith and the strengthening of the spiritual consciousness of the members of the Church.

The progress which is being made with the promotion of Christian Unity is very gratifying and I trust that the Lambeth Conference next year will contribute to a further advance.

The continuous development of measures for securing international peace has given Me profound satisfaction and there is every reason for confidence that the agreements which have been made rest on a sure foundation in the hearts and minds of the peoples. By devoting its energies to the strengthening of this spiritual basis the Churches of the world can give incalculable assistance to the Governments in making still further progress.

The problems connected with Unemployment and the other domestic evils to which you allude are, as you are aware, of the gravest concern to Me. They are engaging the unremitting attention of My Ministers who will be strengthened in their task by your assurance of support and encouragement.

I pray that the Blessing of Almighty God may rest upon you and your labours.

CONVOCATION OF YORK.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

May it please Your Majesty.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops, and Clergy of the Province of York in Convocation assembled approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's throne and person.

We rejoice that the election of a new Parliament and Convocation should give us this early opportunity of addressing Your Majesty so soon after Your Majesty's restoration to health, for which we offer heartfelt thanks to Almighty God. We cannot doubt that the expressions of affectionate loyalty which have been called forth from all parts of the Empire by Your

Majesty's grave illness and happy recovery demonstrate a growing consciousness of the unity of all Your Majesty's dominions, of which the throne is the centre and the bond.

In a time when the nations of the world are striving as never before to find a secure basis for abiding peace, we welcome alike the Pact of Paris as an expression of international aspiration, and the assurance that Your Majesty's Government will earnestly consider the question of signing on behalf of the British Empire the "Optional Clause" of the Statute of the Permanent Court of International Justice. While we leave to others the technical questions involved we wish earnestly to support the principles therein embodied.

When this Convocation last had the honour of addressing Your Majesty, in February, 1925, we had occasion to deplore the unemployment and high cost of living which were then inflicting severe hardships on great multitudes of Your Majesty's people, especially those living in the great industrial areas of our Province. Throughout the four and a half years these evils have persisted, but we rejoice to think that there has lately been evidence of real improvement. We are convinced that only by the co-operation of all classes in the spirit of Christian fellowship can prosperity be recovered or maintained.

In the sphere of our special responsibility and in response to the Letters of Business issued to the Convocations by the Crown, we have given our best endeavour to bring the Law of Public Worship into accord with needs and aspirations of our time; Our proposals failed to secure the assent of the House of Commons, and we are therefore compelled to carry on the work of the Church without the aid which we hoped by this time to have obtained. We wish to assure Your Majesty that we shall continue to do our utmost to promote the peace and welfare of the Church to the Glory of God and for the salvation of Man.

And we shall ever pray that the blessing of Almighty God may rest abundantly on Your Majesty's person, home and realm.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I am grateful for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the blessings which you invoke upon Myself, My Home and My Realm.

I thank you sincerely for your reference to My illness and recovery. Nothing has moved Me more than the evidences of affection for Myself and devotion to My Throne which My illness evoked in every part of My Empire. I join with you in renewing My humble thanks to Almighty God for the mercy which He has shown to Me.

It gives Me great pleasure to observe that the furtherance of international peace is in the forefront of your thoughts. My Ministers will lose no opportunity of lending their support to any proposals which are well calculated to save the nations from the horrors of war, and they are now considering the Optional

Clause to which you refer in collaboration with the Governments of My Dominions with a view to early action. There is perhaps no sphere in which the co-operation of State and Church can be more fruitful, for the labours of statesmen can avail little if the Treaties and Pacts which they devise do not rest on a spiritual foundation.

The spirit which makes for peace among the nations can also be of assistance in solving the problems created by the unemployment which is unhappily continuing in so many of our industries. My Government is energetically devoting itself to these very difficult problems and all will join in the earnest hope that its efforts may have a successful issue.

I regret that it has not yet been possible to find an acceptable solution of the problem of revising the Law of Public Worship. I welcome your assurance of continued endeavour for the promotion of the peace and welfare of the Church and I pray that the blessing of Almighty God may rest on you in this and all your labours.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 28th February, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd March, 1930, to Saturday, the 8th March, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made

to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

NOTICE BY THE ARBITRATOR APPOINTED UNDER CLAUSE 4 OF THE ANNEX TO SECTION IV OF PART X OF THE TREATY OF TRIANON.

I, HELGE KLAESTAD, the duly appointed Arbitrator under Clause 4, of the Annex to Section IV, of Part X of the Treaty of Trianon to assess the amount of claims by British nationals growing out of acts committed by the former Austro-Hungarian Government or by any Hungarian Authorities since July 28th, 1914, and before 12th August, 1914, hereby prescribe that all such claims must be lodged with me at 2, Cavendish Square, London, W. 1, before the expiration of the following periods:—

1. In the case of claimants resident in Great Britain, Northern Ireland or Irish Free State—Two months from the date of publication of this notice.

2. In the case of claimants resident in Australia, South Africa and New Zealand—Five months from the date of publication of this notice.

3. In the case of claimants resident in India—Eight months from the date of publication of this notice.

4. In the case of claimants resident in any British colony or protectorate—Six months from the date of publication of this notice.

5. In the case of claimants resident in Egypt, Newfoundland or in any foreign country—Two months from the date of publication of this notice enlarged by the time normally occupied in postal transit between Egypt, Newfoundland or foreign country concerned and London.

After the expiration of the periods prescribed by this Notice I shall not accept any claim for consideration unless the claimant has, prior to the date of publication of this Notice, notified

the claim to a British Authority and I am satisfied that the failure to lodge the claim within the prescribed period arose from circumstances for which the claimant cannot justly be held responsible.

The publication of this notice shall be effected by the British Authorities in such manner as they may decide. The date and manner of publication may vary for different countries and the periods stated above shall begin to run for such claimant from the date of publication applicable to the country in which he shall be resident at the date of such publication.
