The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been framed in pursuance of Section 73 of the

Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF SECOND CLASS CLERKS FOR SERVICE UNDER THE SUPREME COURT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

- 1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 22 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. The upper age limit may, however, be extended to 30 in the case of candidates who possess professional legal qualifications or have had actual experience of legal business, and may further be extended to 50 in the case of candidates who were employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and are still so employed at the date of the vacancy.
- 2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—
 - (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
 - (b) In the case of a natural-born British subject who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.
 - (c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 4. The Lord Chief Justice will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.
- 5. Applications shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that Office, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps of the value of two shillings and sixpence; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances. The Lord Chief Justice will examine the candidates' credentials and will submit to the Civil Service Commissioners the names of such candidates as appear to be qualified and to be best fitted for appointment. The Civil Service Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the namber or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.
- Candidates who are recommended by the Lord Chief Justice and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board sitting in Northern Ireland, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications; the decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Lord Chief Justice, who will be represented on the Selection Board in the proportion of one in three or two in five; they will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct know-ledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

Until further notice, preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

7. Candidates recommended for appointment by the Selection Board may be required before appointment to pass a qualifying examination in (1) English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge, (2) Law; but the Civil Service Commissioners may at their discretion exempt from examination under (1) any candidate who possesses the School Leaving Certificate of the Ministry of Education of Northern Ireland or has passed any other examination which in their opinion is of equivalent or higher standard; and they may exempt from examination under (2) any candidate who possesses legal qualifications which in their opinion justify such exemption, and they may exempt entirely from a qualifying examination any candidate who has been employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and is still so employed at the date of the vacancy,

- if so recommended by the Lord Chief Justice.
- 8. In addition to the fee of two shillings and sixpence payable on application (Clause 5), each candidate admitted to the written examination (Clause 7) will be required to pay a fee of £4 2s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £4 5s. 0d. A candidate exempted from both parts of the written examination would be required to pay the balance of the prescribed fee before appointment.
- 9. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, or otherwise.

Bye-Laws for Regulating the Use of the TILBURY LANDING STAGE.

The Port of London Authority in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Port of London (Consolidation) Act, 1920, and of every other power them thereunto enabling, do make the following Bye-laws, that is to say:

Short Title and Commencement.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Port of London (Tilbury Landing Stage) Byelaws, 1930" and shall come into operation on the day after they are confirmed by the Minister of Transport.

Interpretation of Terms.

2. In the construction of these Bye-laws the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, namely:-

The "Port Authority" shall mean the

Port of London Authority.
The "Stage" shall mean that portion of the floating landing stage which is vested in the Port Authority and shall include the bridges connecting it with the shore, the Shelter Sheds, Waiting and Refreshment Rooms and Baggage Hall.
"Stage Master" shall include all officers

and servants of the Port Authority acting in

the execution of their duty at the Stage.
"Vehicles" shall include all kinds of carriages cars wagons lorries char-a-bancs carts trucks cycles and barrows whether propelled or drawn by horse mechanical or hand

power or any other means.
"Vessel" shall include any ship or boat or any other description of vessel used in

navigation.

"Master" when used in relation to any vessel shall mean any person whether the owner master or other person lawfully or wrongfully having or taking the command charge or management of the vessel for the time being.

Vessels using the Stage.

3. No vessel shall be brought alongside of or made fast to the Stage without the permission of the Port Authority specially obtained for that purpose.

Vessels not to be moored or anchored near Stage.

4. No vessel when not requiring or permitted to be alongside the Stage shall be moored or anchored in such a position as will allow any part of the vessel to come at any state of the tide within 250 yards of the Stage.

Vessels using the Stage.

- 5. The Master of a vessel whilst the vessel is lying alongside the Stage shall obey the following rules, namely:-
 - (a) He shall cause such lights to be exhibited by the vessel as are required under Bye-law 14 of the Port of London River Byelaws, 1914, for vessels at anchor or moored.

Purpose for which Stage may be used by vessels.

(b) He shall allow her to remain at the: Stage only for the purpose of landing and embarking passengers and their baggage and shall not allow her to so remain for any other purpose unless authorised in writing by the Stage Master to do so.

Vessels to have a competent crew.

(c) He shall have on board at least a sufficient number of competent persons to attend to her and shall keep the vessel in readiness to move or leave when required.

Vessels to have proper fenders and ropes.

(d) He shall cause the vessel to be furnished with proper fenders and ropes to the satisfaction of the Stage Master and shall keep them in constant use.

Gangway boards to be properly secured.

(e) He shall cause all gangway ports doors davits and boats to be properly secured.

Gangways etc. to be swept and cleansed.

(f) He shall cause the gangways and parts of the Stage used in connection with the vessel to be properly swept and cleansed to the satisfaction of the Stage Master.

Gangways.

(g) He shall cause her gangway doors to be kept free from obstruction and so arranged as to permit free passage to and from her deck and also when necessary across her deck to any vessel berthed outside of her. Whilst passengers or their baggage are being landed or embarked he shall cause a member of the crew of the vessel always to be in attendance at each end of each gangway who shall carefully attend to the security of the gangway and to the safety of the traffic passing over it. From one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise he shall cause each gangway to be efficiently lighted.

Not to swing.

(h) He shall not allow the vessel to swing round whilst made fast to any part of the Stage without the permission of the Stage Master.

Time for vessel to remain at Stage.

(i) He shall only allow the vessel to remain alongside the Stage for so long as the Stage Master permits.

No private gangways etc. to remain on Stage.

6. No person shall without the permission of the Port Authority cause gangways or other appliances for the use of a vessel to remain on the Stage except whilst they are in actual use.

Limitation of height and weight of vehicles.

7. No person shall bring upon the Stage a vehicle which with its load exceeds 12 feet in height from the ground or the weight of which exceeds an axle load of 7\s^2 tons.

User of Stage by Persons.

8. No person shall go upon or remain upon the Stage without the permission of the Port Authority or of persons who are authorised by the Port Authority to grant permission.

Barricades "No Road" Notices.

9. No person without authority shall get over under or through any barrier fence or chain or proceed where a "No Road" or similar notice is exhibited.

No touting etc. allowed.

- 10. No person shall without the permission of the Port Authority do on the Stage or on board any vessel lying alongside thereof any of the following things:—
 - (a) Beg.
 - (b) Tout for custom.
 - (c) Solicit passengers for any vessel omnibus or public vehicle.

Articles not to be sold without permission.

11. No person shall without the permission of the Port Authority offer or expose any article for sale on the Stage.

Prohibition of Public Meetings, singing, etc.

12. No person shall hold any meeting preach read aloud dance sing perform on any musical instrument lecture address any crowd or assembly of persons or distribute leaflets papers or advertisements on the Stage without the permission of the Port Authority.

Photographing etc.

13. No person shall erect a tripod or stand for supporting photographic or other apparatus on the Stage without the permission of the Port Authority.

No nuisance or spitting.

14. No person shall commit a nuisance or spit on the Stage.

Riding Bicycles prohibited.

15. No person shall ride a bicycle or motorbicycle on the Stage unless the bicycle or motor-bicycle is attached to a car.

Ropes not to be made fast to Rails or Stanchions.

16. No person shall cause moorings or ropes to be made fast to the stanchions or rails of the Stage or to any parts of the booms bridges or travelling gantries connected therewith.

Shelter Sheds.

17. No person shall loiter in the shelter sheds or make use of them in an improper manner.

Smoking not permitted.

18. No person shall smoke in the Baggage Hall or in any waiting room or shelter except in such portion thereof if any as may be permitted by the Port Authority from time to time.

Persons using Waiting or Refreshment Rooms.

- 19. When using the Baggage Hall or any Waiting Room or Shelter no person shall:—
 - (a) Cut deface damage or remove any part of the buildings or any table seat or chair.
 - (b) Place heavy baggage upon any table seat or chair.

No obstruction on the Landing Stage allowed.

20. A person shall obey the lawful orders of the Stage Master and shall not unnecessarily obstruct the use of the Stage.

Vehicles.

- 21. A person who shall bring a vehicle upon the Stage shall obey the following Rules:—
 - (a) H_e shall have legitimate business on the Stage.
 - (b) The vehicle according to its character and weight with or without load shall use such bridges as may from time to time be authorised to be so used by Regulations issued by the Port Authority.
 - (c) The vehicle shall not be moved at a faster rate than a walking pace.

Rules for Vehicles.

- 22. A person who shall bring a vehicle intended to be loaded or unloaded on the Stage shall obey the following Rules:—
 - (a) He shall cause the vehicle to be taken direct to the proper berthage and there loaded or unloaded as quickly as possible after its arrival.
 - (b) He shall remove the vehicle as soon as the loading or unloading shall have been finished.
 - (c) He shall not bring the vehicle on to the Stage unless a vessel is ready to receive it or its load or to discharge goods to be loaded into it.
 - (d) He shall not scotch the wheels of a vehicle except with proper wooden chocks which may be used without injury to the Stage.
 - (e) He shall not refuel any petrol driven vehicle.
 - (f) He shall cause the vehicle to exhibit the same lights as are required to be exhibited by a vehicle using a public highway.

Vehicles and Articles not to be left without persons in charge.

23. No person shall leave vehicles or articles of any kind on the Stage without some person remaining in actual charge thereof.

Regulations.

- 24. The Port Authority may make vary or rescind Regulations with regard to the use of the Stage by persons vehicles and vessels including the right to define or prescribe:—
 - (a) The character class and weight of vehicles permitted upon the Stage.

(b) The method of proceeding on to, off and along the Stage.

(c) The order or succession and manner of berthing of vessels.

(d) The time of remaining upon at and leaving the Stage, and

(e) The charges to be made for the use of gangways or other appliances belonging to the Port Authority.

Temporary Suspension of Bye-laws, etc.

25. During the time occupied by repairs or other works or on special occasions when it may appear to the Port Authority that the observance of the Bye-laws or of the Rules contained in the Bye-laws or any of them or of any Regulations made under the Bye-laws would cause inconvenience the Port Authority may as regards the whole or any part of the Stage temporarily suspend all or any of the Bye-laws Rules and Regulations and may substitute other temporary rules and regulations in lieu thereof; notice of such suspension and | (183) London, E.C. 3.

temporary Rules and Regulations being published by advertisement in the "Times" and "Lloyds List and Shipping Gazette" newspapers at least three days before the same shall take effect.

Penalty.

26. A person who shall offend against any of the foregoing Bye-laws numbered 3 to 25 or any Regulation made by the Port Authority thereunder shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.
