WHEREAS Western Samoa is a territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in Western Samoa:

And whereas His Majesty the King is satisfied that the Legislature of Western Samoa has made adequate provision for the recognition in Western Samoa of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should be extended to Western Samoa in accordance with the provisions of the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913:
