Chief Petty Officer Boys 4d. a week.
Petty Officer Boys ... 3d. a week.

"And whereas in the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service,

and in Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1927, such Boy Artificers are now designated Artificer Apprentices:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to increase the allowances payable to Artificer Apprentices selected to act as Chief Petty Officer Apprentices and Petty Officer Apprentices in Your Majesty's Mechanical Training Establishment at Chatham:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to increase the weekly allowances payable to Chief Petty Officer Apprentices and Petty Officer Apprentices in Your Majesty's Mechanical Training Establishment at Chatham to the following rates, viz. :—

Chief Petty Officer Apprentices 1s. a week.
Petty Officer Apprentices ... 6d. a week.

"The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 E. 7. c. 29; 4-5 G. 5. c. 18; 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, and 18 G. 5. c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Mexico has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Mexico the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Mexico or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 28th May, 1889 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX, Patents, &c. p. 9), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46-7 V. c. 57), as amended by the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885 (48-9 V. c. 63), should apply to Mexico, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Mexico confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, air-

craft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Mexico or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Mexico.

3. The Order in Council dated the 28th May, 1889, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Mexico) Order, 1930.

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following proviso shall be inserted at the end of paragraph 1 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"Provided that, where the aircraft has been previously registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Secretary of State is satisfied—

(a) that the certificate of registration last issued in respect of the aircraft lapsed by reason of the sale of the aircraft by the registered owner; and

(b) that the registered owner of the aircraft immediately before the sale was the constructor thereof or a dealer in aircraft; and

(c) that the aircraft has not been flown since a certificate of registration was last issued in respect thereof, except for the purpose of—

(i) an experiment or test carried out in the ordinary course of construction or

in order to obtain a certificate of airworthiness; or

(ii) a demonstration to a prospective purchaser; or

(iii) delivering the aircraft to a purchaser;

the fee chargeable for the issue of the certificate shall be five shillings."

2. The following paragraphs shall be substituted for paragraph 6 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"6. Subject to the provisions of this paragraph and paragraph 6a of this Schedule, the fees chargeable in respect of the grant of licences for personnel shall be in accordance with the following table—

Provided that—

(a) where an applicant for a licence of any description has previously been medically examined for a licence of any other description for which a similar standard of medical fitness is prescribed, the fee chargeable for official medical examination (if required) shall be 10s. 6d.;

(b) where an applicant for a pilot's licence in respect of flying machines under paragraph 4 of Schedule V to this Order

is qualified as a Royal Air Force Pilot and is granted exemption from flying test under paragraph 5 of that Schedule conditionally upon the satisfactory completion of a special flying test, the fee chargeable for official flying test shall be £1 1s. 0d.

6a. Subject to the provisions of the next following paragraph, the fees chargeable in respect of the renewal of licences for personnel shall be in accordance with the following table—

6a. Where an applicant for the grant or renewal of any licence referred to in paragraph 6 of this Schedule is not required to pass any particular part of the appropriate technical examination or official flying test by reason of his having passed that part on some previous application or for any other reason, the fee chargeable for the technical examination or official flying test, as the case may be, may be reduced by such amount as the Secretary of State may think proper in the circumstances of the case.

6c. The fee chargeable in respect of the issue or renewal of a licence for a competent

person under paragraph 11 of Schedule II to this Order shall be 5s. for technical examination and 5s. for the licence.

6d. The fee chargeable for the issue of a master pilot's certificate shall be 10s."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of February, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Bexwell and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Downham Market, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Ely, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bexwell and Downham Market duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ely and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Ely signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Downham Market is now full the Reverend Wilfrid Bertram Salisbury Dorman being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Bexwell is at present vacant:

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Bexwell and Downham Market now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Wilfrid Bertram Salisbury Dorman (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Bexwell and the said Benefice of Downham Market shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Downham with Bexwell' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Wilfrid Bertram Salisbury Dorman if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Downham Market shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the

United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge and other endowments of the said Benefice of Bexwell shall be charged with a sum of £250 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £250 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £250 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purposes of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expense of occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Downham Market shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That upon the union taking effect all the tithe rentcharges glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the two Benefices of Crimplesham with Stradsett and West Dereham with Wereham, both in the said Diocese of Ely, with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned that is to say (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £40 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Crimplesham with Stradsett and (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £60 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of West Dereham with Wereham; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Crimplesham with Stradsett and West Dereham with Wereham respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Benefices of Crimplesham with Stradsett and West Dereham with Wereham or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Crimplesham with Stradsett and West Dereham with Wereham and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant,

convey and annex to the said Benefices of Crimplesham with Stradsett and West Dereham with Wereham or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Ely for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in every case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ely has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Patrick Brompton and the Benefice of Hunton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward Arthur, Bishop of Ripon, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Patrick Brompton and Hunton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ripon and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Patrick Brompton and the Parishes of the Benefices of Hornby and Crakehall, situate in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Ripon signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Patrick Brompton and Hunton based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Patrick Brompton and Hunton are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend John Fotherley Dale Chapman under the authority of a Dispensation:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Patrick Brompton and Hunton now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edward Arthur, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent also of the said John Fotherley Dale Chapman (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Patrick Brompton and the said Benefice of Hunton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Patrick Brompton with Hunton.'

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Patrick Brompton shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Fotherley Dale Chapman if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Patrick Brompton and Hunton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in

respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Patrick Brompton and Hunton shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Patrick Brompton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at York (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hornby, with the consent of Major Sir Henry Bernard de la Poer Beresford-Peirse, Baronet, D.S.O., of Melcombe House, Oatlands Avenue, Weybridge, in the County of Surrey (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), being the Patron of the said Benefice of Crakehall, and with the consents of the Reverend Samuel Bywater Porritt, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hornby and of the Reverend Horace Fearn Booth, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Crakehall (which consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect (a) all those detached portions of the Parish of the said Benefice of Hornby situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Hunton and also all those lands situate within the same area and at present common to the Parishes of the said Benefices of Hornby and Patrick Brompton shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the United Benefice to the intent that the whole area of the said Civil Parish of Hunton shall form part of the Parish of the United Benefice and that the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall have the exclusive cure of souls therein, and (b) all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Patrick Brompton situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Arrathorne and also all those lands situate within the same area and at present common to the Parishes of the said Benefices of Patrick Brompton and Hornby shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Hornby to the intent that the whole area of the said Civil Parish of Arrathorne shall form part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Hornby and that the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hornby shall have the exclusive cure of souls therein, and (c) all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Crakehall (containing 'Patrick Brompton East' and 'East Brompton Farm') which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Patrick Brompton shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the United Benefice. Provided always that no transfer of any of the endowments of any of the Benefices affected by the transfers of territory herein-

before recommended and proposed shall be made by reason of such transfers of territory.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ripon has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"That there is in the County and our Diocese of Durham the Vicarage of St. Paul, Darlington, the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 11,840 people.

"That the net annual value of the Benefice of St. Paul, Darlington, is £382.

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in the Rev. Robert Ferry Drury, the Rev. Edwin Albert Douglas, the Rev. Canon Dawson Dawson-Walker, Miss Charlotte Tristram and Mr. William Saunders Douglas.

"That the Rev. Robert Anderson Jardine is the present Vicar thereof.

"That there is also in the County and our Diocese of Durham the Rectory of Haughton-le-Skerne, the Parish whereof is adjoining to the Parish of St. Paul, Darlington, aforesaid, and contains according to the last census a population of 2,704 people.

"That the net annual value of the Benefice of Haughton-le-Skerne is £1,285.

"That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Haughton-le-Skerne is vested in us the said Lord Bishop of Durham in right of our See.

"That the Rev. Canon Herbert Gouldsmith is the present Rector thereof.

"That there is also in the County and our Diocese of Durham the Vicarage of Aycliffe, the Parish whereof is adjoining to the Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne aforesaid and contains according to the last census a population of 1,245 people.

"That the net annual value of the Benefice of Aycliffe is £350.

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Aycliffe is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Durham.

"That the Rev. Canon Alexander Hamilton Patterson is the present Vicar thereof.

"That there is also in the County and our Diocese of Durham the Vicarage of Heighington, the Parish whereof is adjoining to the Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne aforesaid and contains according to the last census a population of 1,143 people.

"That the net annual value of the Benefice of Heighington is £449.

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Heighington is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Durham.

"That the Rev. William Jervis Hodgson McLean is the present Vicar thereof.

"That the Patrons and Incumbents are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed and the matters and things in the Scheme hereto annexed stated and proposed.

"That it appears to us, the said Lord Bishop, that the portion of the said Parish of St. Paul, Darlington, adjoining the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne which is shown on the plan annexed hereto and coloured red thereon with no population may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and the second and third years of the same Reign, Chapter 49, be separated from the said Parish of St. Paul, Darlington, and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne.

"That the portion of the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne lying to the west of the main line of the London & North Eastern Railway and coloured yellow on the said plan with no population may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of St. Paul, Darlington, which immediately adjoins.

"That the portion of the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne which is shown on the said plan and is coloured blue thereon and containing a population of 105 people or thereabouts may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Aycliffe which it immediately adjoins.

"That the portion of the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne which is shown on the said plan and is coloured green thereon and containing a population of 5 people or thereabouts may under the same provisions be separated from the said Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Heighington which it immediately adjoins.

"That the portion of the said Parish of Aycliffe which is shown on the said plan and is coloured purple thereon and containing a population of 5 people or thereabouts may under the same provisions be separated from the Parish of Aycliffe and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Heighington which it immediately adjoins.

"That it is proposed if this Scheme be carried into effect it shall not affect the present state of the Patronage of the said four Benefices of St. Paul, Darlington, Haughton-le-Skerne, Aycliffe and Heighington.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th Section of the said first mentioned Act of Parliament we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations may be made with justice to all parties interested and we the said Lord Bishop submit the same to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full inquiry you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council."

"That the Incumbents of St. Paul, Darlington and Haughton-le-Skerne shall cease to have Cure of Souls respectively in the said portions so separated respectively and the Incumbents of St. Paul, Darlington, Haughton-le-Skerne, Aycliffe and Heighington shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the portions so annexed respectively.

"That the inhabitants of the said portions so separated and annexed as aforesaid shall have the same rights as to Pews and the performance of all offices and Services of the Church at the respective Parish Churches of St. Paul, Darlington, Haughton-le-Skerne, Aycliffe and Heighington to which they are annexed as the other inhabitants of the Parishes of St. Paul, Darlington, Haughton-le-Skerne, Aycliffe and Heighington aforesaid respectively.

"That the surplice fees (if any) arising in the district transferred from the Parish of St. Paul, Darlington, to the Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne shall be paid to the Incumbent of Haughton-le-Skerne; that the surplice fees (if any) arising in the district transferred from the Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne to the Parish of St. Paul, Darlington, shall be paid to the Incumbent of St. Paul, Darlington; that the surplice fees arising in the district transferred from the Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne to the Parish of Aycliffe shall be paid to the Incumbent of Aycliffe and that the surplice fees arising in the district transferred from the Parish of Haughton-le-Skerne to the Parish of Heighington shall be paid to the Incumbent of Heighington.

"That a sum of £1,250 London Midland and Scottish Railway Company £4 per cent. Preference Stock being a portion of a larger sum of the same Stock at present standing in the name of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in the matter of the Benefice of Haughton-le-Skerne shall forthwith be transferred from the Living of Haughton-le-Skerne and shall henceforward stand in the name of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in the matter of the Benefice of Aycliffe.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of any of the said four Benefices affected by this Scheme.
